

Bourkey's Brief

Dear Readers, welcome to the first Urana Newsletter for 2019.

Congratulations to all involved including Award winners and nominees and their friends and families who joined Council to celebrate Australia Day 2019 at Mulwala. It was great to see these many achievers including our school children be recognised for their efforts. Next years event is at Howlong and I am told planning is already commencing on that so that is sure to be another great event. For me personally it was great to look across the crowd and also mingle later with people from all across

Council area

Council road works continues to be a major focus across the Shire, and the recent announcement of around \$300,000 to continue to improve Clear Hills Road into Oaklands will be a great help. Federation Way North and South of Urana continues to benefit from major pavement renewals and reseals across many areas, whilst gravel re-sheeting is also occurring across some of our local roads and I have had many comments about this, so well done to our entire works staff. It is great to see the focus also on continuing to upgrade the Oaklands to Mulwala road(s), to ensure a safer wider and smoother surface for this important north-south connector.

Many of Councils major projects are planned to continue this year, with many at final stages of designs and approvals and engagement of contractors. The hold ups with some of the major projects have been frustrating to the staff, Councillors and the community I know, as we work through technical details and issues with some still, but I know across this year many will see works finally commencing.

It is great to see through the great work of Amber Harvey in our Community Development team, and no doubt many others, our seniors enjoying the fantastic events provided by Council to celebrate Seniors Week 2019. I saw many excited seniors leaving the Corowa Civic Centre on Tuesday, and also the Urana offices Wednesday to attend events, and this all concluded with the Seniors luncheon at the Howlong Golf Resort Bowling Club on Sunday. Council places great emphasis on our seniors and the annual event each year is just one small way we can express our thanks for all they do in our communities.

The February Council meeting saw Council receive reports across a wide range of functional areas. Our regional grouping of Council, Riverina Murray Joint Organisation (RAMJO) have endorsed the 4-year Statement of Strategic Regional Priorities 2018-2022 that will guide that organisation and its member Councils' strategic direction over the next 4 years. The plan has 6 key areas —

1) Improve Water Security 2) Improve Energy Security and Affordability 3) Improve Transport Connectivity for Freight and People 4) Improve Digital Connectivity 5) Better Match Health Services to our Changing Needs 6) Boost Industry, Workforce and Jobs.

Each of these areas will have steering advisory groups charged with developing plans and strategies to ensure progress is made in advancing the region in those critical facets. Federation Council was represented on area 6, and the Council also requested representation on areas 1 and 2.

Council also received a very detailed report showing progress to the end of December 2018 on the Merger Implementation Fund (\$5 mill) and the Stronger Community Fund (\$10 mill). I sincerely thank all staff and Councillors for their efforts in ensuring this funding is directed towards projects that continue to improve Federation Council as a business (internal projects) and as a community (external projects).

Council also resolved to support, as a current member, the Murray Darling Association (MDA) in seeking state and federal funding to allow the MDA to be further resourced and more effective in lobbying for Councils (local communities) on all aspects of the Murray Darling Basin. Council are actively lobbying both State and Federal politicians including those standing for election, to highlight the issues facing the community through the drought and the double whammy of zero water allocations for the Murray and a very low allocation for the Murrumbidgee. I encourage anyone else in the community either individually or as a group, to also make your voices and opinions and ideas known in the lead up to the state and federal elections, as we know, sometimes an individual voice delivered in the right method, carries as much or more weight than a Council or other lobby group.

Council also received a six monthly report on the Delivery Program 2018/2021 and it showed great progress by staff in advancing many actions, as well as dealing with the various diversions that get presented to Council along the way, and other challenges such as staffing resource shortages.

Council noted a report on the timelines proposed for adopting the 2019/2020 Operational Plan including budget. Councillors had previously expressed a wish to undertake bus tours for those who are available, and this was confirmed to inform the Councillors of works proposed across the 2019/20 budget. Councillors will also get to visit some of the many community facilities across the area, which is very important when at other times, reports are presented on these matters. Community budget exhibitions will also be held whilst the budget is on exhibition.

A very comprehensive report was presented on the Food Regulation Partnership and Council's activities across this area, and it is great to see the food businesses have a high level of compliance to ensure safe food for all.

