COUNCIL CALLS FOR ROADS ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO NOMINATE



Federation Council is calling for expressions of interests from local residents in the Federation LGA to join Council's Roads Advisory Committee.

The Roads Advisory Committee has been established by Federation Council to provide information, comment, and feedback to Council in relation to the strategic management of Council's Road assets.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council was pleased to call for Roads Advisory Committee members and encouraged residents with an interest in Council's roads network to nominate.

"The poor condition of rural roads has been a big focus in recent engagement opportunities with our community and Council remains committed to working with our residents to achieve better outcomes for our road network," he said.

"This committee will provide great advice

and input to Council on areas such as the roads hierarchy, funding priorities, and will allow the community to have greater visibility over road maintenance. Other business representatives such as trucking, school bus companies, and larger industries heavily reliant on the road network such as dairies and feedlots, will also have the opportunity to meet as opportunities present."

Initially the Roads Advisory Committee will focus on the following priority areas:

- Rural Roads;
- Roads to key industries;
- Transport Asset Management Plans;
- Road Hierarchy; and
- Service Levels.

The Committees objectives are to:

- Develop and review the principles underlying the provision of the road network within the Council area – Road Hierarchy network.
- Monitor and provide information/ advice to Council in relation to the issues arising out Council's Road network.
- Review strategies and provide advice to Council and staff regarding the management, maintenance, service levels, renewal and upgrading of roads within the council area.
- Review and provide advice on the downgrading or closing of roads within the Council Area.

The committee shall meet quarterly on the third Wednesday of the month at a place and time to be decided by the committee. The committee may decide to hold additional meetings throughout the year as required. See Council's website for more information.

COUNCIL ADOPTS OPERATIONAL PLAN, DELIVERY PROGRAM AND FINANCIAL PLANS

Council has adopted its 2022/2023 Operational Plan, 2022-2026 Delivery Program and Financial Plans at its June Council meeting.

Combined, these documents provide a guide to Council's operations and help the organisation meet community demands for services and infrastructure by maximising what it can achieve with its available resources.

Key priorities include:

- Delivering Council's 45 service functions for the benefit of the Federation community,
- Funding significant road renewal to address community concerns relating to deteriorating infrastructure, funded through a Special Rate Variation from July 2023,
- Supporting our community to prosper and grow by improving employment opportunities and improving livability,
- Undertaking detailed planning to address water and sewer needs in serviced communities,
- Improving the robustness of Council's long term Asset Management
 Planning and Long-Term Financial
 Planning to ensure that a financial
 ly responsible approach is taken
 and to ensure Council continues to
 strengthen its financial position over
 the medium to longer term,

- Finalising the Federation Council Growth Strategy, and
- Delivering the \$2.6m Corowa foreshore upgrade.

Under the proposed budget in year one, Council will complete \$18M in capital projects, deliver \$8.3M in road works, and \$8.9M on our sewerage and water network.

In the Long-Term Financial Plan, Council adopted a scenario that provides a \$48 million annual operating program and \$18.6m capital program for 2022/23 and a \$104m total capital program over the 10 years. It contains rate increases at 2.5% for 2022/23, followed by a special rate variation for four years from 2023/24 to 2026/27 being 19%, 17%, 14% & 10%.

The average proposed residential rate increases equate to weekly:

- 2022/23: \$0.34
- 2023/24: \$2.63.
- 2024/25: \$2.80
- 2025/26: \$2.70.
- 2026/27: \$2.39.

The average proposed farmland rate increases equate to weekly:

- 2022/23: \$1.69.
- 2023/24: \$13.11.
- 2024/25: \$13.96.
- 2025/26: \$13.45.
- 2026/27: \$10.95.

The Special Rate Variation increase proposed will be subject to an application

to IPART and involve further community engagement opportunities for ratepayers.

In adopting the plans, Federation Council Mayor Patrick Bourke said the overall plans primary focus was to ensure Council services are sustainable into the future, while delivering on the many major projects outlined in the Community Strategic Plan.

Council would like to thank all residents who took the opportunity to provide their feedback and look forward to continued engagement.

BILLABONG ANABRANCH BRIDGE REPLACEMENT: FEDERATION WAY OAKLANDS



Federation Council has commenced work on a \$1.8 million new 2 metre wider full bridge replacement construction at the Billabong Creek Anabranch near Oaklands.

The first stage of work is to construct a temporary bridge with an access road to the eastern side of the existing bridge. Once this temporary bridge is complete, traffic will be diverted to enable the existing bridge to be demolished and new bridge construction.

