In Council news, it has been another busy month, and one that started off with the appointment of Council's permanent General Manager – Adrian Butler. Council is looking forward to continuing to work with

Adrian and congratulates him on his appointment.

Coming up to the school holiday period, there's plenty to keep the kids entertained with Council hosting a number of fun activities for local children.

Council's library services will be offering two different art and craft activities at various locations, including Urana and Oaklands.

Each activity has four sessions planned throughout the school holidays and parents are being encouraged to register with the Corowa Library to secure their child's spot. Information about each session including time and venue is available from council's website.

The Corowa Visitor Information Centre is also coordinating the 'Federation Region Rocks' initiative to encourage families to explore the region during the school holidays.

Painting and finding rocks is a growing trend that has become a popular activity for children all over the world. A simple activity that promotes outdoor play and exploration, children are encouraged to re-hide the rocks they find for others to find.

Staff from the Visitor Information Centre have partnered with the Corowa Girl Guides to paint and hide the rocks for children to discover in public places such as playgrounds and parks throughout the region. Each rock has #federationregionrocks written on it and parents are encouraged to use the hashtag and post a photo of the rock on social media with the location of where the rock was found.

Council is set to adopt its first ever 2028 Community Strategic Plan and corresponding Delivery Program and Operational Plan at this month's Council meeting.

Council appoints Adrian Butler as Federation Council General Manager

Federation Council has appointed Adrian Butler to the position of General Manager on a 4-year contract, following an extensive recruitment process.

Mayor Pat Bourke announced that the recruitment process to appoint the Council's highest senior staff position has concluded, following the decision of Council to offer Adrian Butler the position of General Manager at an extraordinary meeting on Tuesday, and the acceptance of that offer by Mr Butler today.

"I am pleased to announce that after an extensive recruitment process, Council has made the decision to appoint Adrian Butler to the position of General Manager of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"With the assistance of the appointed recruitment agency, all Councillors assessed the applications and first-round interviews were held on May 22. Shortlisted candidates then made presentations to Council in interviews held on Tuesday afternoon. A preferred candidate was then endorsed following the interviews, at the Extraordinary Council meeting later on Tuesday afternoon. Council looks forward to working with Adrian to continue to progress Federation Council and its communities."

Mr Butler, the current Acting General Manager of Federation Council, said he felt honoured to be offered the permanent role.

"I consider it a great privilege to be entrusted with the position of General Manager of Federation Council," he said. "Council and staff are working together diligently with the community to deliver so many community projects and essential services. For me to be able to continue to work and lead the staff of this hardworking and dedicated entity is exciting. My short-term priority as General Manager will be to work closely with the Council and the community that I serve and lead the staff by providing direction and stability to enable them to deliver on the current work. My longer-term vision is to ensure the community continues to trust and respect the work of the Council, to work with many to deliver on commitments, and to continue to develop and implement strategies that ensure a strong, responsive and sustainable Council business. I believe this will be delivered professionally, efficiently and passionately."

Mr Butler, who is 43, resides in Urana with his wife Rebecca and four young children. They have lived in the area since early 2013, where Mr Butler held the position of General Manager at Urana Shire Council until the merger of the former Urana and Corowa Shires in May 2016. Mr Butler is originally from the Balranald area, and has an extensive career in Local Government spanning over 21 years.

He commenced his Local Government career as an outdoor staff member at Balranald Shire Council, in 1997, progressing through senior roles at Balranald, Bourke, Lachlan, Urana and Federation Councils over this time, including most recently at Wagga Wagga City Council, before his appointment in the Acting General Manager role at Federation in December 2017. Mr Butler has tertiary qualifications in Environmental Health, Building Surveying, Planning, and is currently completing a Master of Business Administration.

Local Government NSW Management Solutions coordinated an extensive merit-based recruitment process, including nation-wide advertising that resulted in a high number of applications for the senior staff position.

Lowered Lake Mulwala – a photographer’s paradise



Lake Mulwala has been lowered by about 4.5 metres to facilitate works around the lake foreshore and to control weed and should be refilled in early August.

The councils each side of the lake have joined forces to promote the wondrous natural spectacle now unfolding.

Moira Shire Mayor Libro Mustica said the lowering of the lake occurs every few years in an effort to control the invasive aquatic weed, *Egeria densa*.

“A lowered Lake Mulwala provides a unique spectacle,” Cr Mustica said. “The exposed tree stumps as well as the structure of the lake bed and the original route of the Murray River are revealed.

