FIREWOOD COLLECTION

Residents in the Federation Council area can apply to obtain a permit to collect firewood from road reserves for home heating during winter. Firewood collection is limited to 1 April – 30 September each year.

To apply for a permit, residents must complete the application form and show proof that they reside in the Federation Council area (i.e. drivers licence). Applicants must certify on the application that they will abide by the permit conditions and acknowledge that Council is not liable for any injuries to person, or any loss or damage to property arising from the firewood collection activities. Applications received from outside the Federation Council area will not be considered.

Residents will need to apply for a permit each firewood season (each year).

The permit application fee is \$31.00.

The NSW Government is making the planning system easier to use with the introduction of the online NSW Planning Portal.

The NSW Planning Portal is a digital space where community, industry and government can work together to better understand and meet their obligations under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

The NSW Planning Portal is a single place to go for planning processes and transactions online, it is simpler, faster and more transparent for everyone.

The portal can be used to lodge and process Development Applications (DA's) including modifications, Complying Development Certificate Applications (CDC's) and for certificates under Part 6 of the EP&A Act).

From Thursday 1 July 2021, it will be mandatory to lodge your Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC) and Complying Development Applications (CDC) via the online NSW Planning Portal.

FUNDING AVAILABLE TO RESTORE WAR MEMORIALS

Community members are being encouraged to apply for grants for conservation work on local war memorials.

Member for Albury Justin Clancy said grants of up to \$10,000 are available with applications opening for the NSW Government's Community War Memorials Fund.

"Each time you visit your local war memorial, I encourage you to consider how it could be protected, repaired or conserved for future generations," Mr. Clancy said.

"Our region is so proud of those who served to make our communities the vibrant places they are today.

"Let's continue to honour them with a tribute that's reflective of their service and sacrifice."

Grants are available to cover projects like conservation assessments, honour roll repair, environmental advice, cleaning, and repairs to war memorial halls.

Organisations including memorial trusts, veteran groups and local councils can apply.

Minister for Veterans Geoff Lee said maintaining the State's 3,200 war memorials is key to the NSW Government Veteran Strategy.

"These spaces reflect our diverse veteran community and unite us across generations Mr Lee said.

"Veterans have told us recognition of service is important to them, so the NSW Government will continue to support initiatives like this grant program."

Those residents present on the day had no idea we were coming and were very surprised and excited when we entered the activities room, where they were, I believe making Easter baskets, there was cheers and clapping all around when it was explained what they were for. One resident, especially, threatened to "frynap" the fry pan for her room and was very keen to start putting in orders for ingredients to make Lamb Curry and rice, stir fried pork and scrambled eggs with the resident chickens eggs. (That have started laying again after a good moult and settling into their new roost as featured in an earlier update). I got word the next day that they had a great time making air fried donuts. So all the items are being put to good use indeed.

Also in March the auxiliary was asked if we could consider fitting out some of the residents rooms and a couple of other rooms with new curtains. So myself and our treasurer Pauline went for a walk through with Karen, facility manager, to check the state of what was there. Most of these curtains had previously been purchased by the auxiliary many years ago and were well and truly getting a bit tatty and sad looking. Also some repairs needed to be made to some of the fittings as well. So we have obtained a good quote, total cost being in the region of \$15,000 and are now waiting for them to be made. Hopefully in a couple of weeks time.

So off I went to Spotlight and came back with some nice lace curtains to put in front. Michelle and I installed those on the same day we presented the new cooking appliances.

As always the best reward for us as auxiliary members, are the big smiles and happy faces of not just the residents but often staff as well when we can fulfil a wish or request that has been asked of us. It wonderful to see that the things we do, that the community contribute too, bring joy and can make life that little bit easier. Many residents cannot get out much if at all, especially this last year, so it makes what ever we can do to help just that much more important. I recently had cause to ask our treasurer to do a bit of a tally of just how much the auxiliary has contributed over the last 12 plus years.

The end figure is quite astounding and

does not include “odds and sods” the \$50 here or \$100 there. The amount of items donated came to, in round figures, a staggering \$107,000!. Items such as the new Emergency Room Bed, Comfort Chairs, Patient alarm system, living room and hall way curtains, Patient lifters with scales, Oxygen concentrator, infant scales, different trollies for drugs , dressings, craft trolley and the list goes on and on. All this is managed and donated with proceeds of raffles etc. and the very generous donations from the public, without which we could not continue to do the work we do. So thankyou to the Urana and district communities, and to those not part of the auxiliary who still willingly put a hand up to help when needed. You would be quite right to give yourselves a big pat on the back and I hope you agree that your contributions are well spent and more than worthwhile. Hopefully to continue well into the future.

NSW residents aged 18 and over can now apply for 4 x \$25 vouchers, worth \$100 in total. Vouchers can be used at participating NSW businesses that are registered as COVID Safe.



These include:

- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