This bridge replacement is jointly funded by the Australian Government and NSW State Government under the Bridges Renewal Program.

- Australian Government \$907,500
- N.S.W State Government \$907.500
- Total cost \$1,815,000

Road work signs are in place to maintain a safe working environment for our staff, and for the safety of motorists in the area. When travelling through the construction site please be aware of the road crews, equipment and potential traffic delays including reductions in the speed limit during the construction.

Works are expected to be complete by the end of August 2022.

COUNCIL MEETS WITH NSW ROADS AND TRANSPORT MINISTER

Federation Council and the Mulwala Progress Association met with NSW Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Sam Farraway on Thursday in Mulwala, with representatives highlighting the urgency of a Yarrawonga Mulwala Bridge replacement.

The Yarrawonga Mulwala Bridge was built in 1924 and provides a vital transport link across Lake Mulwala, between the twin towns of Mulwala in NSW and Yarrawonga in Victoria.

The current bridge receives funding from the two State Governments and as a result of high maintenance costs, the age of the bridge including the narrow widths, and increasing traffic demands, the Yarrawonga-Mulwala bridge has been scheduled for replacement. A date has not yet been set for construction of the new bridge but at this stage is scheduled as a funding priority within the next 5-10 years. In a recent submission to Transport NSW, Council urged the agency to reassess its priorities as outlined in the 2018 Murray River Crossings Investment Prioritization Assessment, where the Yarrawonga Mulwala Bridge is currently ranked eighth highest priority for investment, behind Swan Hill, Tooleybuc, John Foord, Murrabit, Towong and George Chaffey bridges.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council welcomed the visit from NSW Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Sam Farraway to Mulwala and thanked Member for Albury Justin Clancy for his assistance in coordinating the meeting.

"Council has serious concerns in respect to the reliability, condition, safety and proximity to alternate crossings and pedestrian and cyclist facilities with the current bridge and we made this known to Minister Farraway," he said.

"Council requests that urgent consideration is given to increase the priority of this bridge replacement due to our serious concerns, also shared frequently by our community and other road users. Recent traffic counts show a growing number of traffic movements daily over the bridge. With both Federation and Moira councils experiencing high levels of growth within our townships, traffic is only expected to continue to increase as we experience unprecedented residential

and industrial growth. Both State Governments need to ensure this growth is supported by the delivery of a new bridge."

Mayor Bourke said Council also appreciated the opportunity to raise concerns about Council's deteriorating rural road network directly to the Minister and advocate the importance of State and Federal road funding injections into regional LGAs such as Federation.

COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM

The Community Grants Program supports initiatives that deliver a range of social and economic benefits to communities across the Federation Council area.

The program provides a more streamlined approach to supporting local community groups, organisations and clubs with delivering community projects and events.

Two rounds are facilitated each year, with a total amount of \$60,000 available to fund one-off projects through one of the nine focus categories:

Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the October Ordinary Council meeting.

COROWA AQUATIC CENTRE BUSINESS PLAN

Federation Council's draft Corowa Aquatic Centre Business Plan has been reviewed and endorsed by Council at it's June Ordinary meeting.

This Business Plan outlines the strategy for driving success and growth of Corowa Aquatic Centre. It outlines Council's objectives for the facility over the next four-year period for 2022/23 – 2025/26.

The draft plan is placed on public exhibition for a period of 28 days.

Council is inviting the community to review the draft plan and provide any feedback by 5pm Monday 1 August, 2022.

COUNCIL RECEIVES \$2.15M FEDERATION WAY SOUTH OF DAYSDALE



Federation Council has recently been successful in a funding application under the Federal Government Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity Program for further much needed renewal work on Federation Way.

Council applied to the program to upgrade a 4km stretch of Federation Way to the value of \$2.15M. The location of the proposed work will be immediately south of and link up with, the current major road and bridge works being delivered just south of Daysdale.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke thanked the Federal Government Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications following the announcement, as well as thanking Council staff who work hard to prepare excellent applications.

"This funding opportunity is extremely welcome news to Council and I am sure our road users who use this section of Federation Way. Residents,"

Mayor Bourke said. "Council has an extensive road network to maintain and grant programs such as this are crucial to provide some of the funding needed to undertake road infrastructure renewals. The poor condition of rural roads has been a big focus in recent engagement opportunities with our community and Council remains committed to working with our residents to achieve better outcomes for our road network. Two years of some of the driest times on record in 2018 and 2019 followed by thankfully, 2020, 2021 and now the first half of 2022, of amazing seasons has put enormous pressure on our road network as it is to other Councils in the region."