Policies adopted were the Financial Assistance Policy, Fraud & Corruption Policy and Chain of Responsibility Policy. Policies and plans endorsed for exhibition/consultation included the Compliance and Enforcement Policy, Engineering Guidelines for Subdivision and Development Standards Manual, Companion Animals Management Plan, Local Orders Policy - Keeping of Animals/Birds.

Many closed session reports were presented including updated reports on the Mulwala Industrial Subdivision - Stage 6 (Final Stage) - Pricing Strategy for Sale of Land; Corowa Aerodrome Agreement to Lease; Howlong Industrial & Export Precinct. Many other closed session reports resulted in accepting tenders to enable contracts to be executed, including for Drill, Blast and Crush Service at Council's Hard-Rock Quarries; Plant Dry Hire; Supply of Quarry Products; and the Replacement of a Heavy Tipper.

COUNCIL CELEBRATES AUSTRALIA DAY IN MULWALA

Residents, friends, family and visitors celebrated everything that's great about living in Australia at this years Federation Council Australia Day celebrations.

A crowd of more than 300 people were joined by Australia Day Ambassador Jeremy Jones AM, Federation Council and the Mulwala Progress Association to participate in festivities at the Mulwala Water Ski Club on January 26.

Jeremy Jones AM delivered an inspirational address, speaking about his experiences and views on the importance of multiculturalism and conflict resolution.

Mr Jones was the 2016 winner of the NSW Government's Stepan Kerkyasharian Medal for promoting Community Harmony, the winner of the 2007 Australian Human Rights Medal, is a Member of the Order of Australia (conferred in 2005) and has participated in dialogues and conferences on human rights issues in 30 countries. A fifth-generation Australian, he is a graduate of the University of Sydney, majoring in History and Government.

A member of the NSW Police Commissioner's Multicultural Advisory Council, he was awarded the FECCA Medal for his contribution to Multiculturalism in 2004 and made Honorary Life Member of the Executive Council of Australian Jewry in 2006 (having served as its President from 2001-2004). He was a People of Australia Ambassador (for the full life of that program).

Mr Jones said it was a privilege to join the Federation community as their Australia Day Ambassador and described the Federation story as "truly unique".

In his welcome address, Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said each year Australia Day provides us with a day to reflect on what it means to be Australian, to celebrate contemporary Australia and to acknowledge our history.

"On Australia Day we celebrate all the things we love about Australia; land, sense of fair go, lifestyle, democracy, the freedoms we enjoy, and particularly our people," he said.

"Today we celebrate our people, the people of Federation Council who go above and beyond in their respective areas to ensure our communities thrive and grow. Our nominees are very special people, whose donation of time and effort warrants this type of special celebration. The commitment to our communities shown by our nominees is truly heart-warming, and these people along with many others throughout the Federation Council region make me so proud to be Mayor of this great shire."

STABILISING WORK TO SOME CEMETERY MONUMENTS

IN FEDERATION COUNCIL

As part of Council's heritage program, stabilisation work to burial monuments at two of council's historic cemeteries (Urana and Corowa Pioneer Cemetery) will be carried out over the April to May period.

An inspection by Council's heritage adviser revealed that monuments at Corowa's Pioneer Cemetery had been vandalised and some recently installed monuments at Urana had collapsed.

This emergency work will only stabilise several monuments that are in immediate threat of collapse or disintegration.

Community Defibrillator News

In August 2018 the Oaklands Recreation Ground Committee realised that the "use by" date on the pads for the community defibrillator was upon us. The community defibrillator is located at the Oaklands Rural Fire Brigade shed for many years.

The Committee realised the pads needed to be replaced immediately. The pads cost \$307.00. The committee sought funding from a grant program offered by Charles Sturt University. An application was made to Charles Sturt University Community University partnerships (CUP) Head of Campus (HOC) Small Grants Fund. The grant application was successful and the funding received in December 2018. The pads in the defibrillator have been replaced and the defibrillator is situated in its own box situated on the side of the Oaklands Rural Fire Brigade building.

Please make yourself aware of its location as you never know when you may need to access it. (Note: no key required). It is well documented that early defibrillation in the event of a cardiac arrest can improve the chances of surviving a heart attack.

The Oaklands Recreation Ground Committee would sincerely like to thank Charles Sturt University CUP HOC Grants Program for supporting rural and regional communities such as ours so we may continue to have access to programs and assets vital for our growth, health and sustainability.

