BIOSECURITY WEEDS

With the commencement of Spring and the weather warming up, Biosecurity weeds around Federation Council area are likely to become more prominent over the coming months. This is particularly so given rainfall of late, creating ideal conditions for weeds to grow.

Council is currently prioritising the reduction and elimination of Biosecurity weeds, with a focus on problem weeds such as Chilean Needle Grass, St John's Wort, Spiny Burr Grass, Horehound, African Boxthorn, Blackberry, Silver Leaf Nightshade and Coolatai Grass.

An inspection program is undertaken by Council throughout the year to manage and minimise the spread of Biosecurity weeds. This inspection program assists to identify weeds in their early growth stage, so that Council and landowners can control the spread of weeds. Council is encouraging landowners to take effective measures to remove weeds from their property.

To assist landowners, a range of information and resources regarding weeds are available at any Council Office along with printed materials to help with the identification of weeds. Additionally information is also available from Council's website.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PET OWNERS

- If your dog is in a public place, it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area, it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- If your dog defecates in a public place, it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
