A 'Bushfire Place of Last Resort' also known as a 'Neighbourhood Safer Place' (NSP) is a place of last resort when all other bushfire plans have failed.

It may be at a local sports field, park, or it may be located within a community facility, such as a hall, community centre or school. It is important to know that NSPs are not always a building or structure — they can simply be a clearing that provides a level of protection from radiant heat.

COMMUNITY SATISFACTION SURVEY RESULTS



Federation Council is outperforming other NSW Regional Councils when it comes to customer satisfaction with Council's staff according to its recent Community Satisfaction Survey.

From Monday, August 10, Council undertook the new independent quantitative Community Satisfaction Survey project to determine the community's satisfaction, as well as the importance of Council's performance across its various service areas and facilities.

A telephone survey of 400 residents, along with an online survey, was conducted by IRIS Research on behalf of Federation Council. The best performing areas were sewerage and water services, waste management and maintain the appearance of public areas.

The objectives for the Customer Satisfaction Survey process were to:

 Measure and track the performance of Council in delivering services and facilities.

- Uncover Council's areas of improvement and priorities for the near future.
- Measure support for Council's proposed Special Rate Variation.
- Understand community perceptions regarding liveability and Council's customer services and communications.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said Council was pleased to receive the Community Satisfaction Survey report at the November Council meeting which highlighted many achievements in which Council and its communities should be proud of.

"The survey data has provided us with the community's perspective on our service delivery and performance over the past two years, and is a useful insight into where we should focus efforts to improve and meet changing community expectations," he said.

"As a new Council, it is important for us to connect with our community and understand the services and facilities they most appreciate and are most satisfied with, as well those that they may not be and would like Council to further invest in and focus on. This key survey work will now assist Council to plan towards a sustainable future, in line with community priorities and expectations."

NEW FREIGHT TRANSPORT PLAN TO KEEP OUR REGIONS MOVING



A new Regional Freight Transport Plan identifying key priority road infrastructure projects and strategies for completion has been developed for the southern Riverina and Murray areas of NSW.

In announcing the outlined strategies to coincide with Road Safety Week 2020, Riverina and Murray Joint Organisation (RAMJO) Chairperson Cr. Kevin Mack said this collaborative approach to transport planning will allow advocacy for further government funding opportunities to improve transport infrastructure within the region, also leading to safer roads and driving conditions.

"The capacity to run B-doubles and high-performance vehicles (HPV) on some of our rural road networks is still limited and more investment is needed to upgrade bridges and roads," Cr. Mack said

"The plan identifies corridors to facilitate the efficient and effective movement of

freight, outlines the development of integrated freight transport solutions, removes identified transport constraints and supports the growth and development of logistics solutions that improve freight movement."

Cr. Mack said that in developing the key priorities, a number of factors were considered, including the history of fatalities and injuries, the level of road use, the type of freight transported, impacts on local amenities and regional economic outcomes, and includes national and state roads, regional and local roads, railways and airports.

"Convening the development and implementation of the plan included extensive consultation process and the establishment of a sub-committee between RAMJO's 11 member councils, industry representatives and Transport for NSW. We are now looking forward to collaboratively seeking funding opportunities to enable the projects to get underway," Cr. Mack said.

During 2016, there was 482 million tonnes of freight moved within NSW. This is forecast to increase to 618 million tonnes of freight moved by 2036. Regional NSW's freight task is forecast to grow around 12 per cent by 2036, from 255 million to 286 million tonnes.

Cr. Mack said that whilst this forecasted growth will bring opportunities for the growth of logistics based enterprises such as the Ettamogah Rail Hub, WR Connect (Leeton), the Tocumwal intermodal facility, and inland

rail, it will add pressure for road and rail networks in the RAMJO region, which could hinder the establishment or expansion of industries and impact on further economic development in our council areas if projects are not funded.

"We believe it is important to reach our regional transport infrastructure improvement targets, especially as we are also currently seeing an increase in freight logistics in our agricultural sector on our local rural roads with grain harvest activity."

The next steps for RAMJO will be to review inland rail and improving air freight connections throughout its regional network.

RAMJO's member councils are Albury City Council, Berrigan Shire Council, Carrathool Shire Council, Edward River Council, Federation Council, Griffith City Council, Hay Shire Council, Leeton Shire Council, Murray River Council, Murrumbidgee Council and Narrandera Shire Council.

NATIONAL LIVESTOCK IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM CHANGES EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2021

Integrity Systems have advised there has been a number of important changes to the Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) National Vendor Declaration (NVD) effective 1 January 2021.

Only the current NVD Version 0720 and eNVD's will be accepted to process stock through a sale.

Any vendors/producers presenting with older NVD versions or eDECs must follow the Integrity Systems eNVD process or contact their helpdesk, prior to the start of the sale, otherwise their stock cannot be sold through saleyards and they will be turned away.

This change will be effective from the first sale at the Corowa Saleyards on Monday 4 January 2021.

"The Federation CDAT has attracted membership from across a range of areas including police, ambulance, health and counselling services, local community and Council," he said.