HOW TO SEEK MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT

People often don't know where to start to get the mental health services they need.

Your local GP or other health professionals can help connect you with the right mental health service, says Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD).

"Seeking help is often the first step towards getting and staying well, but it can be hard to know how to start or where to turn," said District Community Mental Health and Drug & Alcohol Manager Alison Thorne.

"It's common to feel unsure and to wonder whether you should try to handle things on your own. It is always ok to ask for help – even if you're not sure you are experiencing a specific mental health problem.

You might want to seek help if you're:

- · worrying more than usual
- finding it hard to enjoy your life
- having thoughts and feelings that are difficult to cope with, which have an impact on your day-to-day life
- interested to find more support or treatment.
- Worried about someone that you live with or care for

Anyone in distress who presents at a hospital Emergency Department (ED) in MLHD has access to timely mental health assessment via the Mental Health Emergency Consultation Service (MHECS).

MHECS operates out of Wagga Wagga and skilled mental health clinicians provide mental health assessments to people in all EDs across MLHD via videoconference.

Once assessed, the clinician consults with the on-call psychiatrist about the person's ongoing needs.

According to their level of risk, the person might need admission to an Acute Mental Health Inpatient Unit (usually Wagga Wagga), admission to the local hospital for a short stay for support and stabilisation, referral to the relevant Community Mental Health team or referral to the person's GP.

MLHD Community Mental Health Drug and Alcohol teams operate an outreach service to all smaller towns across the District. There are six Community Mental Health Drug and Alcohol teams across MLHD – Wagga Wagga, Griffith, Deniliquin, Temora, Young and Tumut - who operate outreach services to all communities.

These teams provide regular visits and includes services across the lifespan, including Specialist Child and Adolescent, Adult and Older Persons clinicians.

Referrals to Community Mental Health services can be made via Accessline 1800 800 944.

Accessline provides 24 hour/7 day per week support, advice and referral to mental health and drug and alcohol services for people anywhere within MLHD.

"Anyone with a mental health issue can use Accessline to speak with a mental health professional and be directed to the right care for them," Alison said.

Carers, other health professionals and emergency workers can also use Accessline for advice about a person's clinical symptoms, the urgency of the need for care and local treatment options.

If you or someone you care about has a mental health or drug or alcohol problem and you would like to talk to someone, call Accessline on freecall 1800 800 944.

Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network (MPHN) CEO Melissa Neal said that with funding from the Australian Government MPHN commission a variety of mental health services throughout the Murrumbidgee region, which address community needs and the level of care and support individuals may require. All services commissioned by MPHN are free to access.

"We are committed to ensuring people receive the right services at the right time and in the right place, therefore we commission services within a stepped care approach.

"In a stepped care approach, a person seeking support is connected to the services that meet their needs and as their needs change, the services change with them," Ms Neal said.

Health Information

Ms Neal said services available include the low intensity program, NewAccess, and moderate to high intensity programs, such as Strong Minds and Well Connected.

In addition, there are telehealth funded services – Connect and Connect for Kids – and local GPs have access to the GP Psychiatry Support Line, which provides support in psychiatric presentations in general practice.

"Suicide prevention is vital. We fund both the Wagga Wagga and Griffith headspace centres, The Way Back Support service, and suicide prevention training – particularly QPR (Question Refer Persuade) online training.

"There are some great online resources including the websites <u>Head to Health</u> and <u>Healthdirect</u>.

"More information about services available across the region and a factsheet is available on our website (mphn.org.au)," Ms Neal said.

Early intervention plays a key role in mental health care which is why the NSW Government is working with its agencies, Commonwealth and local governments, and community organisations to deliver suicide prevention initiatives.

Recently the NSW Government announced \$90 million over the next three years will be invested in a first of its kind Strategic Framework for Suicide Prevention in NSW.

The framework will bring a greater focus on building community wellbeing to avoid entering suicidal crises and provide the fundamental principles of suicide prevention to help communities develop essential strategies that meet their own local health care needs.

It's expected initiatives from the Framework will have the biggest impact on suicide in NSW the State has ever seen and will ensure we reduce the number of lives lost to suicide in NSW.

These initiatives will be delivered across NSW, including in MLHD.

In this year's State Budget people living with mental illness, their families and carers will benefit from a record investment of \$2.1 billion in mental health services and infrastructure.
