COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM ROUND ONE 2022/2023



Round one of the Federation Council 2022-2023 Community Grants Program will open on Monday 8 August 2022, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share in \$60,000 of funding for this year's first round of the Community Grants Program.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

- Category 1 Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for one-off projects through one of the nine focus categories:

- Arts And Culture:
- Events & Tourism;
- Community Work and Welfare;
- Skill Development and Learning;
- Health Promotion;
- Accessibility and Inclusion;
- Young People;
- Senior Residence; and
- Children and Families.

The Community Grants Program will continue to operate in two funding rounds each year, for funds to be distributed in October and April. Applications for Round One close 5pm, Friday 16 September 2022. Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the October Ordinary Council meeting.

SELECTIVE HERBICIDE APPLICATIONS

Selective Herbicide applications will occur from Monday 15 August to Monday 10 October 2022 to all Council ovals, parks, and open spaces This is an annual program to remove broadleaf weeds. This process reduces mowing frequencies and will improve turf density. The selective herbicide that will be used is Javelin (20g/l Clopyralid, 15g/l Diflufenican, 300g/l Mcpa).

CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE - JUNE 2022



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds, and roads across the Federation Council Region. The following activities were undertaken in June 2022 by Federation Council's Works teams.

- Corowa Mulwala Cycleway: Gravel pavement commenced on Spring Drive from Croppers Road to Enfield Street, Spring drive between Lee Valley Road and Stuckey's Road.
- East Street Howlong Watermain Works: commenced for 150mm watermain renewal from Hawkins Street and Golf Club Drive. Works include, potholing, identification and protection of underground services, trenching and laying of approx. 200m of new "Blue Brute" PVC pipe, underbore Golf Club Drive and East Street ready for interconnection with existing network. Early July – underbore Hawkins Street, interconnect with the current network and connect water services to the new main.
- Slashing Corowa Aerodrome: when possible as ground conditions make this difficult due to wet weather.

- Daysdale Curves Earthworks: gravel pavement, batter work and drainage over new culvert in culvert in Coreen Creek.
- School Zone Signage: Transport for NSW funded replacement of damaged and faded School Zone signage in Rand, Howlong, Corowa, South Corowa and Mulwala. Re-marking of "Dragons Teeth" and 40kmh symbols will be carried out in July.
- Howlong Landfill Works: conducted at Howlong landfill this month included items to improve compliance and rehabilitation of the site. One completed cell was covered and rehabilitated, the current cell was extended. old residual tyres and concrete waste was covered and rehabilitated, an old cell was topped up with covered material following subsidence over time. two litter fences were constructed to reduce windblow litter escaping the site and a hard stand was constructed so we can move the construction. and demolition waste area away from overhead power lines.
- Corowa Landfill Works: conducted at the Corowa landfill include: realigning the site layout in preparation for a new cell, 500m of road was constructed to allow safe vehicle access using recycled crushed concrete that is not suitable for use on public roads. The current cell was covered and compacted, and green waste shredding was booked in for a few weeks' time, and quotes were received for tyre, mattress and lounge shredding which will hopefully occur in a few weeks' time also.

- Cullivel Road Work: work on this project now completed for this financial year – will recommence at the end of winter.
- Maintenance Grading Program: Roads graded in June were Warmatta Road, Davey's Hill Road, Hanrahan's Road. Corowa urban streets

 Neil Street, Victoria Street, Murray Street, Brocklesby Street, Lucan Street. Mahonga Road
- Tabledrain Maintenance Tabledrain Maintenance in urban and rural drains, only in zones where no impact can be made on the Sloanes Froglet (between April and October breeding season).
- Sealed Roads Pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jetmaster patching truck.
- Customer Requests Numerous Customer Requests responded to for drainage, potholes, signs and tree clearances, however some were unable to be acted on due to budget constraints or staff numbers.

BILLABONG ANABRANCH BRIDGE

Council would like to inform the community of upcoming works on the Billabong Creek Anabranch Bridge, which will result in traffic diversions on Federation Way.

From Monday, July 25, motorists are advised that a one lane temporary bridge will be in operation alongside the current Billabong Creek Anabranch Bridge whilst works are underway. This

temporary bridge will be in place until November 2022, and will allow traffic to proceed along Federation Way whilst the new bridge is constructed.

Temporary Traffic Lights, as well as instructional signage will be in place to guide motorists. Council encourages motorists to take care and follow instructional signage.

Federation Council celebrated NAIDOC Week's 2022 "Get Up, Stand Up, Show Up" theme on Bangerang land.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said partnering this year with our indigenous community provided an opportunity for the community to celebrate and learn the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Aunty Iris Troutman, a Kooma, Kamilaroi and Ngarabal woman, and co-founder and CEO of Many Mobs hosted a fun clay Coolamon and Birrani making and decorating activity. All enjoyed warm Johnny Cakes on the brisk but sunny winter's morning in Bangerang Park. Iris provided an acknowledgement to Country and spoke of how indigenous people used natural resources to make carrying vessels for food and water, winnowing grains and cooking, and for cradling babies.

Darren 'Dozer' Atkinson presented a very

special library Storytime. Uncle Dozer played the didgeridoo and explained to the children how the different sounds gave a signal to the dancers to play their part. He then read the fantastic story 'Dooty and the Didgeridoo', about Aboriginal children staying strong in their culture. To finish up, the kids all had a chance to act in the story of the hunter who missed the kangaroo and made the kookaburra laugh, with lots of laughs all round!

Friday's puppet show provided fun for both young and old! Presented by Little Wings Puppets, 'The Owl's Apprentice', featuring a variety of Australian animals, kids were captured by the story and excited to make their very own puppets, while learning the Bangerang indigenous animal names and pronunciations, kindly provided by Bangerang leader, Darren "Dozer" Atkinson.

The National "Koori Kids" colouring in and story time competition was held, with opportunity for all school students and the community to be involved.

Council thanks the community for their support and all NAIDOC partners that ensured the NAIDOC Week celebration was the success that it was.

hunt of key sites like old railway turntable and old army storage bases, using compass directions and bearings to find their way.


