Welcome to the May edition of the Urana District Newsletter. Isn't it great to see the sensational start we have had to the growing season, with many saying it's the best start we have had to a season since the early 80's.

In addition to our widespread roads and related civil works happening right across the area, Council continues to deliver an unprecedented amount of community infrastructure projects across the Shire.

Construction works on our amazing new Swimming Pool facility in Corowa is going ahead at a cracking pace, as is the Ball Park Multi-Sports pavillion for Hockey and Cricket, right next door along with the major extension to the Corowa Skate Park now underway. It's also great to see the progress of the new Leisure Centre Building in Urana at the Aquatic Centre springing to life. This has been a long-held vision and a big nod of thanks goes to the generations involved in the Yuluma Cullivel Bus Committee, whose generous donation and vision for this centre, is now finally becoming a reality.

At Oaklands the works underway include the new change room facilities being built at the Recreation Ground, and the cemetery new fence and toilet block has also been completed. I understand the Oaklands Medical Centre has also been finalised and all that awaits is Dr Giri to finalise his processes to allow the centre to open soon. A big thank you to the Oaklands community and of course Dr Giri, Sushma his wife, and the staff, for their patience on this project.

Be sure when you are travelling around, as COVID-19 restrictions slowly relax to allow some regional travel, to take advantage of the many other areas within Federation Council that you may not be as familiar with. It's a great way of getting to know the area and spreading the word to your family and friends from away and further increasing our tourism. 
FEELING UNWELL?

The most common Coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms reported include:

- Fever;
- Breathing difficulties;
- Cough
- Sore throat; and
- Fatigue/tiredness

One way to help control the spread of the disease is to practice good hygiene habits:

- Always washing hands with soap and water before eating and after visiting the toilet (minimum 20 seconds)
- Covering your nose and mouth when coughing and sneezing, and disposing of used tissues immediately;
- Avoiding close contact with anyone with cold or flu-like symptoms; and
- Seeing a health care professional if you are unwell, and staying away from your workplace and other public places.



FIREWOOD COLLECTION PERMITS



Residents in the Federation Council area can apply to obtain a permit to collect firewood from road reserves for home heating during winter.

Firewood collection is limited to 1 April – 30 September each year.

To apply for a permit, residents must complete the application form and show proof that they reside in the Federation Council area (i.e. drivers licence). Applicants must certify on the application that they will abide by the permit conditions and acknowledge that Council is not liable for any injuries to person, or any loss or damage to property arising from the firewood collection activities.

Residents will need to apply for a permit each firewood season (each year).

The permit application fee is \$30.00.

BOREE CREEK FREIGHT LINK ROAD RECONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Federation Council has completed 3.1km of road re-construction on the Boree Creek Freight Link Road.

The culvert upgrade has commenced with the appointed contractors Naubro Kerb commencing work on site. The work includes replacing very narrow and old infrastructure that was lacking safety rails.

Work is expected to be completed before end of February 2021 which will deliver a 1200mm wider road surface along with full length safety barrier improving the road safety in the area for all motorists.



COVIDSAFE APP



The Australian Government has launched a new Coronavirus app, COVIDSafe.

The COVIDSafe app uses technology to automate and improve the current manual process of finding people who have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19.

This means you'll be contacted more quickly if you are at risk. It reduces the chances of you passing on the virus to your family, friends and other people in the community.


GRANT FINDER

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PET OWNERS

Over the past 6 months, Council has seen an increase of dog incidents in Howlong. From dog attacks to dogs uncontrolled and escaping owner properties.

Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Residents are reminded of the responsibilities of pet owners to ensure the safety of companion animals and the community.

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The expectations to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area. If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Just like all breeds dogs in NSW, greyhounds will be required to be on leash while in public at all times.
- A greyhound will still require a muzzle in an off-leash area if it has not undergone an approved retraining program. Greyhounds that have completed this program will continue to wear identifying green collars, or, alternatively the person in charge of the animal can carry a completion card.

- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.
- Any cats & dogs that are sold or given away from 1 July 1999, must be microchipped and lifetime registered. Existing cats and dogs must also be microchipped and lifetime registered. Farm working dogs and greyhounds are exempt.

BALL PARK CARAVAN PARK AND FORESHORE MASTERPLANS 2020 EXHIBITION

Have your say on the Ball Park Caravan Park and Foreshore Masterplans – a multifaceted masterplan project that has been undertaken to provide Council and the community with a framework that will guide opportunity, business planning and modeling in respect to the growth of our region and ensure together we can capitalize on our unique foreshore assets. In 2019, Integrated Site Design was engaged by Federation Council to produce a master plan for Ball Park Caravan Park that will deliver commercial, environmental and social outcomes to comply with current regulations and encourage increased visitation and economic growth to the region.

This report demonstrates the capacity of Ball Park Caravan Park for redevelopment to provide a facility that caters for a broad market, offering contemporary accommodation and recreational facilities, supported by a business case demonstrating the forecast financial performance of the park.

The draft structure plans for the Corowa foreshore and surrounds and Morris Park are the outcome of a planning process involving engagement with Councillors, management and staff of Federation Council and key stakeholders including representatives of locally based sporting clubs and the local land councils, the Corowa Business Chamber and Corowa

Landcare.

Implementation of the structure plans will generate ongoing social, environmental and economic benefits to Corowa and the wider region – stimulating an active lifestyle, attracting greater tourism, and supporting local businesses and the local economy as a whole.

