Dear Readers,

Welcome to the August edition of the Urana District Newsletter.

It has been another very busy month for Council with the highlight being the adoption of our 2020/2021 Operational Plan, 2018-2021 Delivery Program and

new ten year Long Term Financial Plan at the Council meeting on July 30.

Combined, these documents provide direction to all of our Council's operations and will help our organisation meet community demands for services and infrastructure by maximising what we can achieve with available resources. For those who can, please make yourselves familiar with the actions we plan to deliver across this year and beyond, many of course delivered in partnership with our community, from the valuable assistance from our many volunteers, clubs and other organisations.

The overall objective of the plans is to ensure Council services are sustainable into the future, while delivering on the many major projects outlined in the Community Strategic Plan. Under this year's budget Council will complete \$21.2M in capital projects. That includes \$1.6M to complete the new Corowa Swimming Pool project, \$0.3M for the Urana Aquatic Centre, \$1.9M for the new Howlong All Abilities Playground, \$0.9M in addressing draining problems and \$1.4M to complete the Mulwala Industrial Estate. AUSTRALIA DAY 2021 COMMUNITY EVENT -EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

Australia Day is a special time of the year for local residents to celebrate what makes the region a great place to live and visit.

Federation Council is interested in working with a community group or organisation that is passionate and already doing wonderful things to enrich the community, to help coordinate the official Australia Day Ceremony and Community Event.

The event will be held in Urana on Tuesday 26 January 2021.

Council will coordinate the formalities of the event, including the welcome address, welcome to the country, citizenship ceremonies, award presentations, ambassador guest speaker, flag raising ceremony and the singing of the National Anthem.

The successful community group or organisation will work with Council to organise the community event that will commence following the formalities of the day.

The organisers will have the support of Council staff to deliver an event that is family friendly, inclusive and provides an opportunity for the community to come together and celebrate the occasion. A dedicated budget of \$8000 in the 2020/2021 has been allocated to the Australia Day Ceremony and Community Event. A percentage of the budget will be given to the community group to cover costs.

The event plan and how the budget is used will be arranged and agreed upon in the first meeting between Council and the Community Group/s. The Letter of Agreement will be signed before the event planning takes place.

COUNCIL ADOPTS 2020/2021 OPERATIONAL PLAN, 2018/2021 DELIVERY PROGRAM & FINANCIAL PLAN

Council has adopted its 2020/2021 Operational Plan, 2018-2021 Delivery Program and Financial Plans at its August Council meeting, held on August 30.

Combined, these documents provide a guide to Council's operations and help the organisation meet community demands for services and infrastructure by maximising what it can achieve with its available resources.

In adopting the plans, Federation Council Mayor Patrick Bourke said the overall plans primary focus was to ensure Council services are sustainable into the future, while delivering on the many major projects outlined in the Community Strategic Plan.

"Council is pleased to adopt, its 2020/2021 Operational Plan, 2018-2021 Delivery Program and Financial Plans," Mayor Bourke said.

"Under this year's budget Council will complete \$21.2M in capital projects. That includes \$1.6M to complete the Corowa Swimming Pool, \$0.3M for the Urana Aquatic Centre, \$1.9M for the new Howlong All Abilities Playground, \$0.9M in addressing draining problems and \$1.4M to complete the Mulwala Industrial Estate. We will continue to deliver \$8.4M in road works, \$1.3M on our sewerage network and \$1.7M on the water network."

Mayor Bourke said Council's budget is delivering on the improvement to roads and the community facilities that the community expressed their requests for in the development of the Community Strategic Plan – Our Community Our Opportunity, developed under extensive community consultation in 2017.

"Since the formation of Federation Council in 2016, Council has worked extensively to deliver a range of new community infrastructure projects, as well as complete a monumental number of internal system upgrades and projects to provide a strong foundation for the new Council moving forward," he said.

"The NSW Government allocated a \$10M Stronger Communities Fund to the newly formed Federation Council. The purpose of the funding was to kick start the proiects deliverv of that improve community infrastructure and services. Given the NSW Government Stronger Communities Fund provided Council with a once off cash injection to create new community infrastructure projects and set a strong foundation for the betterment of Council and its communities, Council set to undertake a comprehensive review of its financial position through the development of the Long Term Financial Plan to identify funding strategies for the future."

