# LED STREETLIGHT UPGRADE PROJECT

Work to upgrade more than 1490 streetlights to energy efficient technology will begin this week as part of a major energy efficiency project that will save hundreds of thousands in electricity bills and reduce greenhouse gas emissions for the ratepayers of Federation Council.

The switch to LED technology will see a 329 MWh per year reduction in power use, delivering savings of approximately \$102,000 each year in maintenance and electricity costs.

# **ROAD WORKS KENNEDY & HOLBEACH** STREETS INTERSECTION HOWLONG

Federation Council wishes to advise that road works will commence on the intersection of Kennedy and Holbeach Streets Howlong from Wednesday 13 January until mid-February 2021.

This work will address the poor condition of the pavement of the intersection and is being funded by the Local Roads Capital Infrastructure Grant.

The intersection will be closed for periods to allow excavation works but access will be available at night.

Normal working hours for this construction activity will be Monday to Friday, from 7:00am- 5:00pm. When travelling through the construction site please be aware of the road crews, equipment and potential traffic delays during the construction.

Motorists are requested to pay attention to traffic control signs including reductions in the speed limit. Alternative parking is recommended during these hours; please refrain from parking out the front of your residence whilst the bulk earthworks are being undertaken. Residents will be able to gain access to their properties

Please note that all road work is dependent on the weather conditions.

#### **MULWALA WASTE SERVICES**

Federation Council wishes to advise that the additional skip bins made available at the Mulwala Transfer Station will be removed earlier than previously communicated.

The purpose of this additional waste service was to manage the domestic household waste (waste normally disposed of in a yellow, red or green kerbside bin) generated over the Christmas and New Year period by the influx of visitors to the

Due to the Victorian Government Covid travel restrictions, unfortunately visitors departed earlier than expected and therefore volumes of domestic waste has reduced. Household waste that is unable to be disposed of in your yellow, red or green kerbside bins including items such as whitegoods, building materials, old machinery, lawn mowers should be disposed of at your nearest Waste Facility or Community Recycling Centre.

The Mulwala Transfer Station is located at Old Barooga Road, Mulwala and is open Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday 9:00am - 12noon.

Council wishes to remind residents that littering and illegal dumping in parks is prohibited and penalties apply under the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 No 156.
