FEDERATION COUNCIL AND COROWA DISTRICT LANDCARE SIGN MOU

Federation Council and the Corowa District Landcare have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to formalise the current working relationship for on the ground local natural resource management and conservation initiatives in the region.

Federation Mayor, Councillor Patrick Bourke said, "Corowa District Landcare is a key partner of Federation Council and this relationship provides environmental opportunities for both organisations."

"Corowa District Landcare was previously a section 355 Committee supported under the former Corowa Shire Council for approximately 20 years. In 2016, there was a change in governance structure when they became an incorporated and appointed a Landcare Coordinator."

"Council has supported them through this transition and will continue to do so with the signing of the MOU. The MOU outlines the areas that Council and Corowa and District Landcare will work together on which includes a number of conservation, natural resource management and sustainable agriculture initiatives," he said.

The key priorities for the two organisations over the next 5 years include:

- Setting up seed production and collection sites.
- Community events and activities (such as National Tree Day, Aussie Backyard Bird Count, Threatened Species Day etc).
- Conservation works and revegetation at Council managed sites, roadsides, parks and reserves.
- Work to protect local threatened species such as Sloane's Froglet.
- Community awareness, education and workshops to encourage participation in local conservation and sustainable farming and agricultural practices.

The MOU includes a financial contribution of \$5,000 per year and commitment to partner and deliver local initiatives over the next five (5) years, 1 January 2020 until 31 December 2024

BALLDALE WATER SUPPLY COMMUNITY MEETING

Federation Council recently facilitated a community meeting in Balldale to discuss the future options that relate to improving the town's water supply. Around 30 community members were in attendance along with the Mayor, several Councillors, along with Council staff, to discuss possible improvements to the towns untreated bore supply scheme.

Over recent years, Council has received feedback from the Balldale community advising of concerns and dissatisfaction with the current water supply so the meeting was organised to discuss and present future water supply improvement options for Balldale, listen to community feedback and allow time for a general discussion with residents.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said, "It was great to see a good number of community members attend the meeting. We were able to talk about the current issues and look for potential solutions, and it was of course interesting to hear the mixed views as to the issues with the current supply, and of the possible improvements. Council had previously commissioned the NSW Department of Commerce Water Solutions Department to undertake a Feasibility Study for the provision of a treated water supply for Balldale. That report provided six options for consideration."

"Further investigation has occurred in relation to one of the options, which

recommended finding an alternative local source of groundwater other than the current bore, which meets all water quantity and quality requirements, disinfecting it with UV or chlorination, and then pumping it to Balldale. A test bore has been drilled which has shown promising results. Once further analysis of that is completed, a strategy will be developed based on what results are the most feasible and acceptable to the community. This will include implementation and budget considerations and of course looking for funding assistance from State and or Federal Governments."

"We look forward to continuing the open conversations with the Balldale community as the project progresses and providing regular updates," he said.

COUNCIL IMPLEMENTS NEW WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICE FOR CHRISTMAS & NEW YEAR PERIOD

Federation Council is pleased to advise it has taken extra steps to manage the influx of waste generated over the busy Christmas and New Year period.

The Oaklands and Urana Waste Facility opening hours will be changing effective Wednesday 18 December on a 3 month trial basis. The Oaklands facility will close on Tuesdays and Urana will close on Fridays with both facilities open on a Sunday as per normal operating hours.

Residents and visitors can dispose of waste at the skip bins available in Urana at the Victoria Park Recreation ground and at Oaklands on the corner of Thompson and Gunambil Street behind the Oaklands Recreation reserve. The skip bins will be available 24 hours a day.

Information signage will be placed at the Urana and Oaklands Waste Facilities advising of the facility trial changed operating hours and advise of the in town skip bin service.

The kerbside bin collection dates for all towns will be as usual over the Christmas and New Year period with residents reminded to place their bins out for early collection.

Federation Council General Manager Adrian Butler said, "For the enjoyment of all visitors and residents, Council is requesting that waste is disposed of firstly in your kerbside bin and where required at your nearest Waste Facility or in town skip bin service."

"The additional service of providing skip bins at some locations has been organised to manage overflow waste so it can be collected and disposed of away from spaces that are highly visible and used by our visitors and residents."

"We encourage residents to firstly take advantage of the local Waste Facilities and make arrangements where possible to take their own rubbish away," he said.

Council wishes to remind residents and visitors that litter and illegal dumping in parks is prohibited. Penalties apply under the Section 632 Local Government Act 1993.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

Council is preparing a new planning framework to guide the growth and development of Federation over the next 25 years. We want to create a clear, consistent planning framework that will guide the way land use is managed across the local government area.

To do this three key documents will be prepared:

- Federation Local Strategic Planning Statement (LSPS).
- Federation Local Environmental Plan.
- Federation Development Control Plan.

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST (EOI) FOR LAND REZONING

As part of a new planning framework, Council is seeking expressions of interest from property owners and developers seeking to undertake residential or commercial development on land where it is currently not allowed. This could be the development of existing rural land, or the upzoning of urban land for more intensive development.

Priorities for site development include those that will encourage new dwellings, economic development, job creation and contribute to the future sustainable growth of Federation.

All EOI requests must address the criteria helow:

Access and location: Good access to existing towns and settlements without the need for significant road upgrades. Preferably already adjoining existing

urban zoned land (residential or commercial). Fragmented or isolated development sites will generally not be considered.

Servicing: Demonstrate cost effective development servicing can be achieved (sewer, water, stormwater).

Affordability, community or economic benefit: Provide new homes particularly for low income earners or the elderly, or provide new jobs or bring new industries and tourism opportunities to the Federation Council area.

Avoiding land use conflict and natural hazards: Proposals should make sure that there are appropriate buffers to nearby industries, agriculture, sewerage treatment plants and waste facilities. Avoiding flood prone land and protecting existing environmental features such as waterways and biodiversity.

The EOI process will be managed by GHD as Council's consultants preparing the new planning framework. Should you like further information please contact the GHD project team or visit Council's website.

EMERGENCY SERVICES URGE FEDERATION COUNCIL TO GET READY FOR SUMMER

Federation Council is encouraging families, friends and neighbours to use the start of summer as the start of a conversation about being aware of and prepared for seasonal hazards.

Minister for Police and Emergency Services David Elliott recently joined with representatives of frontline emergency service organisations to highlight the multiple hazards communities across NSW face and encourage them to Get Ready for Summer.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said, "Aussie summers are iconic. They can also be tragic."

"Fire season started early this year and we've already witnessed its devastating impacts in areas across NSW, particularly in Northern NSW and along the Mid-North Coast."

"But bush fire isn't the only threat. Each year, communities across NSW experience bush fires, home fires, floods, storms, heatwaves, power outages and other emergencies."

"The start of summer should be the start of a conversation around being prepared for the multiple hazards communities across NSW face." "As the state braces for severe weather conditions throughout summer, it's important to remember our emergency service organisations do an incredible job keeping us safe, but they can only do so much."

"Being aware and prepared is everyone's responsibility, whether you're at home or away on holidays," he said.

Get Ready for summer now in five simple steps:

- Know your risk think about the area you're in and the types of disasters that could affect you;
- Plan now for what you will do sit down and talk with your family and plan for what you will do if a disaster affects your area;
- Get your home ready prepare your home by doing general home maintenance and checking your insurance coverage;
- Be aware find out how to prepare, what to do if there is a disaster in your area and connect with NSW emergency services to stay informed;
- Look out for each other share information with your family, friends, neighbours and those who may need assistance.
