Council will provide a free domestic inert household waste collection service on the following dates:

The maximum amount to be collected from each residence will be limited to one 6'X4' box trailer load. All items are to be placed on the nature strip in a clear space and should not impede pedestrians.

Council will collect white goods and up to 4 car tyres from each residence. Council will not remove these items if a booking has been made by contacting Urana's Council Office prior to the nominated dates.

Residents have the option to take their hard waste to the Oaklands landfill site on Tuesday 10 December, during normal tip operating hours and Urana on Friday 13 December.

Fibro Sheeting, Greenwaste, Hazardous Materials, Liquids or Asbestos will not be collected.

Residents are requested to place hard waste material neatly on the nature strip before 8.00am each day.

\$1 MILLION ON DROUGHT FUNDING FOR 15 PROJECTS

Supporting our rural communities who are impacted from the effects of the drought is at the forefront of Council's work. The Federation Council area is currently identified as drought affected by the NSW Department of Primary Industries and was subsequently invited to apply for \$1 million in funding from the Federal Governments Drought Communities Extension Program. Council has now formally submitted its application to the Federal Government, which was endorsed at the October Council Meeting. Council's application consisted of 15 projects, which will have a positive, impact both on the communities within Federation Council and the Agricultural Sector more broadly.

The projects included in the application were developed in consultation with the community through Council's Drought Committee, which met in early October 2019 to identify and discuss the projects for consideration. Projects needed to meet the Extension Program guidelines, which were that:

- Projects needed to require a minimum grant amount of \$25,000.
- Projects must contribute to local employment, the local economy and lead to the retention of businesses, services and facilities.
- Projects must be completed by Tuesday 30 June 2020.

GOVERNMENT GRANTS & PROGRAMS

FUNDING BOOST FOR NSW EMERGENCY WATER INFRASTRUCTURE



NSW Landowners can access funds to complete water infrastructure following the expansion of the Australian Government's Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme (EWIRS).

The rebate program will provide an additional \$13 million for drought-affected livestock and farmers to purchase and upgrade water infrastructure.

Primary producers who are eligible for funding can access rebates of up to \$25,000 on new purchases and installation costs of water infrastructure projects.

This includes the installation of pipes, water storages and water pumps, sediment dams and associated power supplies such as generators. The program will also now allow horticulturists with permanent planting, who are previously ineligible for funding to access it.

NSW Minister for Agriculture Adam Marshall said many farmers have already accessed the program, with the initial allocation of \$10 million exhausted and 650 applications awaiting processing and funding.

"These producers have been doing it incredibly tough with ongoing drought conditions." Mr Marshall said.

The EWIRS is funded by the Australian Government and administered by the NSW Government.

Applications close 30 June 2021 or earlier if the funding allocation is exhausted.

OUR HERITAGE- URANA POST OFFICE REPAINTING

This heritage project was suggested by Jenny Hearn, who noted that the post office has a very important social role in Urana. When the owner Marie, who is still keeping busy, was consulted she said "I'm also a heritage item now".

When heritage worker Mimi arrived to repaint the post office on Marie's 82nd birthday, Marie said, "Thank you, this is the best birthday present I could get". Much of the work was carried out during the annual vintage machinery club tractor pull weekend. So all weekend, a constant stream of people were stopping by, commenting and admiring the post office.

As the heritage sign on the post office says, the building was built in the 1870s, designed by the renowned colonial architect James Barnet. He also designed Urana Courthouse and probably the Urana Public School. He also designed the State Library of NSW and Customs House.

When water cleaned with a machine loaned by Council, it became obvious how badly the paint had peeled. The original dark green paint of the timber work was found under the recent layers of paint and was restored. Also, early historical photos showed that the verandah roof had been painted in stripes. Scraping back each roof sheet and hand painting the stripes was extra effort but produced a good result.

Future work could address other aspects of the building such as re-screwing the roof. But for now, the street frontage of Urana Post Office has been refreshed.

OUR HERITAGE- SILKWORM FARM TREE RESTORATION

Just out of Corowa, a small 19th century silkworm farm building can be seen from the main road. This was a unique 1860s attempt to save the English silk textile industry and give respectable employment to women in the NSW colony. Today only a building ruin and archaeological remains are left.

The silkworm farm mulberry trees were removed long ago. But when a local volunteer Helen Jobson suggested replanting, the property owner Dyonne Rhodes eagerly accepted.

Council's heritage adviser Peter Kabaila went to the property recently to meet Dyonne and the other local volunteers, Heather Kerr, Maurice Wilson and David Jobson and Helen Jobson.

David and Helen brought heritage tree varieties from Beechworth and Albury to the property. Digging the planting holes by hand failed. The soil was too hard. So Heather organised for Maurice to arrive on site with his excavator and drill. Maurice provided wonderful tree planting holes. Into these we mixed cow manure.

With this start of the silkworm farm tree restoration, there is now a line of trees to visually screen the farm sheds from the heritage building. If these new trees get

enough water and survive, we will follow up with more plantings each year.

Thanks to volunteers Maurice, Helen, Heather, Dyonne and David, the heritage building will get a beautiful landscape of silkworm trees.

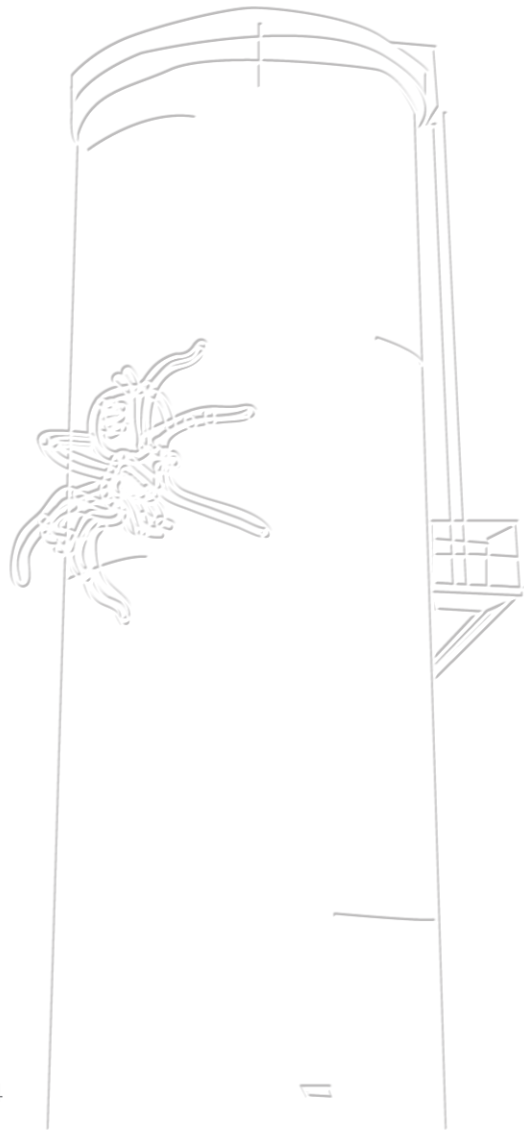

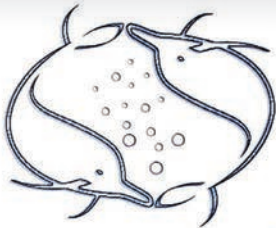
