### TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES - ANZAC DAY

The following roads and streets will be temporarily closed to traffic on Anzac Day, Thursday 25th April 2019.

#### COROWA ANZAC DAY DAWN SERVICE AND MARCH (between 5.30am and 6.30am)

- Honour Avenue –Steele Street to Bow Street
- Federation Avenue – Mary Street to Bow Street
- Short Street- Full length
- Walker Street- Full length

#### COROWA (between 10am and 12noon)

- Sanger Street – River Street to Federation Avenue
- Honour Avenue – Steele Street to Sanger Street
- Federation Avenue (West bound) – Sanger Street to Queen Street
- Bow Street (South bound) – John Street to Honour Avenue
- Short Street – Full length
- Isabel Street – Riesling Street to Sanger Street
- Church Street – Queen Street to Sanger Street
- Walker Street – Full length

#### HOWLONG ANZAC DAY MARCH

Larmer Street, Howlong will be closed to all vehicular traffic between the hours of 11:30am and 12:30pm. Road closure points will be established at the following locations:

- Larmer Street at the intersection of Riverina Highway
- Larmer Street to the corner of Hawdon Court
- Larmer Street at the intersection of Victoria Street

#### MULWALA ANZAC DAY MARCH

Melbourne Street, Mulwala will be closed to all vehicular traffic from opposite Hicks Butchers to the Cenotaph entrance at Old Mill Road, between the hours of 9:30am and 10.00am. Road closure points will be established at the following locations;

- Melbourne Street 50 metres North of Dunmore Street
  - Dunmore Street at the intersection of Melbourne Street
  - Bayly Street at the intersection of Melbourne Street
  - Melbourne Street 50 metres south of Old Mill Road
- There will be no alternate route during the parade.

#### WAHGUNYAH ANZAC DAY MARCH

John Foord Bridge will be closed to all vehicular traffic South of the entry to Ball Park Caravan Park to Rutherglen Wahgunyah Road in Wahgunyah between 9:00am-10:30am. Road closure points will be established at the following locations;

- Bridge Road
  - John Foord Bridge - Full Length
  - Foord Street, Wahgunyah – Short Street to 50 metres North Rutherglen Wahgunyah Road
  - Short Street at the intersection of Foord Street
  - Barkly Street at the intersection of Foord Street
  - Blanche Street at the intersection of Foord Street
- Entry to Ball Park Caravan Park and Rowers Park is still permitted during this time.

Temporary closures will be displayed by way of barricades and signs or by traffic controllers. Alternative routes and detours will be clearly signposted.

### WATCH OUT FOR WILDLIFE

The current dry conditions are causing wildlife to come closer to residential areas looking for food and water. Please be mindful that they are protected species. If they appear around your home, do not feed them nor approach them. To deter kangaroos or wallabies from gardens and lawns in residential areas, landholders are recommended to:

- appropriately fence property to exclude these animals;
  - limit the animals' access to water on the property;
  - regularly mow lawns to reduce grass cover;
  - increase the coverage of other vegetation to reduce lawn size and grazing comfort;
  - use deterrent products like sonic deterrents or blood and bone fertilizer; or
  - use motion activated security lights which may deter night time grazing.
