SPEED ZONE REVIEWS - DAYSDALE TOWNSHIP & HONOUR AVE COROWA

NSW Roads and Maritime Services are currently considering a request to review Speed Zones in Daysdale and Honour Ave, Corowa.

The request is to raise the speed limit that is currently 50 km/h to 60 km/h through the township of Daysdale and to extend the 60 km/h zone along Honour Ave from Gordon Street (250m north-east) to the Federation Bridge / Corowa Saleyards roundabout.

Federation Council is undertaking a review of the design and layout of Sanger Street Corowa.
