COUNCIL CELEBRATES AUSTRALIA DAY

Residents. friends. family and visitors celebrated everything that's great about living in Australia at this year's Federation Council Australia Dav celebrations. A crowd of more than 200 people were joined by Member for Albury Justin Clancy, Federation Council representatives and the Urana Community Group to participate in festivities at the Aguatic Centre in Urana on January 26.

Robert (Bob) Fitzgerald is the Chief Inspector of the Blacktown Police Area Command delivered an inspirational address via video link, speaking about his extensive career in the police force for over 30 years.

His current portfolios include mental health, Aboriginal issues and multicultural community engagement. Chief Inspector Fitzgerald moved to Western Sydney in the 1970's and was in the first intake of bricklayers at Mount Druitt TAFE. After completing his apprenticeship, he worked in the local area and later joined the NSW Police Force in the 1980's. He has since served at a number of stations including Redfern, Kings Cross, St Mary's, Cabramatta, Olympic Security Command Blacktown, Rose Bay and Mount Druitt. Chief Inspector Fitzgerald is a passionate advocate for Western Sydney and is actively involved in helping the local community both on and off duty. He is a strong promoter of multiculturalism and serves as the Chair of the Board of SvdWest Multicultural Services, a leading organisation for all

cultural diversity issues responding to community need and opportunities to refugees and humanitarian entrants.

In his welcome address, Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said each year Australia Day provides us with a day to reflect on what it means to be Australian, to celebrate contemporary Australia and to acknowledge our history. "On Australia Day we celebrate all the things we love about Australia; land, sense of fair go, lifestyle, democracy, the freedoms we enjoy, and particularly our people," he said.

COUNCIL VOTE TO APPLY FOR SPECIAL RATE VARIATION



At an extraordinary meeting on Tuesday, Federation Council voted unanimously to submit the Corowa Aquatic Centre Special Rate Variation Application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for determination.

Based on the extensive feedback, Council Officers recommended that the 2021/22 rate peg of 2% be applied based on the value of land, and the Special Variation of 6% be applied evenly to each property in the Federation Council area. This results in an increase to average residential rates of \$1.26 per week to go towards the operation costs of the new aquatic facility. Following the proposed change, average residential rates in Federation will remain in the lowest 20% in the state.

Council adopted a schedule of fees and charges for Corowa pool users at the January Council meeting, with a view to setting them at a level that will encourage visitation and will be affordable for all local families throughout the wider region.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said the decision to submit the rate variation application was one that no Councillor took lightly.

Applying for a Special Rate Variation was a key component of Council's Long Term Financial Plan that was adopted by Council in July 2020.

Mayor Bourke said the Council was completing extensive work to ensure the Council had a financially sustainable future, whilst still allowing communities to grow and prosper and meet ratepayer's service expectations.

Council's application will now be submitted to IPART for determination with rate payers having the opportunity to have their say on the application directly to IPART before a final decision is made in May 2021.

Two community meetings are also scheduled to occur in late February to provide Council and the community the opportunity to engage on the Special Rate Variation Application Process and gain a further understanding of the Corowa Aquatic Centre and its planned operations.

Should the application be approved, the increase would be applied to Council's 2021/2022 first quarterly rates instalment due in July this year.

TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE – DOCTORS ROAD OAKLANDS



Federation Council wishes to advise that Doctors Road, Oaklands will be temporarily closed to all traffic for the replacement of Doctors Road Bridge, 3.7km North of Clear Hills Road intersection from March to May 2021.

The existing narrow single lane deteriorated timber bridge is being replaced with a new wide, two lane concrete and steel modular bridge. The new bridge on the same alignment as the existing bridge will require the temporary closure of Doctors Road to all traffic. Alternative detour via Federation Way is suggested.

LED STREETLIGHT UPGRADE PROJECT

Work to upgrade more than 1490 streetlights to energy efficient technology will begin this week as part of a major energy efficiency project that will save

hundreds of thousands in electricity bills and reduce greenhouse gas emissions for the ratepayers of Federation Council.

The switch to LED technology will see a 329 MWh per year reduction in power use, delivering savings of approximately \$102,000 each year in maintenance and electricity costs.

COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM



Round two of the Federation Council 2020-2021 Community Grants Program opened on Monday 8 February, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Council is encouraging not-forprofit groups and organizations to apply for funding in this year's second round of the Community Grants Program.

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

- Category 1 Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

PORTABLE SPEEDBOARD

Federation Council's solar powered portable speed board is currently located in Urana.

The board provides real-time feedback to motorists of their vehicle speed and a reminder of the appropriate speed for the road they are travelling on.

Speed is the biggest contributing factor to injury and fatality crashes on New South Wales roads with 29% of injury and fatality crashes in the Federation Council area involving speed.

CAPITAL WORKS PROJECT UPDATE



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region.

The following activities were undertaken within the month of January 2021 by Federation Council's Works teams.

RATES ADVISORY COMMITTEE EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST



Federation Council is required to implement a new harmonised rating system by 1 July 2021. This follows the merger of Corowa and Urana Shire Councils and a four year period of continuing to levy rates in accordance with the structures adopted by each former Council for properties in each former Council area.

The focus over the past two years has been on improving financial management practices with a more robust budget and financial reporting framework. There is further work to be undertaken on Council's financial sustainability, with new community assets becoming operational and opportunities for improvements in Council's asset management practices. This work has commenced and will continue over coming financial years.

To assist Council to obtain views from across the Federation Council area, it is proposed to establish a Rate Advisory Committee.

The purpose of the Rates Advisory Committee would include:

- Provide input into the harmonised general rating structure due to take effect on 1 July 2021;
- Consider opportunities to make improvements to the general fund rating structure for 2022/23 and 2023/24; and
- Provide input into any future Special Rate Variations.

A Terms of Reference for the Committee will be developed in conjunction with Committee members.

It is recommended that the Committee contain representation from across the Federation Council area and across rating categories. This could include:

Up to 3 representatives from each quadrant of the Council area:

- North (former Urana Council area);
- South (Corowa and surrounds);
- East (Mulwala and surrounds); and
- West (Howlong and surrounds).

At least two rating categories (residential, farmland, business) be represented in each quadrant.

THE LOCAL SPORT DEFIBRILLATOR GRANT PROGRAM IS NOW OPEN

The Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program provides NSW sports clubs and councils the opportunity to acquire an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) package for their club or sports club or sports facility at a reduced cost.

Up to \$1 million in grants is available to eligible sporting clubs and facility owners to purchase and maintain AEDs.

An AED package will include:

- An AED
- AED familiarisation instruction
- A minimum of six years of essential AED maintenance

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