“There are endless opportunities for wonderful photographs and budding explorers will love walking along the Lake’s edge to see what the receding water reveals.

“And if you look very closely there is even the odd shipwreck or two.” Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke also encouraged explorers and photographers to visit the iconic lake to see its beauty in a different form.

“The lake has been lowered many times over the last ten years and each occasion draws a crowd of explorers and photographers from far and wide,” Cr Bourke said. “If you are looking for an adventure of a different kind, jump in the car and head to Lake Mulwala.

“Residents have told me that especially around sunset, the view is just magical, and one not to miss.”

Have your say on Riverina Murray Regional Sport Plan

Community members and sporting groups across the electorate are invited to have their say on key local strategies developed to improve the delivery and planning of grassroots local sport over the next five years.

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin said the plans will assist grass roots sport participation across the region by providing targeted sports program and facility development for all community members to enjoy.

"This is a great opportunity for locals to have a say, and I encourage everyone to view their plans and give feedback on what they would like to see prioritised," Mr Aplin said.

Deputy Premier and Minister for Regional NSW John Barilaro said the plans draw on concepts developed by the Australian Sports Commission.

"This is an important first step in the process of gathering community feedback to ensure that we invest in the right mix of sports facilities to meet the needs of unique communities," Mr Barilaro said.

"Nine Sport and Active Recreation plans have been developed with 30 - 40 strategies, inclusive of proposed initiatives specific to each of the regional areas.

"The plans will support participation across the state, through improving accessibility to sports facilities and ovals and supporting programs that foster community involvement.

"Plans have been developed for the Riverina Murray, the Central West and Orana, New England/North West, Far West, North Coast, Hunter, Central Coast, Illawarra Shoalhaven and South East and Tablelands."

Minister for Sport, Stuart Ayres said key proposals in the plans like the 'stay in your sport' coach education program will encourage promising your stars to continue with their chosen sport.

"We are also looking to attract more valued sporting events to regional NSW, plan female-friendly sporting facilities and establish hubs to support multi-purpose sports."

FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT GRANT FOR FEDERATION COUNCIL

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin today announced Federation Council has received \$210,000 for local floodplain management through the NSW Government's Floodplain Management grants program.

Mr Aplin said the grant under the 2018-19 Floodplain Management Program will help Council better understand the flood levels, risk and exposure. The program funds important projects that assess risk and help reduce flood impacts across NSW.

Urana, Boree Creek, Morundah and Rand were all impacted by floods in 2010 and 2012. This project will prepare risk management studies and plans for each community and identify possible flood management options within each town.

"The funding is a long-term investment to support Councils, and other government bodies who have the primary role of managing flood risk in their communities," Mr Aplin said.

"The grants assist with flood studies, flood risk management plans and the implementation of works to reduce flood risk.

"They can also support works such as flood levees, flood gates, warning systems and house raising and purchase in high risk areas.

Minister for the Environment Gabrielle Upton said the NSW Government Floodplain Management Program, administered by the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage had funded 51 projects totalling \$7.08 million.

"This grant to the Federation Council is one of a further nine grants totalling \$979,000. "The Floodplain Management grant program supports the implementation of the NSW Flood Prone Land Policy which aims to reduce the impacts of flooding and flood liability on communities," Minister Upton said.

NEW WORKSHOPS AND WEBCASTS ON OFFER FOR LOCAL TOURISM BUSINESSES


COMMONWEALTH GAMES MORNING

To recognise Mother's Day we dressed teddy bears in baby clothes. At the end of one morning we all had sore sides from laughing, but the teddies were dressed nicely.



The recent CWA of NSW State Conference was held at NEGS Armidale.

Oaklands branch presented three motions on the agenda which were all “carried” & now become Association Policy. All related to the inclusion of a medical “distress” criteria, the ability to access psychological care without a GP referral & the ability to claim on Medicare for the treatment.

Members thank the Amaranth Foundation, Corowa for the assistance in submitting these motions.

A priority on the Agenda was a motion of Urgency re: Drought Support in NSW. The CWA of NSW State President sent an immediate letter to the Hon. Niall Blair, MLC requesting improvements in the handling of natural disasters, noting that there seems to be no NSW government policy in place. She asked as an immediate measure the government reinstate freight subsidies, beyond those for donated fodder as a matter of urgency.

The State Conference will be held in Albury, May 2019. This is a great opportunity for locals to see just how CWA of NSW works.
