COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM ROUND ONE 2021/2022

Round one of the Federation Council 2021-2022 Community Grants Program has opened on Monday, 9 August 2021, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share in \$60,000 of funding for this year's first round of the Community Grants Program. "The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

 Category 1 – Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.

- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for one-off projects through one of the nine focus categories:

- Arts And Culture;
- Events & Tourism;
- Community Work and Welfare;
- Skill Development and Learning;
- Health Promotion;
- Accessibility and Inclusion;
- Young People;
- Senior Residence; and
- Children and Families.

"We have a great guide available to all residents and organisations, that can assist with ensuring your application and initiatives are eligible for funding available through our website," Mayor Bourke said.

The Community Grants Program will continue to operate in two funding rounds each year, for funds to be distributed in October and April. Applications for Round One close 5pm, Friday 17 September 2021.

Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the October Ordinary Council meeting.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2021



The NSW Government has announced a new date for the Local Government Elections to occur. This has been set for Saturday, 4 December 2021. Local Government Minister Shelley Hancock said the decision has been made after extensive consultation with and on advice from the NSW Electoral Commission and NSW Health due to the COVID-19 situation.

Councillors are elected for a four year term, held on the second Saturday in September every four years. The postponement of 2020 Local Government elections to 4 December 2021, will not effect the schedule of subsequent council elections. After December 2021 elections, the next Local Government election will take place in September 2024. All residents are encouraged to check their enrolment details prior to the election date by calling the NSW Electoral Commission on 1300 135 736 or by visiting their website www.elections.nsw.gov.au

AQUA FIT COROWA AQUATIC CENTRE

Move, workout and have fun in the water are the common themes on offer during the Corowa Aquatic Centre's Aqua Fit classes.

For the month of August, members of the Corowa Aquatic Centre are encouraged to bring a friend to any one of our Aqua Fit classes – and their friend will receive 50% off their class price.

Two classes are on offer in the Aqua Fit program:

Aqua Movers: Suitable for beginners, a lower intensity aqua class in our indoor heated pool. Perfect for those with musklo-skeletal conditions.

Aqua Workout: This class is designed to improve flexibility, range of motion, strength, muscle tone and cardiovascular endurance while using the resistance of the water to cushion the feet, knees and back. Weights may be incorporated into the workout.

Both classes are undertaken in the indoor heated program pool. Class fees are \$16 for non-members, \$12 for concession holders and \$10 for members. Throughout the promotion period, classes for members' friends will be \$8.

Corowa Aquatic Centre's Duty Officer of Public Pools, Jo Laws said the aqua fit classes were attracting great numbers with 14-16 in each class consistently.

COROWA AQUATIC CENTRE LEARN TO SWIM PROGRAM ENROLMENT SUCCESS



Young swimmers from across the Federation region have jumped at the opportunity to grow their skills and confidence in the water.

The new Learn to Swim Program, set to commence at the Corowa Aquatic Centre in August has received over 200 enrolment enquiries which has resulted in 247 children set to participate in the program.

Classes will be offered every week on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays during the school terms.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said he was delighted in the response and looked forward to seeing the program begin.

"The team at the Corowa Aquatic Centre have been working diligently to deliver a fun and affordable Learn to Swim Program that will teach local children the life-long skill of swimming, so they can be comfortable, strong and happy in the water," he said. "Teaching your child or yourself to swim is one of the most important decisions you will make in life and our Corowa Aquatic Centre team is committed to promoting fun and enjoyment of all things water for swimmers of all abilities."

Swimming Assessments have begun to support class allocation which ranges from the 'Shrimp' class, for children aged 6-12 months to the 'Murray Cod' class which has a strong focus on advanced stroke correction.

Corowa Aquatic Centre's Duty Officer of Public Pools, Jo Laws said it was fantastic to see the excitement from children who had attended the centre for their swimming assessments.

"We cannot wait to start the program, and have been totally blown away by the response," she said.

"We already have some classes that are fully booked, with a waiting list and we are exploring other opportunities to increase the number of classes on offer. Our team looks forward to commencing lessons and partnering with local families to grow their children's skills and confidence in the water."

Lessons are \$16.00 per lesson, which includes the lesson and entry fee and for those children nominated on a family or child membership, they will be eligible for a discount on their lessons, which are priced at \$14.00.

Enrolments for the Learn to Swim Program are available from the Corowa Aquatic Centre website, and parents are encouraged to complete the online enrolment form, or alternatively, attend the Corowa Aquatic Centre to complete a paper based form.

