This month has been another very busy month for Council, including at the end of this month, our July Council meeting where we adopt our Operational Plan

20/21 including our budget, as we continue to undertake many services and actions in line with our Community Strategic Plan. This year due to COVID-19, the NSW Government allowed Councils an extra month to prepare the final plans for the 20/21 year.

In another major change due to COVID-19, we were not able to undertake the customary Budget Roadshows, that I know people across our communities, often took the time to attend, to learn from Council what is proposed in the next years plans. Nevertheless, our staff led by the Communications and Engagement team, have undertaken amazing work in ensuring that a strong online presence was developed. ANNUAL PERMITS FOR NON-DESEXED CATS & DANGEROUS/RESTRICTED DOGS

The NSW Government is introducing annual permits for non-desexed cats and restricted and dangerous dogs as part of its commitment to promoting responsible pet ownership and improving animal welfare standards.

From 1 July 2020 owners of cats not desexed by four months of age will be required to pay an \$80 annual permit in addition to their one-off lifetime pet registration fee.

This will create a stronger incentive to desex cats, which in turn will improve their health and wellbeing, including reducing the risk of some cancers.

Improving desexing rates will also ease the burden on pounds and shelters, reduce euthanasia rates, and help to address concerns about feral, stray and roaming cats and their effect on wildlife. Exemptions are in place for cats that are registered by 1 July 2020, those kept for breeding purposes by members of recognised breeding bodies, and cats which cannot be de-sexed for medical reasons.

From 1 July 2020 owners of dogs of a restricted breed or formally declared to be dangerous will be required to pay a \$195 annual permit in addition to their one-off lifetime pet registration fee.



This will serve as a further disincentive to owning high-risk dogs and encourage owners to better manage the behaviour of their animal.

From 1 July 2020, pet owners will be able to pay for annual permits using the NSW Pet Registry website or through their local council.

Anyone registering a cat on the NSW Pet Registry will be informed that they must pay for an \$80 annual permit if their animal is not desexed by four months of age.

Annual permit fees will go directly to the Companion Animals Fund which pays for companion animal management by local councils including pounds/shelters, ranger services, dog recreation areas, and education and awareness programs.

The fund is also used to operate the NSW Pet Registry and carry out responsible pet ownership initiatives.

PORTABLE SPEED BOARD

A new solar powered portable speed board has commenced operation in the Federation Council area.

The board provides real-time feedback to motorists of their vehicle speed and a reminder of the appropriate speed for the road they are travelling on.

Phase one of the operation will see the board located in four towns across the Council area, being Corowa, Howlong, Mulwala and Urana.

The board will be located in Corowa at various locations until the end of September before moving to the next location being Howlong.

It will also provide benchmarks with other similar LGAs and act as a reference point for the progressive initiatives that will shape Federation's future. URANA AQUATIC CENTRE

The Urana Aquatic Centre Leisure Centre building has now taken another great step forward, with the framework now being installed, after the slab was poured several weeks ago. It is exciting to see it take shape, and will be such a welcomed facility for many different users in the future when operational!

The building is being constructed on the banks of Lake Urana next to the Urana Caravan Park. The project is proudly funded by Federation Council, the NSW Government Stronger Country Communities Fund and proceeds from the closure of the Yuluma Cullivel Bus Committee.

Council looks forward to delivering this exciting new facility to the community.



HOWLONG MULTIPURPOSE HALL AND GYMNASIUM ON TRACK

Construction work on the new Howlong Multipurpose Hall and Gymnasium at Lowe Square Howlong is progressing well, with structural works expected to be finalised in July 2020.

Council awarded the construction contract to G & P Connelly trading as Connelly Construction Services, for \$1,521,830 at a Council meeting in October 2019.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said it was great to see the multifaceted project coming to fruition.

“Council is positive that this project will result in a number of positive health and social benefits for the Howlong community,” he said.

“The Howlong Football Club and Federation Council were successful in gaining grant funding towards the construction of a Community Hall and Community Fitness Centre as extensions to the Lowe Square Sports Pavilion building. This much needed project involves modification and a major extension to the existing football ground sports pavilion. The construction includes a new community hall for community functions, and a community fitness centre including a gymnasium.”

This project is in the existing Master Plan for Lowe Square (2011) and includes upgrading the Sports Pavilion change

rooms and amenities to meet modern standards and provide a comfortable, friendly and inclusive facility. Mayor Bourke said this project will enable the Howlong community to host a greater number of local activities and events, be more self-sufficient, and be more inclusive and connected.”

The Howlong Football Club carried out the planning and preparations of the plans for the extensions, with Council approving the Development Application in 2019.

The NSW Government through the Stronger Community Fund provided \$1,197,715 towards the project and Council has allocated \$175,000 from the Howlong Town Improvement fund.

COROWA SKATE PARK EXTENSION TAKES SHAPE

Works to extend the renowned Corowa Skatepark are causing great excitement among local youth and families.

Contractors Haley Constructions and Federation Council are progressively working towards delivering the \$327,560 upgrade project at present.

The extension of the Corowa Skatepark will improve the usability and appeal of this important asset for Council's youngest residents by catering for a broader range of ages and skill.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said the project to create a youth activation area that offers young people an alternative recreation option to traditional sports and encourages social connections was progressing well.

"This extension project is creating much excitement with our youth and local families which is just fantastic," he said.

"Council is delivering a suite of infrastructure projects at present which will all support our community and our youngest residents, as well as attract visitation from across the wider region."

The project secured \$333,170 through the NSW Government's Stronger Communities Major Project Fund and is also being supported through funds raised by the Corowa Skate Park Committee (\$16,130).

