- Allocation of almost \$1 million dollars in funding to support community groups and organisations to deliver projects that are providing excellent outcomes.

The new council will be elected in September and I am confident that communities and the organisation will continue to go from strength to strength.

Funding boost for a strong community



Communities across the Federation Council are set to receive an injection of funds, following the recent announcement of successful projects under the Stronger Communities Major Projects Fund.

Almost \$9 million dollars has been allocated to 15 infrastructure projects that will allow council to address many long standing community priorities. The aim of the funding program is to support projects that create stronger and more vibrant communities.

Administrator, Mike Eden said the Stronger Communities Fund was a once off opportunity to deliver a number of important projects that otherwise would not have been possible.

"Communities have been working towards some of these projects for many years, so we are really pleased to provide the funding that will finally see them happen," Mr Eden said.

An independent panel was appointed to assess the applications made under the major projects program, and included Local Member Greg Aplin MP, Regional Coordinator of Department of Premier and Cabinet Trudi McDonald and probity advisor Malcom McLean.

\$3.8 million has been earmarked for roads funding to help address the significant maintenance and renewal backlog that exists across the council area.

"The community have told us they want to see money spent on local roads, so this is a good outcome," Mr Eden said.

There is also a focus on community infrastructure, with some exciting play space and recreational projects on the list. Playgrounds, skateparks, sporting facilities and reserves will undergo improvements designed to meet the needs of families and young people.

A number of projects are also expected to help drive economic growth and attract visitation to the area, ensuring communities are strong and sustainable into the future.

Mr Eden said projects such as the new playgrounds and skateparks will promote the area not only as a great destination to visit, but a great place to live and raise a family.

"Local sporting clubs are such an important part of small communities - so we've also allocated some much needed funding to renew and upgrade facilities that provide ongoing social benefits to the community," he said.

In addition to the fifteen major infrastructure projects announced, a further \$293,680 was also allocated to community groups and organisations who were successful in their funding applications under Round 2 of the Stronger Communities Fund.

"We received 36 applications in round two and there was a real diversity in the nature of the projects seeking funding," Mr Eden said.

"Each applicant should be very proud of their dedication to building strong communities and their efforts in preparing the applications.

"The 13 successful projects ranged from wetland improvements and renovations for all abilities access, to relocating and restoring a historic engine."

A number of major projects will get underway before the end of the year, with the remainder to be scheduled for completion within two years.

Successful round two projects announced

Round two of the Stronger Communities Grants has been announced, with \$293,680 in funding going toward 13 worthy projects across Federation Council communities.

Federation Council received \$10 million from the NSW Government to improve community infrastructure and services. Of this, almost \$1 million was made available for community groups and organisations to apply for grants of up to \$50,000 to support important community projects.

Stand For Your Community – Call for Council Election Nominations

Federation Council Administrator Mike Eden is encouraging more people - including women, young people and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds - to stand for their community at this year's September Local Government elections.

Mr Eden believes a greater representation of candidates from all walks of life would not only strengthen Federation council, but also ensure it has a greater voice for all ratepayers.

"Councillors have an important role to play in making decisions that respond to the changing needs of the community," Mr Eden said.

"Serving the local community as an elected councillor is a challenging but rewarding role.

"It doesn't matter if you don't think you have the experience in local government – if you are passionate about your local community and want to make a real

difference then I encourage you to consider this opportunity and stand for your community."

Federation Council has a population of over 12,000, of which over 70% of these are eligible voters. Anyone who is eligible to vote at Council elections in NSW is also eligible to stand for election as a councillor.

Prospective nominees should firstly check to ensure they are on the electoral roll for Federation Council by contacting the NSW Electoral Commission.

"Our council should be a reflection of the people and communities they serve," Mr Eden said.

"Bringing diverse views and experiences to decision making will ensure our local communities get the best solutions and outcomes."

The Office of Local Government has prepared a range of materials to assist prospective candidates in making an informed decision about standing for local government elections.

Council Solar Installation pays off!

Council engaged KDEC, a local Albury based firm, in 2015, to install a 20kw solar panel system on the Urana Office. The initial investment was around \$60,000, and Council estimated around a \$15,000 saving per year on its annual electricity charges, meaning around a 5 year payback period.

The system has performed above expectations and this year, meaning the payback period should be even sooner than 5 years. This is a terrific result not only from an economic point of view, to allow those funds to now be spent on other areas, but also to reduce Council's carbon footprint. Well done!

Oaklands Medical Centre.

Funding allocation: \$346,942

Project Partners: Urana Medical Centre

Murrumbidgee Health Service

Timeline: A detailed project timeline will be developed.

In rural communities, we need innovative models to ensure everyone has access to locally based medical services.

This project will establish a cooperative model of sharing

General Practitioner services between Urana and Oaklands.