Mayor Bourke said both former councils had long standing infrastructure backlogs and community priorities already

identified but not funded, and this funding program provided a much needed opportunity to help facilitate the delivery of these important projects.

"With the opening of new community facilities through this time, increased operating and maintenance expenditure required to support usage and renewal of the facilities into the future poses a challenge given the level of Council's existing revenue streams. Council engaged CT Management Group, the leading provider in local government service planning, to review our services and provide us with a financial plan to ensure our services are sustainable into the future."

Mayor Bourke said Council understands very clearly where their financial risks are, and have a plan for the next 10 years to ensure the Council continues to provide a high level of services to the community.

"Our long term plan relies upon ensuring our services are efficient and that we plan for the maintenance of the existing assets," he said.

"While the Merger Funding has delivered some excellent facilities for our community, we need to ensure we can afford to maintain and operate them and we can't afford to keep buying new facilities without a revenue source to operate them. We are very reliant upon grants and because we don't have the ability like a city or large urban Council to increase revenues through carparking fees or by gaining large revenues through our commercial interests we rely upon Federal and State Governments to provide grants to renew the infrastructure. That is a risk, particularly if the grants stop, or even if the indexation stops. We are proudly one of the lowest rating councils in NSW, but that may have to change if other levels of Government pull back on their funding."

The proposed budget sees general residential rates increase by an average of 2.6% in 2020/21, which Mayor Bourke said is in line with the cost increases Council has faced over the last year.

"Ratepayers will notice some considerable variance from the 2.6% increase due to the recent revaluation of properties across the shire, particularly in the farmland where there has been large variations in the land valuations," he said.

"Council will be seeking an application for a Special Rate Variation to take effect in the 2021/22 financial year. This is required to cover the operating and maintenance costs of the many new infrastructure projects delivered, or currently being delivered across the Council area. While we are working hard on the most cost efficient operation of new assets like the Corowa Aquatic Centre, the cost of running such excellent community facilities needs to be covered to ensure Council can sustain its position as a viable and growing Council into the future. The Special Rate Variation will cover the additional costs of the Corowa Aquatic Centre, and other infrastructure projects which will be outlined in the detailed community engagement Council will be doing in preparation for the application with the State Government throughout the course of the next year."

In closing, Mayor Bourke said that Council had some challenges to reach a point of sustainability into the future, and planning well for maintenance and operations of assets was critical.

"This budget delivers stability for the present and the vision for the long-term. It will ensure that we deliver the needs of the community in a responsible way. whilst building for a prosperous future. Community feedback has been consistently positive in respect to the investment made by the NSW Government and Federation Council since the merger of the former Corowa and Urana Shires. displaying to Council our communities desires to continue to further invest in the area to improve the liveability and provide economic stimulus to the region through the creation and ongoing maintenance of such assets. Council is committed to working with the community to sustain this type of growth for the betterment of Council's communities into the future and thanks all residents who took the opportunity to provide their feedback on the draft documents during the month of July."

COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM

Round one of the Federation Council 2020-2021 Community Grants Program is now open with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Council is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share in \$72,000 of funding for this year's second round of Community Grants Program.

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

- Category 1 Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

COUNCIL IMPLEMENTS NEW MEASURES AT SALEYARDS TO ENSURE ONGOING SAFETY

On Monday 27 July Federation Council tightened its entry criteria to the Corowa Saleyard Complex.

Temperature and cross border permit checks are now compulsory for all persons authorised to enter the complex.

Federation Council mayor Pat Bourke said the latest changes were another fine example of how Council continues to adapt to the many challenges COVID-19 presents.

"On any typical day the Corowa Saleyards would be bustling with agents, buyers and other key stakeholders," he said.

"From March this year, things have certainly been very different. Federation Council has been proactive from the beginning of the pandemic to ensure the sale can continue on a weekly basis and ensure sheep can continue to be delivered to the market."

Mayor Bourke said Controls have included limiting attendance to essential personnel only and enforcing state government restrictions in regards to social distancing and personal hygiene.

"The latest COVID-19 safety plan now includes temperature testing of everyone

in attendance and wearing of face masks mandatory for anyone coming from declared Melbourne hotspots," he said.

"Up to 40 per cent of stock comes from Victoria, however, transporters and essential personnel have been able to obtain border entry permits which has allowed the sale to continue."

