PUBLIC EXHIBITION - ALLOCATION OF FUNDS TO WEST CORUGAN PRIVATE IRRIGATION DISTRICT

At the Ordinary Council Meeting in March, Federation Council resolved to allocate \$15,000 from within the 2016/17 Operational Plan to the West Corugan Private Irrigation District, subject to a 28 day public exhibition period. This money will be used to part fund the installation of a syphon system under the channel network near Daysdale.

Food Waste Processing Facility 21-25 Poseidon Road Corowa Designated Development

Federation Council being the consent authority has received an application (DA 2017/63) seeking development consent to establish a Food Waste Processing Facility on land located at Lot 78 DP 1052205, 21-25 Poseidon Road Corowa.

The development proposed is for processing of food industry finished goods that are not sold for human consumption, and is defined as "designated development" under the provisions of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

To commemorate Anzac Day 2017, Canberra based artist and winner of the 2006 Gallipoli Art Prize, Margaret Hadfield-Zorgdrager will be exhibiting The Gallipoli Series 'Standing Room Only for Heroes'.

This powerful and provocative collection of paintings and drawings captures the emotion of war. The collection, which began from a 6-day visit to the Gallipoli peninsula in 2004, commemorates the service and sacrifice of Australian service personnel. The works are the result of Margaret's visual exploration of the present and past history of wars.

The Gallipoli Series is a joint inspiration and collaboration with writer and military historian Dr Kathryn Spurling. Dr Spurling, a research Associate at Flinders University, will accompany Margaret Hadfield-Zorgdrager at the Corowa Art Space for the opening of the exhibition on 20 April 2017 at 6pm.