The plans are now placed on exhibition to seek feedback from the community. Council will then consider the outcomes of the community consultation before adopting the final plans to guide the long-term strategic development of Ball Park Caravan Park, Corowa foreshore and Morris Park.

WASTE MANAGEMENT STRATEGY CONSULTATION RESULTS

Federation Council has recently completed consultation with our community in relation to its waste management services that it coordinates for residents.

The feedback received as part of the consultation will inform the development of a new Waste Management Strategy 2020-2030 for Federation Council.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said, the insights received are valuable and will assist with developing options for consideration as part of the development of a new Waste Management Strategy.

"I would like to thank residents for completing the online survey and advise that there will be another opportunity to have your say when the draft Waste Management Strategy is prepared and made available for public exhibition."

"Federation Council is committed to delivering effective and equitable waste management services to our residents to improve the liveability of our beautiful communities."

COROWA AQUATIC CENTRE WORKS PROGRESS

The project to deliver a new aquatic centre in Corowa is progressing well with construction works underway at the Ball Park Precinct site.

Council has engaged Hines Construction to deliver the new facility, scheduled to be opened to the public in March 2021.

"This is a very exciting project that will deliver a new, modern aquatic centre for our Council's residents and visitors," Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said.

"The community has told us what they want to see as part of this new facility, and now we're working towards achieving a contemporary aquatic centre that caters to a variety of needs, and will be enjoyed for many years to come."

Council made the decision to endorse option four, which consists of a 50 metre pool, learn to swim pool and splash park at an ordinary meeting of Council in May 2019.

Funding for a splash park was announced in October last year by the NSW Government, which secured the foundation for a \$750,000 splash park to be built as part of the redevelopment of the pool complex.

Since endorsing option four the Council has been extremely proactive and investigated many options and models presented to them based on extensive

community consultation. Council has been assisted throughout this process by the Swimming Pool Advisory Committee which consists of Councillors, pool users, youth council members and swimming club representatives.

Mayor Bourke said it is great to see work well underway on what will be a modern aquatic centre in the heart of the Federation Council region.

On 5 April 2019, the Prime Minister, the Hon Scott Morrison MP, and Minister for Families and Social Services, the Hon Paul Fletcher MP, announced the establishment of the Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with Disability.

In Australia, royal commissions are the highest form of inquiry on matters of public importance. Recent inquiries and reports have shown that people with disability are more likely to experience violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation than people without disability.

What we learn from the Royal Commission will help to inform Australian governments, institutions and the wider community on how to prevent, and better protect, people with disability from experiencing violence, abuse, neglect and exploitation in the future. The Disability Royal Commission will run for three years until 2022.

The Disability Royal Commission wants to hear from you about any issue relevant to its Terms of

Reference arising for you, a family member, a friend or someone you work for or with, or as a carer.

Here at RDAS we can help you to write a submission to tell your story in the best way that suits your needs/abilities. DESIGNING SUICIDE PREVENTION FOR MEN IN FARMING OCCUPATIONS

The National Enterprise for Rural Community Wellbeing are completing a research project in relation to suicide prevention for men in farming occupations.

They are looking for men in farming occupations who are willing to talk to them about their experiences of distress or poor mental health to give them perspectives on what local communities can do to support the wellbeing of farmers and prevent suicides.

They will produce community based strategies for suicide prevention that are specifically designed for men in farming occupations (farmers, farm labourers, stockmen, tractor drivers etc.). They are working alongside rural based Suicide Prevention Networks and organisations involved in suicide prevention to make sure that the strategies we co-design are driven by and supported by rural communities.

Participation will involve a face-to-face confidential interview with a researcher at a time and place that is mutually convenient and suitable. During the interview participants will be asked about their personal experiences of distress, any experiences of community-based support or services and thoughts on what communities could do to better support men in farming.






I would like to thank the whole school community including teachers, support staff, administrative staff, parents and carers for the wonderful support given to students' learning during these unprecedented and unpredictable times. I'd also like to thank all the students who worked so well at home, following the timetables given to them, meeting face to face with teachers on "Skype" for direct instruction and recording their learning on the "SeeSaw" app.



It is so lovely to have the students back today, they are all eager, full of energy and ready for new learning! We have commenced our Term 2 programs today. Our history unit is "The First Fleet"; students will be learning about the British colonisation (invasion) of Australia, the social circumstances and challenges in both Britain and the new Australian colony at the time and also the impact of British colonisation on Aboriginal people. To support this theme, Stage 2 and 3 students have begun reading and studying the novel *Tom Appleby, Convict Boy*, by Jackie French and they will be composing a variety of creative, persuasive and informative texts drawn from the concepts in the novel.

During science, students will be investigating light and shadows. Visual Art lessons will draw on both the science and history themes; students will be creating a range of digital and 2D shadow artworks and also colonial 2D and 3D constructions. During maths lessons in the first 2 weeks of term, students have been consolidating their skills in whole number and have now moved on to addition, subtraction (K-4) and fractions and decimals (Years 5/6). Students will also receive instruction on musical notation this term, including beat and rhythm, a great follow on from learning about fractions! They will also be learning some traditional Australian Colonial songs and hopefully performing them before the community if assemblies are allowed by the end of the term!



We are ensuring that we are following the guidelines set down by the government and the Department of Education in response to Covid-19. We are practising social distancing as much as practicable, washing hands regularly and also using hand sanitiser. Cleaners have also been given additional shifts to ensure that surfaces are kept clean and disinfected.







- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluoro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.