"Together we want the best for our community and are committed to reducing and preventing the harm caused by alcohol and other drugs."

The Alcohol and Drug Foundation, which manage the NSW Government funded Community Drug Action Teams, is committed to working closely with CDATs to ensure their activities are evidence based and that they are equipped with relevant resources to lead community projects.

"This is a fantastic opportunity for the Community Drug Action Team to strengthen its community," said the Alcohol and Drug Foundation's NSW/ ACT State Manager Dr Lisa Simone.

"Community Drug Action Teams help make grassroots changes in their own neighbourhoods, which promote healthy lifestyles and prevent and reduce harms caused by alcohol and other drugs," Dr Simone added.

COROWA AQUATIC CENTRE FEES & CHARGES & SPECIAL RATE VARIATION



Council undertook а significant community exercise in engagement 2016 to gain the community's view on a swimming pool for Corowa and what that could mean for a general rate increase. Securing additional State Government funding for the construction of the pool in 2018 enabled Council to deliver on the community's aspiration for the new swimming pool with a rate increase below the \$157 per annum 2016. originally proposed in With construction well advanced. Council is now looking forward to opening the Corowa Aquatic Centre in 2021.

Council is currently seeking feedback from the community on the proposed Corowa Aquatic Centre Fees and Charges and the associated Special Rate Variation. The Long Term Financial Plan adopted by Council in July 2020 included provision for a 6-8% general rate increase above the rate peg. With further planning undertaken on the operation of the new swimming pool, a schedule of user fees

and charges has been developed that is competitive with other similar facilities and limits the required increase to 6% above the rate peg (total increase 8%).

With Council having notified the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) of its intention to apply for a Special Rate Variation (SRV), Council intends to lodge their formal application, after seeking feedback from the community in February 2021.

GET READY FOR SUMMER: PREPARE AND PLAN EARLY FOR SEASONAL HAZARDS

Federation Council is encouraging families, friends and neighbours to use the start of summer as the start of a conversation about being aware of and prepared for seasonal hazards.

"Aussie summers are iconic. They can also be tragic," Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said.

"Each year, communities across NSW experience bush fires, home fires, floods, storms, heatwaves, power outages and other emergencies. The start of summer should be the start of a conversation around being prepared for the multiple hazards communities across NSW face."

Commissioner of Resilience NSW, Shane Fitzsimmons encouraged everyone to have a conversation around being prepared for emergency, whatever the hazard may be.

"Our emergency service organisations do an incredible job keeping us safe, but they can only do so much. Being aware and prepared is everyone's responsibility, whether you're at home, at work or away on holidays," Commissioner Fitzsimmons said.

"We want everyone to have safe and happy holidays. This year, that also means adapting our usual summer rituals to include COVID-Safe practice. Avoid crowded environments. Maintain physical distancing of 1.5m - about the length of a beach towel - and where physical distancing cannot be maintained, wear a mask. If you feel unwell, get tested and self-isolate."

Get Ready for summer now in five simple steps:

- Know your risk think about the area you're in and the types of disasters that could affect you;
- Plan now for what you will do sit down and talk with your family and plan for what you will do if a disaster affects your area;
- Get your home ready prepare your home by doing general home maintenance and checking your insurance coverage;
- Be aware find out how to prepare, what to do if there is a disaster in your area and connect with NSW emergency services to stay informed:

WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICE FOR CHRISTMAS & NEW YEAR



Federation Council wishes to advise residents and visitors that additional waste services will be implemented over the busy Christmas and New Year period to manage the influx of waste generated over this time.

Council will provide skips bins at the Mulwala Transfer Station from Thursday 24 December 2020 to the end of January 2021 as an additional service. The facility is located at Barooga Road, Mulwala and access to the skip bins will be available 24 hours a day for the purpose of disposing of domestic waste.

Information signage will be placed in key parks throughout Mulwala to advise and encourage residents and visitors to dispose of their waste in the skip bins located at the Mulwala Transfer Station.

Residents and visitors located in our northern communities can dispose of waste at the skip bins available in Urana at the Victoria Park Recreation ground and at Oaklands on the corner of

Thompson and Gunambil Street behind the Oaklands Recreation reserve.

The Corowa and Howlong Waste Facilities will be operating as per normal hours over the Christmas and New Year period.

Bins that are located in public parks and gardens across the Federation Council area will be emptied daily over the Christmas and New Year period.

The kerbside bin collection services for all towns will operate as usual over the Christmas and New Year period with residents reminded to place their bins out for collection the night prior.

Businesses are reminded that commercial waste is required to be disposed of at a waste facility. The additional services organised over the Christmas and New Year period are specifically for accommodating the additional domestic waste generated over the festive season.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said, "For the enjoyment of all visitors and residents, Council is requesting that waste is disposed of firstly in your kerbside bin and where required at your nearest Waste Facility or in town skip bin service."

"The additional service of providing skip bins at some locations has been organised to manage overflow domestic waste so it can be collected and disposed of away from spaces that are highly visible and used by our visitors and residents."

"We encourage residents to firstly take

advantage of the local Waste Facilities and make arrangements where possible to take their own rubbish away," he said.