RATES 2021-2022



Rates notices for the 2021-2022 financial year have now been issued.

Federation Council has adopted a new common rating structure for all properties across the Federation Council area. The new structure will apply from 1 July 2021.

Each property will be levied general rates using the following formula: Base rate of \$348 + ad valorem based on the value of the land and whether the property is farmland, residential or business. This change follows an extensive period of analysis and engagement in relation to available options for harmonising general rates across the Federation Council area. Council levies general rates on all properties across the Federation Council area. These funds contribute to the costs of delivering numerous services to the community. Under the new rating structure residential ratepayers will continue to contribute 49% of the total \$8.9m in general rates collected, with farmland ratepayers contributing 42% and business ratepayers contributing 9%.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT WEEK IN FEDERATION COUNCIL



Local Government Week offers the chance to reflect on the major role Federation Council plays in improving and maintaining our region as a place to live, work and visit.

The theme for this year's Local Government Week is 'Locally Led', highlighting the services in which Federation Council offers and hosts within the community to drive local economic recovery and community togetherness.

Federation Council Mayor, Councillor Patrick Bourke said many people know that Federation Council is responsible for local roads, rates and rubbish, but some are unaware of the many other services Council provides.

"We operate free local libraries in Corowa, Howlong and Mulwala, provide spaces for community groups, administer grants, maintain playgrounds and sporting fields to name a few," he said.

Federation Council has used this week to highlight some of the many services provided to the local community.

Locally led programs such as the Corowa Aquatic Centre's aqua fit programs, Federation Council's Community Grants Program, the Corowa Visitor Information Centre, North of the Murray tourism trails and some of the many community advisory committees such as Youth Council were also featured.

Mayor Bourke said Council also advocates for the interests of our community in planning matters and other issues that affect local liveability, sustainability, safety and amenity.

"Local Government Week, held from Monday, 2 August to Sunday, 8 August provides the perfect opportunity for residents to discover the important role that Local Government plays in their community and how they can become more involved in Council."

WORKS ON COROWA – MULWALA TRAIL PROGRESS



Works on the Corowa to Mulwala trail continue to make great progress, despite the challenges of consistent wet weather.

Federation Council is undertaking the Corowa to Mulwala Trail (CMT) and Foreshore Precincts project, which features the construction of a shared use trail linking the townships of Corowa and Mulwala. The combined projects provide an opportunity to encourage exploration along the Murray River and integrate towns and villages across the three LGAs, creating a strengthened interface with the Murray River.

The Corowa to Mulwala Trail is part of the Murray River Regional Experiences project which is a joint initiative of Albury City, Berrigan Shire and Federation Councils. The project aims to strengthen access to and connection with the Murray River for both residents and visitors. The councils are tasked with projects to improve infrastructure along 60 km of river frontage. Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said the trail development supports the objectives of the Corowa Mulwala Trail and Precincts Project Plan (May 2018), by growing and promoting opportunities for physical activity, building awareness and appreciation of the region's natural resources, and improving tourism opportunities.

"There are also opportunities to showcase the Indigenous connection to the region, involving Traditional Owners in the design and content of interpretive material," he said.

"Works continue to progress on the trail, with approximately 16,000 ton of gravel being delivered recently to two stock piles along the proposed route. 10km of the trail has already been completed and is now ready for seal."

Council has entered into a contract with Gradian Projects Pty Ltd to design and construct a 200m long boardwalk approximately 15km east of Mulwala, which is projected to be a major feature of the trail.

It is hoped that the trail will be open for cyclists and other multi-users in early 2022.

FEDERATION COUNCIL LAUNCHES NEW RESIDENT KIT



Federation Council is excited to launch its New Residents Kit to the public which provides people moving to the area with a range of information on Council, community services and facilities.

The New Resident Kit includes a coffee table size New Resident Guide that contains a wealth of information on the Federation Council Local Government area as a whole.

This guide will complement several other Council created directories such as the Ageing Well Resource and Family and Children Services Card that provides contact details for a number of local services, schools, sporting and community clubs.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council was pleased to add to its suite of Council created directories through the launch of the New Residents Kit.

"Often when you locate to a new area you don't always know things like what day does the bin go out, what do I need to do to register my pet or when is the local waste facility or library open," he said. "Council hopes this kit will support new residents that have moved to our region in their transition. Across the Council area there is such diverse experiences – from great food to the great outdoors, amazing public art, and cultural experiences for visitors and residents to enjoy."

