"We need to check in on ourselves and be honest with how we feel. We can be too proud, embarressed or shy or don't want to burden others to ask for an ear or to seek the help that we need," said Mayor Pat Bourke.

Simply being honest with ourselves, something that we all find so difficult, actually makes such a big difference. It allows us to step forward onto a path

that provides the support and direction we need and ultimately one that can help to make a positive change for ourselves.

"What is the old saying, sharing our troubles is a problem halved".

If you are feeling like you may need help and support, or you have a friend or family member who does, local organisations have welcoming, understanding and caring people and services who are there to assist you, it just takes one phone call.

WHAT DOES IT FEEL LIKE TO JUMP OUT OF A PLANE AT 12,000 FEET?



That is the question that Leo Houlihan, Corowa resident was asked this week. Leo recently spent nine days in New Zealand on an adventure and did a tandem ski dive from 12,000 feet.

"It was amazing, such an adrenaline rush freefalling 6,500 feet in 60 seconds, before the parachute kicks in," said Leo.

Leo didn't stop there!

He swan-dived into a bungy jumped at 134 m at Nevis Bungy (the highest in NZ), falling for 8 seconds in a blitz of pure exhilaration before the bungee cord flung him back to reality. "I wasn't afraid," he said, "But, my legs did get a bit shaky as I walked out on the plank."

He did a tandem paraglide across Queenstown. An unbelievable and very peaceful experience Leo reported. You may have seen Leo walking along the paths in Corowa with his cane, high vis vest, and his support workers over the last few months, as he aimed to get fitter and lose some weight to enable him to fulfil this goal. Leo is vision impaired. Leo said that the paragliding and sky diving

operators were a bit worried about taking someone who is vision impaired, but after taking him were more than happy for Leo to come back anytime.

Leo said he would not have been able to do this adventure without the help of Karen Naylor and Julie Hayley who supported him in the lead-up to the trip, and he wanted to say thank you. Leo also wanted to express his thanks to Nikki Jones, and acknowledge how great a travel companion she was. Nikki accompanied Leo on the trip as a support worker.

On Saturday 3 December, we celebrate International Day of People with Disability (IDPwD) and acknowledge the 4.4 million Australians with disability. Join the conversation this IDPwD to help raise awareness, challenge perceptions, and break down barriers. Together we can make our community more accessible, equitable, and inclusive for people with disability.

Next step, Leo is hoping to head to the USA to jump off a horse and wrangle a cow in Texas! "I don't think I'll practice," said Leo. "Maybe just get to know the horse a bit." Leo is a valued member of Federation Council's Disability Access and Inclusion Committee.



FILMING COMMENCES ON MIKI/FEDERATION DOCUMENTARY



Filming has commenced for a documentary showcasing and celebrating Federation Council's long standing sister city relationship with Miki City in Japan.

Nomad Films Director Helen Newman recently returned from a week in Miki City, where she conducted interviews and filmed key people involved in the long-standing 25-year sister city exchange program between the two cities.

"Those I interviewed hold a passionate interest in the sister city program. By filming their stories at various locations in and around Miki City the documentary has been able to create a much more intimate glimpse into the rich, and sometimes life changing experiences this programme gives to its participants." Helen said.

"Travelling to Japan allowed us to capture the engaging, real history of individual stories that can often get missed in written history records."

Talana Lane, a member of the Federation Council Miki City Committee, travelled with Helen acting as translator, assisting with interviews and logistics. Talana was a Miki City exchange student and has kept her keen interest alive through the work of the volunteer Committee and Council.

"Being involved in the exchange program has had such a profound and positive impact on my life," she said.

"I have made some wonderful lifelong friendships, learnt in depth about a culture that is so different to our own and been able to support others to have the same opportunity to experience this amazing program."

Helen and Talana spent the week alongside Miki International's Kyoko Kawagoe, who organised the program and logistics for the filming. Kyoko has visited the Federation Council and has also played host to students and chaperones travelling to Miki City. It was her knowledge and connections that enabled the amazing interviews to take place.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said it was fantastic to hear that the documentary filming has commenced.

"I really look forward to seeing the completed documentary," he said.

"Our presence in Japan, taking such a genuine interest in the people, the culture and showing our value towards the sister city program has further enhanced the relationship Federation Council has with Miki City. This documentary is another fine example of that."

Federation Council was successful in securing funding under the Australia-Japan Foundation's International Relations Grants program for the development of the short documentary film and a memorabilia exhibition to be held in 2023, showcasing and celebrating the 25 year sister city relationship with Miki City.

During the past 25 years, it is estimated there have been over 140 exchange students involved in the sister city program, as well as additional chaperones and dignitaries and an array of memorabilia shared between the two countries.

The Australia-Japan Foundation International Relations Grants program supports initiatives that promote people to people links, a contemporary and positive image of Australia and support for the Australian Government's international policy goals.

The project will support the Foundation objectives by showcasing and further enhancing the connection between our communities that builds understanding, trust and influence.

CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE 2022

Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds, and roads across the Federation Council Region. The following activities were undertaken in October 2022 by Federation Council's Works teams.

- Morundah Flood Mitigation: Construction crews install culvert pipes to divert flood water around township.
- John-Street Drainage: The next stage of the project is the street reconstruction, which consists of further subgrade and pavement works. This is a major part of the project and requires fine weather to undertake the works. Occasionally, some of the work is required to be rescheduled due to unforeseen inclement weather. Due to the current and future forecasted weather conditions, Council has postponed the next stage of the works. The final stage of the project is bitumen sealing which is scheduled to occur shortly after completion of the street reconstruction works. Notices have been letter dropped to residents of the postponement.
- Corowa Mulwala Cycleway: On hold due to wet weather. Works to recommence in November on Cotton and River Street involving 20 lm of subgrade works for kerb and channel and storm water drainage works (weather permitting).
- Maintenance Grading Program: Lumeah Road, Annandale Road, Shiloh Road, Fontainebleau Road, Glenlea

Road, Williams Road, Tom Roberts Road (where possible). No tabledrain work done as drains are too wet for plant to work in.

- Gravel Resheeting Program Commenced: Waverley Road in progress, on hold due to water laying on road sections to be resheeted.
- Table drain Maintenance: Table drain Maintenance carried out in response to Customer Requests in urban and rural drains, only in zones where no impact can be made on the Sloanes Froglet (between April and October breeding season).
- Sealed Roads: Pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jetmaster patching truck.
- Customer Requests: Numerous Customer Requests responded to for drainage, potholes, signs and footpaths, however some were unable to be acted on due to lack of staff numbers or wet weather.
- Future Works Flood response/repairs: flood damage road patching, footpath maintenance/repairs, Table Drain maintenance and Various Customer Requests.

Heavy Trucks: Flood response, cart and spread gravel for Gravel Re-sheeting Program. Cart excess spoil to Corowa & Howlong Landfills for cover & capping. Carting of aggregate for patching trucks.

COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM



The Community Grants Program supports initiatives that deliver a range of social and economic benefits to communities across the Federation Council area. The program provides a more streamlined approach to supporting local community groups, organisations and clubs with delivering community projects and events.







URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.

The facility is closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Years Day, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
