Hello readers, and welcome to the July edition of the Urana District Newsletter.

It has been another busy time since I last reported in, with the adoption of our new Community Strategic Plan and Delivery Program and Operating Plan and budgets, at the June Council meeting. Council has worked really hard to ensure there is a spread of projects across the whole area, as well as maintaining all of the services and assets that the community enjoys.

As shown on the front cover, a real highlight of this month's Council meeting, was having Uncle Freddy Dowling, from the Bangerang tribe, Welcome to Country at the start of the Council meeting. Uncle Freddy was joined by other members from the group Many Mobs, and at morning tea, presented a very informative session on the formation of the areas that define the boundaries for each tribe in this area. This was a part of the celebration of NAIDOC Week, and Council is really appreciative of this kind gesture. Council was also thrilled to receive two new books detailing aboriginal history signed by Uncle Freddy, at the meeting. Council considers its relationship with the traditional custodians of the land in which we meet very significant and to have them attend our meeting and officially open it was fantastic.

I hope the school holiday period was an enjoyable time for local families and I am pleased to report that Council's school holiday youth and library program was a great success. In Urana and Oaklands, Council hosted a pom pom monster workshop and I have heard rave reviews from Staff and local children who participated. The Federation Rocks initiative is another program that has created much excitement from local children from Mulwala to Morundah, and everywhere in between and Council has been inundated with great pictures highlighting local finds. So well done all.

Council received a report at the July meeting, on the Federation Economic Development Action Plan 2018 – 2022, and this contains the work undertaken across the Council over recent years in engaging with the local smaller communities on their projects, plans and aspirations for the future. Shortly these communities will be consulted on the findings of what Council was told was the priorities, based on workshops and meetings. Once agreed and adopted as final, they will be a great help not only for committees such as Progress and Town Improvement groups in each area, but also for staff in managing projects and helping to develop others in these areas.

Council adopts Integrated Planning and Reporting Documents



Federation Council has adopted its Integrated Planning and Reporting (IP&R) suite of documents, including an overall budget of \$75M for 2018/19.

Mayor Pat Bourke said adoption of the planning and reporting documents has involved a significant journey for Federation Council and its communities.

"The IP&R documents are the first for our new Council and is the framework that Council will use to work towards achieving the community's vision," Mayor Bourke said.

"Our residents told us their vision for the future in the Federation Council Our Community – Our Opportunity Strategic Plan 2028, and the suite of Integrated Planning and Reporting documents we have just adopted lays out how we will work towards those goals."

The Community Strategic Plan key outcomes to be focused on over the next 10 years include a recharged focus on -

- Built Federation: Maintained and improved infrastructure that meets the needs of residents and industry;
- Economic Federation: Growing, progressive and prosperous communities that build on sustainable manufacturing, agriculture and tourism, close proximity to other centres on both sides of the Murray and affordability;
- 3. Natural Federation: Sustainable rural landscapes and waterways offering tranquillity and attractive recreational spaces;
- 4. Social Federation: Close-knit and welcoming communities where people come together and support each other;
- Well-Governed Federation: Strong civic leadership and governance supporting equity across communities and effective communication with residents.

Mayor Bourke said the coming 12 months in particular was an

important time for Federation as Council looks to continue to deliver major projects that will define the future growth of the region.

"Roads and economic development were the two strong standouts from the most recent community consultation," he said.

"Council's budget is aimed to deliver strongly on those aspects."

A number of key projects and initiatives as highlighted in this year's Delivery Program include:

- Corowa Swimming Pool complex redevelopment.
- Howlong Pre-school extension.
- Howlong and Corowa Skate Parks.
- Implementation of a Youth Council (recently formed).
- Lions Park boat ramp Corowa.
- Mulwala all-abilities playground.
- Owens Bridges reserve and Boat ramp upgrade Mulwala.
- Purtle Park Adventure Playground and Park upgrades Mulwala.
- Continued improvements to our roads network will include:
- Federation Way, (a key arterial route through the Council area).
- The freight network around Boree Creek.
- Continued widening, sealing and rehabilitation on Bull Plain Road.
- On-going bitumen re-seals and patching programs, and gravel resheeting and unsealed roads maintenance.

"Council plans and policies are inter-connected and do not exist in isolation. Our Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework allows Council to bring its various plans together and to prepare holistically and sustainably for the future," Mayor Bourke said.

"We are very proud of the history and beauty of our towns and this event is a great opportunity to celebrate that.' said the Mayor."


Federation Council and Destination Rutherglen have

Council has launched the much anticipated new public mapping system, IntraMaps!

Intramaps is a user friendly online information portal containing interactive mapping, and spatial and business data for the general public.

Residents can now access interactive maps, details about services and facilities, planning and zoning information, parcels, underground assets, aerial imagery and explore local topographical information. Search and query functions are also available.

Mayor Pat Bourke said the IntraMaps tool is a big step forward in technological capabilities for the community and will allow Council to provide essential information and timely updates to residents.

Responsibilities to our companion animals

Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Council works hard to communicate with local pet owners regarding these responsibilities, keeping both our furry friends and our community safe.

Responsibilities of pet owners

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area. Fines may apply if your dog is found to be not adequately leashed in a public place.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under the effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Greyhounds must be muzzled at all times when in a public place.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

Microchipping and pet registration

Microchipping and registration is a two part process that requires dog and cat owners to:

- 1. Have their dog or cat implanted with a microchip from the time they are 12 weeks of age, at point of sale or change of ownership (whichever occurs first)
- 2. Register their animals with their NSW local council by 6 months of age.

Both the microchipping and registration of your dog or cat include a one-off fee and are for the life of the animal.