While the number of livestock sold at the yards in the 2019-20 was down by more than 100,000 on the 12 months prior, the sale values are continuing to rise. The 674,304 head sold last financial year made \$123,682,743.90. In 2018-19 794,268 head fetched \$115,551,674.92.

Mayor Bourke said recent upgrades to the facility and strong management has ensured the saleyards is one of the most highly regarded and utilised livestock facilities in the state.

"The Corowa Saleyards is now considered the safest and best operated saleyards complex in the region, if not the state," he said.

"Our dedicated Council team, with the cooperation of all our authorised personnel have made this possible and is a credit to all involved. Council will continue to closely monitor the COVID-19 situation and will amend operating practices and procedures in accordance with any future Public Health directives."

COMMUNITY PIANO DONATION - EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

Federation Youth Council are calling for any community members, groups or venues that have a piano they wish to donate, for a further CommUNITY piano to be placed in a Federation Council town.

A CommUNITY Piano is a piano placed in the street which people passing by are encouraged to play. The concept originated quite by accident in Sheffield, England and is a world-wide phenomenon that the Federation Youth Council feel the area should be a part of. Street pianos are great not just for the music they bring, but are a powerful economic force, and act as a magnet for tourism. Even more important, they help educate and inspire, create a sense of shared ownership and responsibility, and stimulate creativity.

Concerned with the issue of inclusion and acceptance of young people, especially given current circumstances, the Federation Youth Council hope this is the catalyst for people to see each other, make conversation and come together without any prejudice.

Federation Council with Federation Youth Council are seeking piano/s that are:

- Lightweight and easy to transport.
- Made of Australian wood.
- Has been regularly tuned.

Council will coordinate the transportation of the piano and the restoration/decoration of the piano. Once donated the piano will become the property of Federation Council and placed all across the Council area, to encourage inclusion, creation and acceptance.

Federation Youth Council will be working closely with Council to ensure the piano is compliant to footpath regulations, is covered under Council's public liability insurance and ensure the use of the pianos is in line with current NSW state restrictions.

Completing an expression of interest (EOI) in no way means, Council is collecting your piano for use, until an inspection and written confirmation with receipt has been completed.

BROADLEAF HERBICIDE APPLICATIONS

Council wishes to advise that broadleaf herbicide applications will occur from mid August to mid October 2020 to all ovals, parks and recreation areas in the Federation Council area to selectively remove broadleaf weeds. The selective herbicide that will be used is Jolt (20g/l Cloryralid, 15g/l Diflufenican, 300g/l MCPA).

This process is to improve the turf density and quality which will also reduce mowing frequencies.

GUIDE TO THE CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

The NSW Office of the Children's Guardian has released the Guide to the Child Safe Standards.

This Guide has been designed to help all people working with children understand how their roles and responsibilities can make their organisation safer. It explains the rationale for each Standard and provides guidance on what organisations can do to implement the Child Safe Standards and measure success.

The Child Safe Standards recommended by the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse provide a framework so organisations can create cultures and adopt strategies to keep children safe from harm.

DROUGHT SUPPORT

The Federal Governments Drought Community Support Initiative (DCSI) Round 2 provides a one-off payment to farmers, farm workers and farm suppliers/contractors affected by the drought and living in an eligible Local Government Area (LGA) which includes Federation Council.

DCSI Round 2 is the second round of funding being provided by the Commonwealth Government under this initiative. In this round, there is \$30,000,000 of funding to be distributed to eligible households, through payments of \$3,000. Vinnies and The Salvation Army have been asked to distribute the funds.

Fox Baiting – Travelling Stock Reserves

Murray Local Land Services will be laying 1080 fox baits (chicken wingettes/red meat baits /lamb tongues / CPE units) on the following travelling stock reserves as part of the spring 2020 fox baiting program.

This program is aimed at reducing fox numbers to ensure the survival of livestock, ground-nesting birds and wildlife.

Baiting on the above reserves will be undertaken between Tuesday 1 September 2020 and Monday 30 November 2020.

RIVERINA REGIONAL LIBRARY - MOBILE SERVICE

The Mobile Library has returned to service with a COVID-19 Safety Plan in place for the protection and wellbeing of patrons.

To ensure compliance with physical distancing requirements, a maximum of 7 patrons will be permitted on the Mobile Library at any one time for a maximum of 10 minutes.




Think, Speak and act like christ





Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.