Council wishes to remind residents and visitors that littering and illegal dumping in parks is prohibited. Penalties apply under the Section 632 Local Government Act 1993.

FUNDING GRANTS FOR WAR MEMORIAL REPAIR

New South Wales groups could share in \$125,000 to conserve the region's tributes to servicemen and servicewomen with round two of the Community War Memorials Fund opening on Remembrance Day.

Albury MP Justin Clancy said grants of up to \$10,000 are available for projects that repair, protect and conserve existing war memorials throughout NSW.

"We will always recognise the service and sacrifice of our locals because we are proud of our military history which helped build the strong region we call home today," Mr Clancy said.

"I encourage groups to take up the chance for this financial support for conservation projects which could be large scale or involve heritage work."

Funding is open for projects such as repairs to war memorial halls, conservation assessments, environmental or arborist advice, honour roll repair, or cleaning.

Organisations including memorial trusts, veteran groups and local councils can apply.

"Groups are advised to seek conservation advice before planning physical memorial work, unless the application is to engage a qualified specialist," Mr. Clancy said.

"These sites are often decades or more than a century old and should be maintained to the highest standard to recognise local veterans."

It's the second instalment of the annual program with \$125,000 distributed in round one earlier this year.

Acting Minister for Veterans Geoff Lee said the NSW Government is committed to honouring our veterans and their families.

"War memorials are a place for NSW communities to commemorate their service history, including past and present defence personnel and their families," Mr. Lee said.

"The NSW Government is proud to support projects that pay tribute to our veterans and ensure our strong Anzac legacy is taught for generations to come."

Below is the Urana LHAC Chairs report for 2020. A couple of updates that need to be noted. The "phantom" service plan is no longer quite such a phantom and I am due to be sent it by the 15th Dec. So it is on the way. Also our physio situation seems to have been resolved. Despite COVID it has still been a full year. So we now look forward to a more "normal" 2021 in so many ways.

End of Year Chairs Report. 25/11/2020

While we missed a lot of meetings this year, mostly due to COVID etc. it has still been busy in as much as the new "ZOOM" conferences with MLHD etc. and COAG meetings etc. Another of which we have coming up on the 7th of Dec.

While other larger communities LHAC's have seemingly concentrated on doing Cancer screening promotion and community interactions. It is a little different here in Urana. With our main "fight" being to hang onto what we have and push for what we need. To often small communities miss out and are overlooked by the department. With MLHD, often despite what their stated objective may be, are often Wagga centric and focused on the larger centres in the provision of care. Now while this may be ok for major things like surgery and specialists etc, day to day care, not just primary care but in community health and other allied health services needs to be provided in such a way that is accessible to those in the community that need it. Especially in Aged Care where people are more reliant on others to access any type of care and in children, where often early intervention is the key to making sure they get the best start in life and in education.

So that has been my focus as chair. Unfortunately this often means that I am involved in meetings etc. and am just reporting back to you. I would love to be able to involve the committee more in some of these things, but often it is chair invite only. I suppose they do this to help keep the numbers at these zoom or teleconferences down. The one we had earlier in the year was not a huge success as with over 70 people on the line, it just did not work.

Recently I took part in one of the department Strategic Planning sessions. Via Zoom. These do run a little easier, but often it is still hard to guess who is about to talk etc. But I guess it will get easier. However I, personally, look forward to the day when actual humans can sit in a meeting face to face again. We discussed the REACH publication and and what it is. Basically it is a way for people to initiate and possibly escalate concerns over the welfare or treatment of a family member / patient.

Why they referred to as "consumers" I do not not know. They are after all not buying a toaster, but submitting to medical treatment. It was productive, with Gayle taking lots of notes. One thing I can say for Gayle Murphy is that she does remember to involve those on line in the process and is I think genuinely interested in what is said. Discussion varied from local council involvement to mental health and provision of allied services and lack of accommodation for staff and so on. I am more than happy to discuss this with you at the meeting.

The situation in Community Health and the vacant RN position remains unresolved and as yet have had actual reply from the board. Only a letter from Gayle thanking me and stating Jill Ludford was on leave. As does, as far as I know the contract situation with Back on Track. The service plan is still just a phantom and our lack of input into COAG consultation remain an ongoing issue. But we will persist in the best interests of the Urana and surrounding district.

I would like to thank all of you for your participation this year. As such a year it has been. Thankyou to Karen our dedicated and intrepid manager for her stalwart support of our little MPS. Thank you to my "girl Friday" Sara for her support and work into our minutes etc. Also to the dedicated staff of the MPS for their care of patients and residents.

I believe we are lucky here, we have council involved not just in health but the LHAC as well. Our auxiliary is very dedicated to the "cause" and I believe it all goes to help us work together to support our communities and fight what what we know we need, not just what others think we should have. Growing more than just veggies

During terms 3 and 4 the Urana Public School students have been involved in a gardening project. Learning the ins and outs' of vegetable gardening during the favourable springtime months.

The project has been hugely successfully and has been run as part of the school's after school program. Our school chaplain Jono has taken care of the program throughout the year.
