

**Clean Up Australia Day** 



Clean up Australia Day is on Sunday 6 March 2022 and you are invited to step up to clean up your local area. Community groups, associations, businesses, schools and individuals are invited to participate by registering a Clean Up on cleanup.org.au. Clean Up Australia will provide you with a Clean Up Kit and other materials to run the day.

Clean Up Australia Day is held on the first Sunday of March every year and encourages people to clean up their local areas. Participants can host or attend clean ups organised by local community groups, which can be found on the Clean Up Australia website.

The annual Clean Up Australia Day was first started 20 years ago by founder and Chairman Ian Kiernan AO, who passed away on 16 October 2018. Australians have devoted 36 million hours to cleaning up the environment, through Clean Up Australia Day removing the equivalent of more than 380,000 ute loads of rubbish.

The Business Clean Up Australia Day staff engagement and team-building events are a great way for organisations to connect their teams through shared experiences. The next Business Clean Up Day is on Tuesday 1 March 2022 but you can run a Business Clean Up event any day of the year!

A School Clean Up Day is a great way to inspire your young people to learn about the impact of rubbish on their local environment while playing an active role in their community. Register your school and work together on School Clean Up Day on Friday 4 March - it can be the school grounds, a local park, or maybe bushland near your school - it's up to you.

# Federation Council 2021 Election Results Officially Declared

Councillors have been declared by the NSW Electoral Commission for the Federation Council Local Government Area following the Local Government elections held on the 4th December 2021. The final distribution of preferences and announcements occurred on Tuesday, 21 December at 10.30am at the returning office in Sanger Street Corowa.

Councillors in order of election are as follows: Patrick Bourke, Andrew Kennedy, Aaron Nicholls, David Longley, Shaun Whitechurch, Sally Hughes, Rowena Black, David Fahey and Gail Law.

Federation Council General Manager Adrian Butler said Councillors will be officially sworn in to their roles at the first Council meeting to be held on the 23rd December.

"A Mayor and Deputy Mayor election will also be conducted as required at the first meeting of Council to determine which Councillors will hold those positions," he said.

"I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the new Councillors and also thank Council staff who have worked to make the transition for the newly elected body as seamless as possible. We have a busy period of community engagement and planning work, leading to adopting a new budget and updated plans for July 1 2022 onwards".

- What are the things that your community needs over the next ten years?

It outlines the community's priorities and aspirations and how these will be achieved.

This plan assists in shaping the future of the Federation Council Local Government Area (LGA). It provides the direction for the provision of key projects and services which enable Council to meet the needs of the community and deliver good quality services and facilities.

It integrates asset, service and financial plans so that Council's resource capabilities are best matched to the community's needs and shows how Council is working towards achieving a better quality of life for all who live, work and visit in Federation Council. This is a dynamic strategy that is evaluated consistently and also comprehensively reviewed at the end of Council's term. This report will focus on the period 1 July 2018 to 30 June 2021.

# Council & community celebrate Australia Day

Residents, friends, family and visitors celebrated everything that's great about living in Australia at this year's Federation Council Australia Day celebrations. The sun shined down on the crowd that were joined by Australia Day Ambassadors Ralph and Kathy Kelly, Federation Council representatives and the Rotary Club of Corowa to participate in festivities at Bangerang Park in Corowa on January 26.

Ralph and Kathy Kelly, founders of the Thomas Kelly Foundation delivered an inspirational address speaking about their eldest son Thomas, who was 18 years old when he died in tragic circumstances in July 2012. in Sydney's Kings Cross. Determined not to let a similar fate happen twice, the Kelly family established the Thomas Kelly Youth Foundation implementing the 'Take Kare Safe Space' (Take Kare is after Thomas Kelly's initials) program in December 2014, with a vision of 'ensuring all of our youth come home safely'. Operating Friday and Saturday nights from 10pm - 4am with teams of volunteers across three key sites, assisting people who may be intoxicated, or drug affected, under age youth, people who are vulnerable or those subjected to physical and sexual assault, self-harm, violence and theft. The Foundation works closely with emergency services, the liquor industry and local communities in order to share the common vision of saving lives.

The Kelly's vision is to take kindness to every corner of Australia, something they are undoubtedly achieving.

In his welcome address, Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said on Australia Day we celebrate all the things we love about Australia; land, sense of fair go, lifestyle, democracy, the freedoms we enjoy, and particularly our people.

"Today we celebrate our people, the people of Federation Council who go above and beyond in their respective areas to ensure our communities thrive and grow. Our awards nominees here with us today are very special people, whose donation of time and effort warrants this type of special celebration. I am so proud of our community and those in it who continue to go above and beyond in their respective areas to ensure our

communities thrive and grow, especially in the midst of such challenging times."
