In 2011, 215 children in the shire attended preschool, 587 children attended a government primary school, 228 children attended a Catholic primary school and 40 children attending a non-government primary school.

Our Young People

In 2011 there were 716 people aged between 10 and 14 within the shire, 663 people aged between 15 and 19 and 422 aged between 20 and 24.

In 2011, 589 young people in the shire attended a government secondary school, 100 young people attended a Catholic secondary school, 33 young people attended another non-government secondary school.

Our Older People

In 2011 there were 2,660 people over the age of 65 within the shire, 1,425 people aged between 65 and 74, 928 aged between 75 and 84 and 307 aged 85 and over.

In 2011, 610 older people within the shire were volunteers, 363 between the age of 65 and 74, 177 between the age of 75 and 84 and 70 from the age 85 and over.

Arts & Culture

Our Arts & Culture

In 2011 there were 9,663 Corowa Shire residents had been born in Australia and 807 had been born overseas.

In 2011, 10,427 people spoke English and 182 spoke another language. Ancestry consisted of 4,691 Australian, 4,626 English, 1,536 Irish, 1,245 Scottish and 532 German. Religion consisted of 3,256 Catholic, 2,567 Anglican, 918 Presbyterian, 676 Uniting Church and 1,971 with no religious background within the shire.
