URANA COURT HOUSE MUSEUM RESTORATION PROJECT OFFICIAL OPENING

Perfect weather conditions greeted the large crowd at the Urana Court House Museum Roof Restoration Official Opening on Friday 23 August.

The official opening provided an exciting atmosphere for the community to gather together and celebrate the completion of the project along with the opening of the 'Hats off to Freddie Fox The Boy from Urana' Exhibition.

The Create NSW Regional Cultural Fund (Round 2) enabled the roof restoration of the museum which will provide a weather proof space for the valued exhibition materials and historical items.

Mayor Pat Bourke said Council was proud to celebrate the Urana Court House Museum upgrade opening with the community and hoped that the building would now safely provide a space for many future exhibitions. The building, now proudly displays historical items for educational. cultural and social engagement, is a monument to 19th Century design and construction and the significant European influence of the period in the region.

"To compliment the opening, the Urana Progress Association also organized the 'Hats off to Freddie Fox The Boy from Urana' Display.

The timeless display includes some of Freddie's finest millenary work, the story of Freddie Fox and his close association with the Royal Family and other notable world celebrities."

FREDDIE FOX PARK OFFICIAL OPENING



To streamline the process, Federation Council has upgraded the way the Community Grants will work including the introduction of an easy to use online form.

The amendments to the Community Grants Program also includes changes to the previous eligible and ineligible criteria, assessment criteria, terms and conditions as well as three new categories to help aid in creativity,

sustainability and viability of community projects and events.

BOREE CREEK FREIGHT LINK ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Federation Council has completed the first stage of the stabilization works of the 1.2km section of the total 3.1km Boree Creek freight link road.

The second stage of the reconstruction has started for the 1.2km section. The stabilisation work has been scheduled to commence on the Tuesday 17 September weather permitting.

This will be followed by the bitumen sealing of the 2.3 km section which will complete stages one and two.

Where: Boree Creek Road from Fletts Road 3.2km north east on Boree Creek Road.

The construction is due to conclude on Thursday 31 October 2019.

Note: Timeline is subject to weather conditions.

Work Hours: Work will take place form 7:30am to 5:00pm, Monday to Friday. Work may occur after hours and on weekends as required.

BROADLEAF WEED SPRAYING PROGRAM

Council will be undertaking a spraying program to all ovals, parks and open spaces during September and early October 2019 to selectively remove Broadleaf weeds.

Turf quality and reduce mowing frequencies.

The herbicide that will be used is Stadium Turf (20 g/l Clopyralid, 15 g/l Diflufenican, 300 g/l MCPA).





SNIPPETS OF LOCAL HISTORY: EARLY DOCTORS

The first doctor to take up residence in the area was Dr Bellamy who arrived in 1876. Dr Bellamy took part in the opening of the Urana Hospital in 1882. Later that year he was replaced by Dr Anderson. Who was then replaced by Dr Gaint in 1885. The community organised a medical fund to help cover the costs of the doctor and attempt to keep a doctor or doctors in the area. He was followed by Dr Korif in 1890 followed by Dr Martin the same year.

At our last LHAC meeting we had the pleasure of a visit from Dr Mark Wootherspoon. Dr Mark is a highly qualified dental surgeon with years of experience working in both private practice and with our Australian armed forces. He is developing a program of



mobile dentistry, "Dentist to your door" . This program is designed to deliver basic dental care to Aged Care Facilities as well as in home for those in more rural and remote areas. Treating patients in their own chair or indeed their own bed.

Referrals for more extensive treatment, if needed will be made, but he envisages that most work can be done in the facility or their home. His mobile dental kit is contained in one portable box ,that expands into a mobile dental surgery that has all the equipment needed to perform most common dental procedures.
