COUNCIL THANKS COMMUNITY POST ECONOMIC ENGAGEMENT



Federation Council has thanked the wider community following the completion of its recent Economic Development Strategy community engagement sessions.

Council invited members of the community to get involved in the development of the Strategy by completing a short online survey, and by attending one of the community workshops held in early May.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council appreciated the high level of excitement that it received from the community during the consultation phase.

"Council is really looking forward to now finalizing the inaugural Economic Development Strategy," he said.

"We had over 100 participants attend the engagement sessions and to say our community is excited to develop the strategy is an understatement. The economy in the Federation Council region has traditionally been supported by strong agriculture sector, however, following the sessions it is evident that our region has a number of emerging sectors, such as manufacturing and retail, which will play a key role in our future economy. This Strategy will cater for all sectors in our region, and ensure we have a diverse, resilient and sustainable economy in the future."

Mayor Bourke said the Economic Development Strategy will position the regional economy for future success and enable economic benefits to be realised by local residents, businesses, investors and visitors.

"We want the Strategy to be guided by the Community. Economic development is not about Council dictating what will happen; it is about collaborating with the community to come up with strategic objectives that we can all work towards together. I would like to take this opportunity to formally thank the community for their input and I look forward with anticipation to the strategy coming to Council in draft format for public exhibition in the near future."

The purpose of developing the Economic Development Strategy is to provide clear and comprehensive strategic guidelines and tools for supporting the development of the Federation economy across the entire local government area.

The draft strategy will be presented to Council in July 2021, and placed on public exhibition for a 28 day period, before returning to Council for them to consider final adoption.

TIM FISCHER AC MEMORIAL SCULPTURE UNVEILED

From humble beginnings, to greatness was the way Boree Creek's favorite son, Tim Fischer, AC was remembered by the hundreds who flocked to witness the unveiling of his memorial sculpture at the Tim Fischer Community Park in Boree Creek recently.

Urana artist Andrew Whitehead's found-metal likeness of Mr Fischer, titled 'The Last Train from Boree', was completed in June 2020 to much online acclaim.

However the planned installation and unveiling of the sculpture - scheduled to coincide with the first anniversary of Mr Fischer's death in August 2020 - was cancelled due to COVID-19.

Several notable Australian leaders joined Federation Council, Judy Brewer and the Fischer family at the event, including the NSW Governor Margaret Beazley, former Ambassador to the Holy See Melissa Hitchman, Member for Albury Justin Clancy, Member for Farrer Susan Ley, Major Sarah Winter and Deputy Prime Minister Michael McCormack.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said it was a great honour to host the memorial event and unveil the Tim Fischer Memorial Sculpture, which is an amazing piece of artwork that will forever honour Mr Fischer's passion for both trains and that of Boree Creek.

"Tim is affectionately referred to as Boree Creek's favourite son." he said.

"This is where life started for Tim, and throughout his life, and his many achievements, somehow and some way he always found his way back here. That is why it brings me great pleasure, as the Mayor of Federation Council to have commissioned this statue to ensure that Tim's unwavering commitment and dedication to this community will forever stand the sands of time and be a constant reminder of his passion to our people, whether they had been the people of Boree Creek or that of our entire country."

NSW Governor Margaret Beazley spoke to the crowd about the sense of belonging and pride that Tim had for the Boree Creek area, and the honour it was to be involved in the unveiling.

Political figures in the Deputy Prime Minister Michael McCormick, Member for Farrer Susan Ley and Member for Albury Justin Clancy all spoke to the impact Tim's life had on the democratic achievements of this country, and also the way in which he mentored political leaders – resulting in a highly respected and honourable legacy.

Mayor Bourke said he knew Tim would be humbled by everyone's efforts to come together the way everyone had to honour his life.

"Tim is certainly missed beyond measure, and I hope this sculpture acts as a magnificent reminder of the great

man that the honourable Tim Fischer was," he said.

"I hope it also inspires our many young Australians who will visit the sculpture in the years to come to understand the history and legacy of the great Tim Fischer – and most importantly, in that from humble beginnings in places like Boree Creek, greatness can really be achieved."

Federation Council commissioned the \$40,000 artwork through the NSW Federal Government's Community Drought Funding Program.

NSW PLANNING PORTAL INTRODUCTION



The NSW Government is making the planning system easier to use with the introduction of the online NSW Planning Portal.

The NSW Planning Portal is a digital space where community, industry and government can work together to better understand and meet their obligations under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

The portal is a single place to go for planning processes and transactions online, it is simpler, faster and more transparent for everyone.

It can be used to lodge and process Development Applications (DA's) including modifications, Complying Development Certificate Applications (CDC's) and for certificates under Part 6 of the EP&A Act).