To support this, Council will purchase a residential building in Hunter Street Oaklands and convert this into a Medical Centre.

Dr Yaramati of Urana will provide services from Oaklands part time and work to attract and a second GP for the practice who would also support the delivery of services in Urana.







Oaklands RV Park.

Funding allocation: \$87,173

Project Partners: Oaklands Town Improve Committee

Local businesses

Timeline: A detailed project timeline will be developed.

Construction of an RV Park in the main street of Oaklands will enable 5 RVs to park overnight with access to toilet and shower facilities at the adjacent pool, as well as BBQ facilities and a dump point.

Catering for RV enthusiasts is a great way to encourage visitors to stay a while and inject some money into the local economy.

Working together with the community, this project is valued at over \$102,373 and will be developed off Milthorpe and Hunter street.

The project will include:

 Roadway and gravel pathway construction

- Gazebo
- · Landscaping and irrigation
- · Fencing and bollards
- Alterations to the existing pool amenities to enable secure afterhours and all ability access







Rand Sports Ground Redevelopment.

Funding allocation: \$70,506

Project Partners: Rand Sports Ground Committee

Timeline: A detailed timeline will be developed.

This funding will allow the final stage of the renovation project to be completed, after 10 years working on stage 1 and 2. The completion of the project will increase the usability and functionality of this important community facility.

The project includes upgrades to heating and cooling, renovations

to the function room, installation of large glass doors and an external serving area, an undercover BBQ facility and extension of the existing verandah to improve spectator viewing.

Importantly, renovations of the shower and toilet facilities will be completed to ensure all abilities access and the creation of a nursing parent room.

The onsite dam will be enlarged and a new solar pump installed to improve water supply to the grounds.





\$3.8 million dollar injection into local roads federation council.nsw.gov.au

Fixing local roads.

Funding allocation: \$3.8 million

Project Partners: Fully funded from Stronger Communities Fund

Timeline: A project timeline will be developed for completion within the

2018/19 financial year.

Road maintenance and renewal throughout the Federation Council area has been identified by the community as a key priority.

As such, \$3.8 million has been allocated from the Stronger Communities Fund to repair the sealed road network. This allocation of funding is in addition to more

than \$10.5 million being directed from Council's 2017/18 capital works program.

The works will contain various minor projects spread across the road network in the council area, improving road safety and driver comfort and repairing damaged pavements. Where possible,

localised drainage will be addressed as a part of these roadworks.

A focus of the program will be improving access for heavy vehicles, reducing road roughness and providing farm to market roads to support the local economy.







Victoria Park Redevelopment, Urana.

Funding allocation: \$ 79,592

Project Partners: The Campdraft Inc

Vintage Machinery Club

Timeline: A detailed project timeline will be developed.

Victoria Park in Urana offers more than football, netball, tennis and playgrounds. It plays host to the two-day Urana Vintage Rally and Ute Show as well as a two day Campdraft which attracts over 125 competitors annually. These events are important fundraisers for the clubs and will benefit from the funding injection.

The Stronger Communities funding will be added to existing funding to

provide \$105,592 to complete:

- Access road renewal works and traffic control improvements.
- Campdraft facility upgrades including a water point for cattle, arena improvements, spectator seating, and a shade shelter.
- An expansion and improvement to the Vintage Machinery Club facilities
- Modifications to the public toilet facilities to allow all ability access.
- Improvements to the Air Strip to continue to support emergency and agricultural aircraft.

QUAD BIKE SAFETY TRAINING FREE FOR FARMERS

Farmers will now receive free quad bike training in a major boost to the safety improvement program aimed at significantly reducing the number of deaths on rural properties across NSW.

Minister for Innovation and Better Regulation Matt Kean said farmers who complete an approved training course would also receive a free helmet – worth around \$120 - suitable for use while they are riding their quad bikes. The changes announced today represent a further saving to farmers of up to \$230.

SafeWork NSW has partnered with Tocal College to deliver up to 100 training events in regional and remote areas across NSW. From 8 May, free training will also be available through authorised Registered Training Organisations.

Previously, farmers attending an approved training course (costing up to \$510) received a rebate of \$310.

Mr Kean said more than 200 farmers had attended Tocal College training days since the\$2 million quad bike safety program was launched last year.

"There've been 113 deaths from quad bike accidents across Australia since 2011, with 32 incidents just in NSW. Each fatality was someone's loved one, and has a devastating impact on families and communities," Mr Kean said.

"I am completely committed to reducing the number of deaths and injuries from the use of quad bikes in the workplace, and that's why I want more farmers to undertake this training so they can be as safe as possible on their properties.

"We know time is money to farmers and it's not easy for them to give up a day's work to undergo quad bike training," Mr Kean said.