Mayor Bourke said the concept designs were developed in close consultation with the Skate Park Committee and have been used as a basis to engage expert consultants and progress more detailed planning for the project.

"The need to re-work the design and plan for the extension provided Council with the opportunity to consult with our Skate Park Committee and more broadly to ensure the very best outcome was achieved in respect to the new design," he said.

"Council would like to take every opportunity to continually thank our youngest residents who have been involved in the project, as well as the Skate Park Committee who have helped Council to understand the needs and expectations of users to deliver this new fantastic extension design. Council looks forward with great anticipation to an official opening."

GUIDE TO THE CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

The NSW Office of the Children's Guardian has released the Guide to the Child Safe Standards.

This Guide has been designed to help all people working with children understand how their roles and responsibilities can make their organisation safer.

It explains the rationale for each Standard and provides guidance on what organisations can do to implement the Child Safe Standards and measure success.

The Child Safe Standards recommended by the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse provide a framework so organisations can create cultures and adopt strategies to keep children safe from harm.

- National Diabetes Week July 12-18.
- Eye Surgeon Dr James Muecke, 2020 Australian of the Year, (see article The Border Mail 13 July 2020), advises against consumption of excessive sugar. Dr Muecke calls for the Australian Food Labelling Guidelines to be revised, or removed. His main concern is Type 2 diabetes, a preventable disease, which caused the death of 5,000 Australians in a 3 month period early 2020. Blindness and amputation are also common among diabetes sufferers.
- Dr Muecke's advice fits with the Oaklands' branch successful submission to State which became CWA Policy concerning health and wellbeing. Oaklands' members argued for the Traffic Light food labelling to be introduced, as it has proven very successful in Britain, in improving health outcomes. The Star system was introduced in Australia, which has many failings, and is not working.
- The health crisis of both Diabetes and Obesity are of great concern to CWA of NSW members. If you have concerns for your own children and families, feel welcome to join us in the fight to rectify the problems. Education yourself and others to the consequences of excessive sugar consumption.

OUR HERITAGE

SANGER ST VERANDAH RESTORATIONS

Verandahs need more care and restoration as they become older. Sanger Street in the heart of Corowa's Heritage Conservation Area contains many beautiful historic verandahs.

Helped by advice from Council staff, two businesses are restoring their main street verandahs in Sanger Street.

Rather than rebuild a dilapidated verandah in steel, Frank Miccio of Hotondo Homes decided to reframe the verandah with timber beams. He then found recycled solid timber posts. A steel fabricator made up some very solid post supports and the new galvanised roofing sparkles.

The Corowa Hotel owner restored the Hotel's upper floor verandah in timber and added new roof sheeting. Timber beams that used to sit on the brick columns are now fixed using steel brackets.

These restored verandahs add a lot to the main street. They give a fine example of the excellent work that local owners can achieve to improve the street and their own properties as well.

BOREE CREEK SHOPS PROJECT BEGINS

The Boree Creek shop row is much loved by locals. It used to be a favourite scene for visitors to photograph. But over recent years many shop signs wore off, parapet sheeting came loose and some verandah posts sank.

Now with permission from the building's local caretaker and help from local people, Federation Council's heritage adviser has started investigating the remains of the building frontage and its old shop signs.

Boree Creek's famous Goldenia Tea sign (on a side wall opposite the Hotel) was the first sign to be set out. Only about 20% of the original sign remained, but was enough to reconstruct the design.

Firstly all the historic sign traces must be studied. Then decisions can be made about the best way to restore them. Historic photos are the most important information source. One fine photograph has been made into a mural in the local hall. This will help inform the restoration.

The restoration will greatly improve the appearance of the street. And again the shop row will become a favourite place for visitors to photograph.

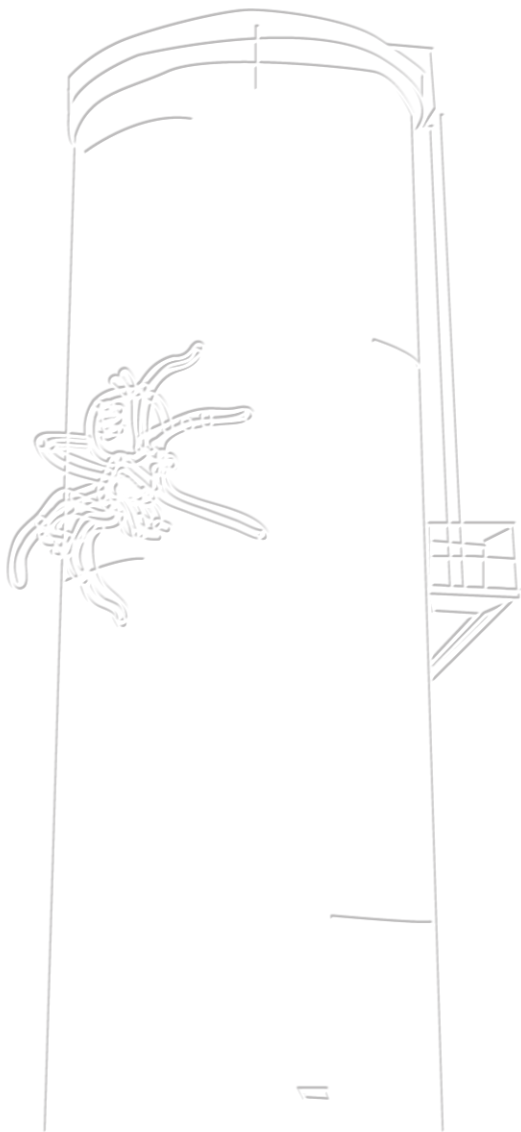

URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluoro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
