MICROCHIP YOUR PET

Microchipping is a quick and harmless procedure where a small microchip is inserted between your pet's shoulder blades either by a local vet or animal welfare organisation. It provides identification only for your animal.

If your microchipped pet goes astray and is taken to a vet, pound or shelter, we use the microchip's data to contact you and quickly reunite you with your pet.

Microchipping your animal does not include registration. You must register your dog by 6 months and cats by 4 months of age.

Our fury friends are so important in our lives, so make sure your pet is microchipped so if it does go astray we can return it safely to you.

ON EXHIBITION

Federation Council has resolved at its Ordinary Council meeting held on Tuesday 28 September, to place the Proposal to Reestablish Alcohol Free Zones and Alcohol Prohibited Zones on public exhibition for community feedback and input.

The current Alcohol Free Zones and Alcohol Prohibited Zones are due to expire December 2021. The proposal seeks to re-establish the existing zones for a further four (4) years until 1st December 2025 under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1993, following input from stakeholders and community engagement. Existing zones, including maps are detailed in the proposal.

No new zones have been included and no existing zones have been removed from this proposal. It is further proposed that a more detailed review of these zones and any potential new zones is undertaken by council in 2025.