Mayor Bourke said the previous Council and now continued on with the current Council, had undertaken significant Road Strategy improvement work, and this includes the current Roads Advisory Committee, being expanded to include Community members. This will have at least 8 community representatives on it (being advertised very shortly). This committee will provide great advice and input to Council on areas such as the roads hierarchy, funding priorities, and will allow the community to have greater visibility over road maintenance. Other business representatives such as trucking, school bus companies, and larger industries heavily reliant on the road network such as dairies and feedlots, will also have the opportunity to meet as opportunities present.

The \$2.15M Federal funded works on Federation Way will be programmed to be completed in the 2022-2023 financial year.

CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE - MAY 2022



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds, and roads across the Federation Council Region. The following activities were undertaken in May 2022 by Federation Council's Works teams.

- Corowa Mulwala Cycleway Gravel pavement commenced on Spring Drive from Croppers Road to Enfield Street, Enfield Street from Spring Drive to Cotton Street, Cotton Street from Enfield Street to Adams Street. Sealing of pavement completed from Freyers Road to Croppers Road.
- Slashing Corowa Aerodrome.
- Balldale Road Fixing Country Roads – Round 3 Step 2 memo approved for vegetation removal for road upgrade and widening.
- Daysdale Curves Demolition and removal of old bridge culvert in Coreen Creek, completion of new culvert pipes in Coreen Creek.
- Daysdale-Walbundrie Road pavement base course laid and compacted and batters graded and compacted. Old Daysdale-Walbundrie Road ripped ready for recycling.

- Spring Drive Segment 100 in conjunction with Transport for NSW. Renew Raised Pavement Markers to suit new Retro style line marking.
- Cullivel Road Fixing Local Roads Round 2 Gravel carting of base material to stockpile site.
- Riverina Highway sidetrack Contract work for TfNSW Gravel carting of base material for this project.
- Heavy Patching Corowa Road Block grant program Work continuing as weather permits.
- Maintenance Grading Program
 Roads graded in May Daysdale-Walbundrie Road, Skehans
 Lane, Caringa Lane. No tabledrain
 work done as tabledrains are too wet
 for plant to work in. Mahonga Road.
- Gravel Re-sheeting One Tree Lane 1.2km.
- Tabledrain Maintenance Tabledrain Maintenance in urban and rural drains, only in zones where no impact can be made on the Sloanes Froglet (between April and October).
- Sealed Roads Pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jetmaster patching truck.
- Customer Requests Numerous Customer Requests responded to for drainage, potholes, signs and tree clearances, however some unable to be acted on due to budget constraints.
- Proposed New Works John Street drainage works.

COROWA TO MULWALA TRAIL CLOSE TO COMPLETION



Works on the Corowa to Mulwala trail are close to completion, following consistent wet weather throughout the winter period.

Federation Council is undertaking the Corowa to Mulwala Trail (CMT) and Foreshore Precincts project, which features the construction of a shareduse trail linking the townships of Corowa and Mulwala. The combined projects provide an opportunity to encourage exploration along the Murray River and integrate towns and villages across the three LGAs, creating a strengthened interface with the Murray River.

The Corowa to Mulwala Trail is part of the Murray River Regional Experiences project which is a joint initiative of Albury City, Berrigan Shire and Federation councils. The project aims to strengthen access to and connection with the Murray River for both residents and visitors. The councils are tasked with projects to improve infrastructure along 60 km of river frontage and have been provided with

specific purpose funding to do so.

Federation Council General Manager, Adrian Butler said it was pleasing to see that the trail was close to completion.

"Progress on the trail has been intermittent in the last few weeks due to the inclement weather," Mr Butler said.

"Over 95% of the trail has been gravelled and is ready for sealing. Work will continue this week and depending on the weather conditions, additional sections of the trail will be sealed. The current work sites are River Street - Corowa to Croppers Road - Corowa, Stuckeys Road area, and from Kyffins Reserve to Owen Bridges Reserve.

Mr Butler said contractors are progressing with the board walk over Lake Mulwala near Drain Lane.

"Piles and headstocks have been installed, with work currently progressing on the installation of girders and decking," he said.

"It is great to hear the positive comments from the community in respect to the project, and specifically the board walk feature over Lake Mulwala which is sure to be a drawcard."

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