From Thursday 1 July 2021, it will be mandatory to lodge your Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC) and Complying Development Applications (CDC) via the online NSW Planning Portal.

COUNCIL EXHIBITS RATES HARMONISATION OPTIONS



The State Government has given all amalgamated councils, including Federation Council, until July 2021 to harmonise their rate structures, ensuring ratepayers are all rated under the one rating system from 2021/22 onwards.

The State Government's imposed rates freeze on amalgamated councils in 2016 ensured residents paid no more than they would have under their old council until 2021.

Rates paid by Federation Council ratepayers are currently calculated using the formulas devised by the former Corowa and Urana Shire councils.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said Federation Council is required to develop and introduce a single system by July 2021 as the current legislation makes no provision for a deferred or staged implementation.

"The State Government requires all councils to comply with this legislative requirement regardless of how significant the change is on rates to be paid by individual rate payers," he said.

"Federation Council is currently consulting the community on rate harmonisation as currently mandated by the State Government. This has occurred in a range of ways, including through detailed face to face sessions held at Morundah, Oaklands, Urana, Corowa, Howlong and Mulwala across May, and through its special purpose rates advisory committee that contains a mix of ratepayers both by rates category and geographical areas of the Council area. This has led Council to the final stages of community consultation, the public exhibition process, where three options have been selected based on this extensive work, for the community to consider and respond to. This will help shape Council decision in moving forward with this project by adopting the one new rates system in mid-July."

Mayor Bourke said it was important to note that the process of harmonising rates across Federation does not increase the total rate revenue collected by Council. "Rate harmonisation simply redistributes the current rate income across all ratepayers based on the unimproved land value of their property under one new system," he said.

"For example, when harmonised a \$450,000 (unimproved valuer general valued property), regardless of what former council it is located in, will pay the same amount of rates going forward in 21/22 in the former Urana Council area. as the former Corowa Council area, where it is within the same rate category. This is currently not the case as both Councils had different rating systems. The average residential rate for former Corowa Shire is \$732, compared to Former Urana Shire's average of \$248. Farmland averages are former Corowa Shire \$3,403 compared to former Urana Shire's average of \$3,273, and business averages of the former Corowa Shire \$1,411 compared to former Urana Shire's average of \$518 respectively."

Mayor Bourke said there is no clear or easy solution in bringing in one new rates system, in terms of ensuring equity, rates burden, capacity to pay across our vast Council area with differing service levels and vastly differing unimproved land valuations. "I can assure you that Council is doing all it can to ensure it can put in place as fair and equitable system as possible, and to ensure ratepayer are engaged in this process," he said.

More information about the process and options is being presented via a range of methods including a letterbox mail out, and information on Councils website, including an online feedback form.

Council will do all it can to continue to engage extensively with ratepayers to ensure they are fully informed.

FUTURE YARRAWONGA/ MULWALA BRIDGE RE-PLACEMENT DISCUSSION PROGRESSES

Federation and Moira councils were joined by NSW Government Regional Roads and Transport Minister, The Hon Paul Toole MLA and Member for Albury Justin Clancy to progress discussions in respect to the preferred route of the Yarrawonga/Mulwala Bridge replacement recently.

Federation Council General Manager, Adrian Butler presented to the Minister and other meeting guests on the project history to date, consultation completed, the green route benefits and both councils hope for a green route bridge replacement commitment from the NSW Government in the near future.

Both councils continue to advocate the green route, which is heavily supported by their respective communities in Yarrawonga and Muwlala, as well as the Victorian State Government and Federal Government.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council very much welcomed the opportunity afforded through the advocacy efforts of Council. subsequently taken up by our local Member Justin Clancy, to have the Roads Regional and Transport Minister. The Hon Paul Toole MI A meet with Federation and Moira councils and the Mulwala Progress

Association Chair, Robert Purtle OAM at Mulwala on Wednesday.

"The Minister was very forthcoming in his commitment to ensuring the ongoing debate about the green route favoured by the communities on both sides and both councils, does not go on for too much longer," Mayor Bourke said.

"We look forward to hearing of more updates from the NSW Government over the coming weeks about the way forward into making this critical decision to finalise the route and allow the much needed new bridge to actually then commence planning for construction.

We pay credit also to the ongoing partnership and strong relationship with our Moira Shire counterparts, working together as one community, with one vision, to continue to bring this project forward, and to work together on many other strategic planning and other areas into the future."

Moira Shire Council Mayor, Cr Libro Mustica said Moira Shire appreciated being able to attend the meeting via video call to progress the bridge replacement discussion.