\$4.6 million up for grabs for local sports grant

Local sporting groups are being encouraged to apply for the latest round of funding under the NSW Government's Local Sport Grant Program.

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin said \$4.6 million was now available across the state for upgrading or creating new sports facilities, new sport programs, community events and projects that improve sports participation.

"Sport is a vital part of our community and I encourage all clubs and councils to apply," Mr Aplin said.

"Thousands of local clubs can apply for up to \$25,000 to fund individual initiatives, with up to \$50,000 set aside for every state electorate."

Sports Minister Stuart Ayres said the Local Sport Grant Program is now in its fourth year.

"It is a key priority of the NSW Government that everyone has the opportunity to take part in local sport or has access to open space," Mr Ayres said.

"Already this year, the Local Sport Grant Program has allocated funding for sports clubs in 93 electorates across the state and we anticipate this next round of funding will help hundreds more community groups and councils.

"This announcement is in addition to the NSW Government's \$290 million Open Spaces and Green Sydney package, along with the Active Kids program announced earlier this year. It also comes on top of \$200 million that has been committed to improving sporting facilities in regional NSW."

The Local Sports Grant Program opens today and will accept applications until 24 August 2018.

FURTHER FUNDING FOR NATION-LEADING QUAD BIKE SAFETY PROGRAM

Farmers will be safer at work on their properties thanks to a further investment in the NSW Government's Quad Bike Safety Improvement Program, Minister for Better Regulation Matt Kean said.

Mr Kean said the Government had decided to increase its investment in quad bike safety to a total of \$3.7 million.

"NSW continues to lead the way when it comes to quad bike safety, with the latest funds ramping up rebates and training for farmers across the state," Mr Kean said.

"Quad bikes are one of the biggest killers on our farms. In fact, according to AgHealth Australia there have been 240 deaths as a result of quad bikes across Australia, since 2001.

"Today's funding means we can continue to work with farmers to help ensure that when they head off to work in the morning, they return home safely to their family each night."

The state-wide program offers two rebates, worth up to \$1,000 each, to replace your existing quad bike or have it fitted with safety equipment like roll bars, as well as free accredited quad bike training with Tocal College.

Since launching in July 2016, the program has also:

- Issued almost \$1.6 million worth of quad bike safety rebates, resulting in a \$21 million total investment from farmers in overall farm safety improvements; and,
- Ensured more than 850 farmers and farm workers have completed accredited training, with funding for an additional 100 courses set aside in 2018/19.

Minister for Primary Industries Niall Blair said the Government was committed to improving quad bike safety across NSW.

"We know quad bikes are an essential part of farming across NSW but we want to make sure we continue to find ways to reduce risk and save lives," Mr Blair said.

"It is only through Government, industry and farmers working together that we will reduce deaths and injuries from the use of quad bikes, and this funding will help do just that."

ATTENTION ARTS AND CULTURE GROUPS: FUNDING UP FOR GRABS

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin today urged our local arts and culture organisations to get applications in to secure their share of a new \$47 million round of funding as part of the NSW Government's Regional Cultural Fund (RCF).

Mr Aplin said applications from Councils, as well as arts, screen and culture organisations are being invited from 1 July, and will close on 21 September 2018. "This is a fund which has the potential to totally transform the arts and culture scene

not only locally but across the entirety of regional NSW," Mr Aplin said.

"This \$47 million funding pool comes on top of the \$48 million which was already allocated to projects as part of round one of the fund.

"As part of round one, Albury saw projects like the PumpHouse Creative Enterprise Project and the Flying Fruit Fly Circus secure over \$1.3m in funding to create art spaces and enhance current facilities.

"Now, as part of round two, with an additional \$47 million available for regional areas, we have a further chance to secure even more financial support for our local arts and culture sector. This already includes \$5m for regional library infrastructure projects" Mr Aplin said.

Deputy Premier and Minister for Regional NSW John Barilaro said the second round of funding was available for infrastructure and redevelopment projects ranging from major new exhibition and performing arts spaces, through to refurbishment of libraries, theatres and museums and smaller, grass-roots community projects.

"Having grown up and raised a family in a regional area, I know how important arts and culture is to our regional and remote areas," Mr Barilaro said.

"As I travelled the state to announce projects funded under round one, I saw first-hand just how much our arts and culture communities appreciated the support.

"As Minister for Regional NSW, I want people to look to our regional areas, and think 'I could have a great life there', and as a government we know that a diverse and vibrant arts and culture scene is key to achieving that," he said.

Arts Minister Don Harwin said the fund was established to ensure regional NSW received its fair share of arts and cultural infrastructure - providing recreational and educational benefits as well as increased cultural tourism.

"During recent visits to regions receiving RCF grants, I've seen how important nurturing a vibrant cultural life is for local communities, and just how much they value these grants," Mr Harwin said.

"Arts, screen and culture is at the heart of every regional community. The success of our recent first round of funding shows the Government's commitment to driving growth in arts, screen, culture and heritage in regional NSW is making a difference. I am confident that the second round will go even further to show this."

40km/h school zones

40km/h school zones slow traffic on the roads around schools. This is to help protect children on their way to and from schools at the times and places where they are often in high numbers. Most 40km/h school zones operate between 8.00am and 9.30am and from 2.30pm until 4.00pm. The 40km/h school zone speed limit must be observed even if school children cannot be seen.

A 40km/h school zone operates on all notified school days including staff development days (student-free days). While some schools may operate on different term dates, school zone speed limits must be followed during NSW Government determined school terms.

To increase motorists' awareness of 40km/h school zones, triangular 'dragon's teeth' road markings indicate that the vehicle is entering a school zone.