To encourage people to discover what is available in their own backyards, Council has included a North of the Murray Official Visitor Guide, town maps and the Shearing of the Rams Trail.

Council is inviting interested local real estate agents and home builders to stock the kits and provide them to people interested in building here or when handing over the keys on the sale of a house. Alternatively, new residents to the Federation Council region can pick up a New Residents Kit from any Council Office or the Corowa Visitor Information Centre.

Mayor Bourke said Federation Council is committed to providing assistance where possible for new residents and businesses to make their move to area easy and stress free.

"We hope this New Resident Kits helps our newest residents to settle in, learn more about our wonderful Council area and allow more time to enjoy the local lifestyle."

MAJOR PACKAGE TO SUPPORT MICRO AND SMALL BUSINESS DURING LOCKDOWN



On July 13, the Australian and NSW Governments have announced new measures to support small businesses during the current NSW lockdown.

These include:

- Increased small business support payments of \$7,500 and \$10,500 or \$15,000, depending on the decline in business turnover
- A "JobSaver" employee retention scheme providing cashflow support to businesses to help them retain staff. The cash boost will be up to 40% of weekly payroll with a payment of between \$1,500 to a maximum of \$10,000 per week, provided staffing levels are maintained at the level as of 13 July 2021. Non-employing businesses are eligible for \$1,000 per week

- \$1,500 grants per fortnight for microbusinesses (annual turnover between \$30,000 and \$75,000) that have suffered at least a 30% decline in turnover.
- Payroll tax deferrals for all businesses and a 25% concession for medium-sized businesses that have suffered a 30% revenue decline
- A requirement on landlords to participate in mediation before taking actions to evict or lock out tenants
- Up to 100% land tax concessions for commercial landlords who provide rent relief
- A \$75 million support package for the performing arts sector to be administered by Create NSW
- A support package for the accommodation sector worth \$26 million
- An increase in the payment amount for stood down workers from \$500 to \$600 per week for those who lost more than 20 hours, and to \$375 for those who lost between 8 and 20 hours, and for it to be available to workers outside of the Greater Sydney lockdown areas
- Expanded mental health services with programs targeted at young people and CALD communities

HOWLONG INDUSTRIAL ESTATE & EXPORT PRE-CINCT OFFICIAL OPENING



On July 9, Federation Council and the Staughton Group were joined by the Honourable Sussan Ley, Member for Farrer, to officially open the Howlong Industrial Estate and Export Precinct project. This project has allowed for a new 16 lot Business Park Development, as an expansion to Howlong's Industrial Precinct, and in partnering with the Australian Government and the Staughton Group, the expansion and upgrade of the existing Staughton Group (CoolOff) manufacturing facility.

The location of the new Business Park provides easy and accessible transport links to major cities and regional centres along with offering extensive freight and transport services that offer fast and cost effective distribution options. The projects were made possible by funding from the Australian Government Building Better Regions Fund of \$6.759 million, \$6.589 million from the Staughton Group (CoolOff) and \$1.999 million funded by Federation Council, bringing to total combined project cost of \$15,347,415. Mayor Cr Pat Bourke and Federal Member for Farrer Ms Sussan Ley officially opened the precinct.

Mayor Cr Pat Bourke said, "Council is proud to provide a new 16 lot Business Park, totalling 8.5ha including water, sewer, power and telecommunications infrastructure."

"Federation Council fosters business development and expansion and this project makes very good business sense. With a vibrant economy, excellent transport linkages and accessibility, strong opportunities for growth and exceptional lifestyle choices, including fantastic community facilities, there are endless reasons to consider doing business in and relocating to this region."

"The Howlong Commercial precinct and Industrial Estate is a growing and thriving area and both have seen many new businesses establish, and existing businesses strengthen and expand, and we know this will continue in the coming years because of this project" he said. Mayor Bourke continued "This is a really important project for the Howlong and surrounding communities and one that Federation Council knows will attract significant business investment into the future. Projects like these, play such a major role in supporting our economy through job creation and driving economic development in the Federation Council and surrounding region.

Staughton Group Managing Director Mr Edward Staughton said, "The Howlong Industrial Export Precinct Project

has led to significant growth in Staughton Group domestic and export sales. The group turnover has increased by more than 62% since the commencement of the Project and export growth has been a major part of the growth in turnover. As a group, export sales in the year ended June 2020 made up 45% of overall sales with this set to grow by more than \$15m in the 2021 year."