"We can't put more hours in the day but we can make the training free, and encourage farmers to use helmets, as the next step in our ongoing campaign to increase overall farm safety."

NSW Primary Industries Minister, Niall Blair, said improved rider education is critical to reducing the number of quad bike accidents.

"I encourage all farmers and their employees to take advantage of free quad bike safety training. There have been too many deaths on farms by people of all ages and levels of experience to ignore it," Mr Blair said. "I urge all farmers to integrate quad bike training into their employee induction process and treat quad bikes like any other tool of trade."

In March this year the government doubled the rebates available under the scheme for farmers who want to buy a safer side-by-side farm vehicle, retrofit safety equipment to existing quad bikes, and/or buy an approved helmet.

NSW Farmers administer rebates under the quad bike program, and members of the community can visit SafeWork.nsw.gov.au for further information.

Oaklands War Memorial Project cont.

The ladies said they have been blown away by offers of help and support from within their community.

"We were very fortunate to have the support of the Corowa RSL Club and NSW Grants with a successful application that allowed us to finish the project on time," they said.

"Our new design included the original Cenotaph, 2-pounder guns on polished concrete platforms, flag pole and a raised commemorative garden all finished within a large paved area for viewing.

"The new memorial includes existing pieces like our pair of 2-pounder anti-tank guns that were originally bought by a local farming family for the wheels many years ago and later donated to the town, these guns have been refurbished and installed as a major feature."

The ladies said many thanks once again to all those involved with the process of refurbishment, which has had a positive impact on the memorial.

"On Anzac Day 2017, we held our first commemorative service at our new memorial and the service was organised and run by Belinda Goldsack and Lana Coleman along with our local RSL Club," they said.

"Both Belinda and Lana have served with the Australian Navy and have returned home to Oaklands. "The local march was held in Milthorpe Street and finished at the memorial with a full commemorative service including a catapult party from Bandiana, led by SGT Mathew Moore.

"Our march included ex-serviceman and women, local school groups and family representing those who have served.

"A special thanks must also go to the Oaklands Central school students who contributed over 200 white timber crosses with the names of local servicemen from World War 1 and 2 which were lining the garden and pathway up to the RSL Club following the official ceremony."

Sarah and Melissa said this project has seen more volunteer hours than they can remember and a lot of community working bees.

"Without the amazing locals that gave their time to us we would never have the fantastic War Memorial that we see now, we would like this opportunity to thank everyone involved in this project," they said.

"It truly was a community effort and we are so very proud to have been part of it.

"We hope you will get as much out of it in the future as we will."

Federation Council General Manager Chris Gillard said he was honoured to have laid a wreath at the memorial service on behalf of council, as well as supporting the project via a council-contributed grant of \$2,900.

"It was particularly good to see the wonderful war memorial completed by a group of volunteers capably led by Sarah Moloney," he said.

"Federation Council would like to thank Sarah and everyone involved with this project, including the Corowa RSL Club who provided a cash injection of \$8,500 to add to other generous community donations."







Oaklands War Memorial Project

Anzac Day, 25th April 2017 was not only an important day for our Nation but it also marked the completion of an 18-month long project to build a new War Memorial in the township of Oaklands.

The project started with an idea over three years ago between two friends and community members, Sarah Maloney and Melissa Zeiher.

While attending an Anzac service in Oaklands both Sarah and Melissa felt that the current memorial did not do their servicemen and women justice, nor did it reflect the community in which they live in.

From that initial conversation, the project and concept to build a new war memorial using the existing pieces and a new design was born.

Sarah began work on the concept of a design which was later drawn into commercial grade plans by a former Oaklands resident, Duncan Austin who runs his own landscape design business in Melbourne.

The plans also included an RV Park, a plan that will soon become part of the War memorial complex, thanks to Federation Council confirming \$87,173 through the Stronger Communities Major Projects Funding.

Whilst the plans were being drawn up, Melissa went to work on building funding for the memorial, writing letters to community groups and fundraising ideas that would see the project complete in time for Anzac Day 2017.

Sarah and Melissa were supported by family and a close group of friends whom contributed many hours to the project whose assistance, support and help got the ladies over many difficult hurdles throughout the last 18 months.

Sarah and Melissa thanked the Oaklands Community, who were very quick to get behind the project.

"Our major contributors so far in the project are The Oaklands RSL Bowling Club, The Oaklands Town Improvement Committee, The Oaklands Lions Truck Show, The Oaklands Golf Club, The Oaklands Harvest Ball and The Oaklands Hotel and Pentarch, we cannot thank them enough," they said.

"The funding continued with individual community contributions and fundraising events held by the Oaklands RSL Bowling Club and our Project committee members.

"The community has raised over \$20,000 plus giving over \$40,000 of in-kind support from donations of machinery, food, equipment, materials and labour."
