I have to start by congratulating Norm Provan on his elevation to "Immortal" status in the National Rugby League. Norm and Mal Meninga were the latest to from the 100 Hall of Fame players, to join a group of just 12 who are considered the best to have ever played the game. Norm was born in Urana before moving away to school in Sydney and then going on to become one of the greatest to ever play the game of Rugby League. See further details on page 3.

developments being the installation of the much anticipated Urana Savanah Goanna! The goanna has been fixed to a large quarry rock near the intersection of Federation Way and Stephen Street in Urana near the bowling club.

Urana Goanna - Public Art Sculpture



Council is very excited to announce the Urana Goanna sculpture has been installed outside the Urana Tennis Courts.

The Urana Goanna sculpture was inspired by the bark drawings of Yolngu artist, David Malangi, that are illustrated on the first Australian one dollar note (1966).

Urana Goanna is an addition to Council's impressive public art collection and sculpture trail. The sculpture trail will take you to a number of towns including Corowa, Urana, Boree Creek, Oaklands and Morundah where you will find some unique public art pieces. The public art pieces have all been completed by local artist Andrew Whitehead, and are a unique attraction that draw many visitors to the area.

Council formally recognises Urana born Immortal Norm Provan



Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke formally recognised recently inducted 12th Rugby League Immortal Norm 'Sticks' Provan at Council's Ordinary Meeting held on August 21.

The Immortals of rugby league in Australia are thirteen players named as the nation's greatest ever. To be honoured as an immortal is the greatest honour a player can achieve in Rugby League.

Norm was born on the 18th of December 1932 in Urana, New South Wales. Standing 193 cm and weighing 99 kg, Norm as a player was a giant of a man, a second-row forward (Rugby League) with the St. George Dragons.

During their 11-year consecutive premiership-winning run from 1956 to 1966, he played in the first 10 grand-final victories, the last five as captain-coach. Named amongst the nation's finest footballers of the 20th century, he was a representative in the Australian national team from 1954 to 1960 earning 18 Test and 2 World Cup appearances along with playing many state and city country games. Norms image in bronze forms one of the two men that have been termed 'The Gladiators' and is part of the NRL Rugby League Premiership trophy handed out each year. The photo is one of the most memorable sporting photographic images ever captured in Australia.

A letter of congratulations is set to be sent to Norm from Council, congratulating him on his outstanding achievements.

Council proposing new strategy to regulate septics

Council has placed on public exhibition its Draft Onsite Sewage Management Strategy for the regulation of septic systems.

Director of Infrastructure and Environment Peter Gall said the management of sewage is an important issue for our community.

"There are over a 1000 properties in Federation Council area on septic," he said.

"Many of these systems are located in close proximity to environmentally sensitive areas and drinking water supplies which residents rely on. If not correctly maintained or misused or overworked, septics can fail and cause problems."

Some of these problems include:

- Family members can be exposed to raw sewage which carries bacteria, viruses, parasites and other disease-causing micro-organisms.
- Wastewater runoff from septics can cause ground and surface water contamination affecting rivers, creeks, bores and dams.
- Drinking water supplies can become contaminated with unhealthy bacteria and viruses.
- Failed systems can attract insect and vermin which can act as vectors of disease.
- The soil surrounding septics can also become badly degraded making the land unusable.

Mr Gall emphasised that across Australia there has been many incidences of disease outbreaks caused by septics and many bore water supplies rendered unsafe for drinking because poorly managed septic systems.

"The new strategy has been designed with the aim of least intrusion of residents and landowners while still ensuring public health and environmental standards in the community are achieved," he said.

"It will be progressively rolled out over the next three years and will include the inspection and approval of new and existing septic systems. Initial inspections of septics are proposed to commence in early 2019."

Students from across the Federation region attended the celebration event to be congratulated by Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke for their involvement in the NSW Local Government Week competition and enjoy a barbeque lunch.

Mayor Pat Bourke said this year's theme The Power of Community, provided a great opportunity for students to explore all the ways that council is part of our community.

"Local Government Week 2018 is the perfect opportunity to highlight the important services that councils provide to their communities," Mayor Bourke said.

"Local government is at the heart of our communities, providing the services and infrastructure that help make a neighbourhood a home to residents and ratepayers. Council is about a lot more than the three Rs: Roads, Rates and Rubbish and this year's theme 'The Power of Community' really captured the breadth of services, roles, and duties that local councils perform in 2018. As the third tier of government in Australia, local government is the one that has most direct contact with ratepayers and residents, and the one that provides the vital services that keep our communities, villages, and towns, thriving."

This year, Council conducted a competition for all primary and preschool students in the Federation Council area.

The Pre-school competition involved:

Theme: Big Things Small Hands Do - Design an artwork that shows even a small person can make a big difference in the lives of their friends, family, and community. Students can use any type of media such as drawing, painting, sculpture or clay, working with paper and printmaking.

The primary school competition was judged in two sections:

Theme: Look Where We Live (Junior Students - Kinder to Year 3) - create a picture and write a short story that describes the different parts that form your community and the different roles people play to make a community strong.

Theme: It Takes a Village (Senior students - Year 4 to Year 6) are invited to submit a creative writing piece that includes the words 'It takes a village.' If you were the Mayor for the day what would you do to make a difference in your community and how would you inspire your community to come together and work on the project.

Community Grants Program Opening Soon

Round One of Federation Council's 2018-2019 Events and Community Grants program will be opening soon, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups to apply for a share in \$60,000 of funding for this year's Events & Community Development Grants Program.

"The Events & Community Development Grants program is a new initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this new initiative as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a critical for empowering community participation in local activities as well as championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for one-off projects through one of the seven categories:

- Arts And Culture
- Events & Tourism
- Community Work and Welfare
- Skill Development and Learning
- Health Promotion
- Accessibility and Inclusion
- Young People

"If you are an eligible group and you have a great idea that can benefit the wider community, pitch your initiative through Community Grants Program by Monday 15 October 2018," Mayor Bourke said.

The Community Grants Program operates in two funding rounds each year – in September and April - and invites applications for grants up to \$3,000. For grants, over \$3,000 contact the Community & Events Project Officer Phone: (02) 6033 8936

The Community Grants Program Opens Monday 17 September and closes Monday 15 October 2018. Applications recommended for approval will be considered at the October Council meeting, with funds presented to successful groups in November.

Responsibilities to our companion animals

Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Council works hard to communicate with local pet owners regarding these responsibilities, keeping both our furry friends and our community safe.

Responsibilities of pet owners

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area. Fines may apply if your dog is found to be not adequately leashed in a public place.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under the effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Greyhounds must be muzzled at all times when in a public place.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

Microchipping and pet registration

Microchipping and registration is a two part process that requires dog and cat owners to:

- 1. Have their dog or cat implanted with a microchip from the time they are 12 weeks of age, at point of sale or change of ownership (whichever occurs first)
- 2. Register their animals with their NSW local council by 6 months of age.

Both the microchipping and registration of your dog or cat include a one-off fee and are for the life of the animal.
