

COUNCIL COMPLIANCE NOTIFICATIONS FOR COMPANION ANIMALS

Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Council works hard to communicate with local pet owners regarding these responsibilities, keeping both our furry friends and our community safe.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PET OWNERS

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off-leash area.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Greyhounds must be muzzled at all times when in a public place.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

FEDERATION COUNCIL APPROVED OFF-LEASH AREAS

The purpose of leash free areas is to allow dogs to exercise off lead, to run freely in a safe environment, to enjoy off lead activities without interfering with the general public and to provide the opportunity for socialising with other dogs.

Federation Council has provided four off-leash areas in the Council area;

- Corowa:** Corowa Intersection of Federation Avenue and River Street, South
- Corowa:** Eastern end of Edward Street opposite Bangerang Park, adjacent to tennis courts
- Mulwala:** Kyffins Reserve, 4.1km east of Mulwala, Spring Drive.
- Howlong:** South west corner of Lowe Square.

In 1918 first the Germans and then the Allies launched major offensives on the Western Front, ending years of stalemate and initiating a war of movement that favoured the Allies' superior numbers, vast industrial capacity and hard-earned tactical knowledge. On 4 July Australian and United States troops seized the town of Hamel in a battle lasting just ninety-three minutes, one in a series of local actions preceding a massive offensive in August that led three months later to Germany's defeat.
