Federation Community Grants Program set to open



Round two of the Federation Council 2022/2023 Community Grants Program is set to open Monday 6 February 2023 with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor, Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share in \$30,000 of funding for this year's second round of Community Grants Program.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and, championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

Category 1 – Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.

Category 2 – Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.

Category 3 – Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for oneoff projects through one of the nine focus categories:

- Arts And Culture;
- Events & Tourism;
- Community Work and Welfare;
- Skill Development and Learning;
- Health Promotion:
- Accessibility and Inclusion;
- Young People;
- Senior Residence; and
- Children and Families.

"We have a great guide available to all residents and organisations, that can assist with ensuring your application and initiatives are eligible for funding available through our website," Mayor Bourke said.

"If you are an eligible group and you have a great idea that can benefit the wider community, submit your initiative through the Community Grants Program via our online form by Friday 17 March."

Council encourages all groups wishing to apply to check Council's corporate website for the guidelines to ensure Council can assist as many groups as possible bring new ideas to fruition for the region.

The Community Grants Program will continue to operate in two funding rounds each year, in October and February. Applications close Friday 17 March at 5pm. Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the April Ordinary Council meeting. Find out more on Council's website.

Commencement of Parking Patrols and Enforcement

Federation Council will soon commence actively conducting parking patrols to ensure that timed parking, loading zones and disability parking in our main shopping precincts of Corowa, Howlong and Mulwala are enforced.

To ensure everyone has time to adjust to parking enforcement, Council Rangers will be monitoring the above mentioned areas up until Friday 3 March, 2023 and issuing warnings only. From Saturday 4 March, 2023 any vehicle found to be parked disobeying parking signage will be issued with a parking fine.

Council to apply for share of \$500 million in road funding

The NSW Government has announced a \$500 million boost to help metropolitan and regional councils tackle the mammoth task of repairing the state's road network, following months of extreme weather events. Following the announcement, Federation Council confirmed its intent to apply for a share of \$500 million after months of joint Council advocacy work and lobbying efforts.

Premier Dominic Perrottet said the new Regional and Local Roads Repair program would provide even more support for councils to continue to carry out urgent repair work to ensure people stay connected and safe.

"We have listened to councils and we understand the pressure they are under from many months of wet weather. This funding boost will help councils continue the huge job of bringing roads back up to scratch to keep our state moving," Mr Perrottet said.

"We are making sure our roads are in the best nick possible so NSW families, truckies, farmers and tradies can travel around our state safely."

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said the funding announcement was very welcomed news.

"We have been under pressure for months to bring our road network up to a drivable state following the extensive flooding experienced across our Local Government Area last year," he said.

"Given the extent of the damage, funding streams such as this will assist Council in our ongoing recovery work. We have a long way to go, but are thankful for the NSW State Government support through listening to our joint Council advocacy work and responding to our urgent call for further funding in a timely manner."

Do you forget which bins to put out each week for kerbside waste collection?

No more guessing, download the 2023 kerbside bin collection calendar from our website or collect one from Council offices in Corowa, Howlong and Mulwala.

Some Helpful Tips:

Be mindful not to overload the bins – maximum weight is 80kg.

Place bin close to the kerb with the handle facing toward your property.

Place your bin out the night before your collection day or by 6am on the morning of collection.

Keep clear of overhanging branches and power lines.

Please leave at least one metre between bins and other objects, including fences and vehicles.