"This project has provided an increase in Staughton Group warehousing capacity of 300%, which is now fully utilised as a result of the Building Better Regions Grant related," he said.

Federal Member for Farrer Ms Sussan Ley said, "In addition to attracting additional businesses to the region, this investment will produce longer-term economic benefits and diversification of the local economy."

The expansion of the Staughton Group facilities will create 149 jobs against an original target of 55 representing 170% of the original plan when the project was conceived. I am confident this project can help bring economic prosperity to Howlong and the surrounding region for many years to come," she said.

Mayor Cr Pat Bourke said, "Federation Council's business footprint includes small to medium sized enterprises ranging from tourism and hospitality to manufacturing and agriculture. Traditionally farming provides the main source of employment in the region, although this has evolved with the diversification of the economic base to include tourism and various other rural industries. We look forward to seeing lots sell in this new Business Park driving further economic development"

"lt was wonderful to have the attendance of our Federal Member for Farrer Ms Sussan Ley, along with some of my fellow Councillors, Deputy Mavor Cr Shaun Whitechurch and Cr David Longley. It was also great to have present at the opening Edward Staughton Managing Director of the Staughton Group, and Council's General Manager Adrian Butler, along with several other key staff members heavily involved in the project."

On behalf of the consortium, I would like to thank the Australian Government Building Better Regions Fund, Project Partner the Staughton Group, head major contractors including A P Delaney, & Co, Barry Leahy Engineering, VK Logic and the Project Management team at Council led by Robert Bon, for managing this project. This has been an amazing business and job growth initiative and Council looks forward to welcoming many new business into the future into this estate," he said.

FIREWOOD COLLECTION



Residents in the Federation Council area can apply to obtain a permit to collect firewood from road reserves for home heating during winter.

Firewood collection is limited to 1 April – 30 September each year.

To apply for a permit, residents must complete the application form and show proof that they reside in the Federation Council area (i.e. drivers licence). Applicants must certify on the application that they will abide by the permit conditions and acknowledge that Council is not liable for any injuries to person, or any loss or damage to property arising from the firewood collection activities. Applications received from outside the Federation Council area will not be considered.

Residents will need to apply for a permit each firewood season (each year).

The permit application fee is \$31.00.

The Public Exhibition of documents gives you the chance to formally have your say on important documents generated by Council, such as strategies, policies, development plans and planning information. Submissions received during the public exhibition period will be part of the report used by Council to inform decision making.

REGISTERING YOUR PET

Do you know that you are legally required to register your dog or cat? Alcohol and drug use not only affects people using the alcohol or drugs, but it also has an adverse impact on their family, friends, and their community.

A Busy Start to Term 3!

We are delighted to welcome 3 kindergarten transition children to Urana PS. Welcome Harvey Bell, Ema-Lee Graf and Seth Bennett!

However, COVID-19 has not stopped all the action and learning from happening with our school! The theme for science this term is "Marvelous Microorganisms" for Stage 3 students and "Watch it Grow" for Early Stage 1/Stage 1 students. The school has purchased a digital microscope, so students will be able to look very closely at tiny organisms on the big screen. The younger students are incubating fertile (hopefully) hen eggs and they will also be growing meal worms and studying the changes that happen during growth. During history lessons, students have commenced investigating a variety of celebrations and commemorations that are practiced around the world.

During English, Stage 3 students are jointly reading the book "18th Emergency" and have commenced writing their own texts on the themes of exciting emergencies (creative writing) and anti-bullying (persuasive writing). Micro-organisms

We have been doing experiments to understand the properties of yeast. Our first experiment was finding out what yeast needs to grow. Yeast is a living organism. It is sleeping when you buy it at the supermarket. You can buy it wet and dry. We found out you must keep it dry or cool so that it does not wake up before you want to use it. If it does wake up and it does not have the right conditions, it dies.

The first experiment showed us that yeast produces gas (carbon dioxide) when it is mixed with certain ingredients.

The ingredients for the gas are sugar, yeast and water. We had to predict what we thought would happen with the balloons. We were right saying that the yeast makes gas and the gas blows up the balloons. We found that the balloon will have gas in it even if the water is cold, but it only blows up a little bit.

Yesterday we were adding water at different temperatures, to find out what temperature the water should be to wake up the yeast and make it produce gas. We will look at the balloons today. We had to add cold water and warm water and hot water. We also had to add sugar.