"We're absolutely convinced the green route has been supported by local residents and councils because it creates a safer pedestrian environment in which tourism and lifestyle around Lake Mulwala can flourish without the impact of heavy trucks," Mayor Mustica said.

"Every local MP, both State and Federal, Liberal, Labor and Nats agree that the green route is the way to go and we've been delighted to have that same view expressed by Victoria's Roads Minister. We look forward to NSW and Victoria uniting with the overwhelming community support for green so that design and planning can proceed".

Mayor Bourke said Council would like to pay its sincere thanks to local Member Justin Clancy for his efforts in bringing Minister Toole to the Federation Local Government Area.

"Council continues to appreciate the advocacy work, advice and support that Justin provides on so many of our strategic projects," he said.

"We always appreciate his time and the attention to detail that he gives to each project consistently. His efforts and commitment to our Council region is commendable, and certainly does not go unnoticed. It takes a team effort to drive important decisions and processes such as this and I feel that Wednesday's meeting was another step closer in our communities having assured clarity on this matter for the future."

A final report into the green and grey routes is expected to be released on June 15 by the NSW State Government, which will allow for both communities to have their final say on the preferred route. The Minister indicated an announcement of support from the NSW Government on their preferred route for the future new bridge would be made thereafter.

WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region.

The following activities were undertaken recently by Federation Council's Works teams:

- Fixing Local Roads Program Vegetation Continue tree clearance work on Bull Plain Road and Redlands Road, (contractor in conjunction with Council).
- Fixing Local Roads Program Traffic Facilities - Commence audit of signs for upgrade/replacement in urban streets and rural roads. Continue upgrade Regulatory town speed limit signs from "A" size to "B" size, (50, 60, 80, 100 km/h), Howlong, Urana, Boree Creek.
- Fixing Local Roads Program Sealing Unsealed Roads Widgewa Street Morundah sealed, Thomson Street Oaklands ready to seal.
- Footpaths Panels replaced William Street Urana.
- Maintenance Grading Rosemount Road, Taylors Road, Naughtins Road, Jamiesons Road, Corona Road, Taits Road.

- Daysdale S Bends Work nearing completion on new culvert structure for this project. Following completion of culvert road pavement will be reinstated to two lanes and the project shutdown for winter
- Fleming Drive Watermain 100mm -Commence works, including under boring driveways and pipe laying.
- Church Street Watermain 300mm -Commence early works, asset identification, underbore street crossings and pipe laying.
- Corowa Aquatic Centre Assist Town Presentation with turf laying.
- Corowa Mulwala Cycleway Commence clearing of vegetation and laying gravel pavement.
- Flocon Patching Truck Urban and rural pothole patching as per Reflect.
 Assist Construction crews on Capital Works Projects & shoulder grading with traffic control as required.
- Sundry Gang: FLR Program Traffic Facilities in conjunction with Construction teams, various Customer Requests. Footpath repairs. Traffic control for construction crews & contractors where required.
- Heavy Trucks Support Grader Gangs & Construction Gangs on maintenance - hauling spoil, gravel, and sand.
- Federation Way Continuation of work on Federation Way at Morundah (near completion).
- MR 59 Continuation of work on MR59 Urana to Jerilderie Road – RE-PAIR Program (also near completion).

FAMILY AND FRIEND SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Alcohol and drug use not only affects people using the alcohol or drugs, but it also has an adverse impact on their family, friends, and their community.

Family and peer support networks are critical to a persons' recovery from alcohol/drug use. but too often. relationships strained become and users become isolated from their families, friends and social networks due to the problems arising from their alcohol or drug use.

Families and friends can play a critical role in the recovery of people using alcohol and other drugs. However, there is little support for families in this situation.

The Family and Friend Support Program is an online intervention and support package for families/friends supporting loved ones using alcohol/drugs.

It includes information on how families and friends can best help their loved ones and protect them from adverse impacts of their lifestyle of drinking alcohol or using drugs. The Family and Friend Support Program recognises that supporting someone who is drinking or using can be extremely stressful, and aims to assist families and friends to best manage the demands of this role. NSW GOV SUPPORT PACKAGE HELP REGIONAL COMMUNITIES COMBAT MOUSE PLAQUE

The NSW Government has recently announced a \$50 million package to offer farmers, households and small businesses assistance to battle the mice plague currently impacting parts of rural and regional NSW.

Deputy Premier John Barilaro and Minister for Agriculture Adam Marshall said free baiting, through free-of-charge grain treatment, would be made available to primary producers, while affected rural and town households and small businesses would be able to apply for rebates to help them meet the cost of purchasing mouse baits.

"We know the financial pressure this mice plague is putting on farmers and household budgets, we have heard the concerns of regional NSW and we are acting on it," Mr Barilaro said.

"The NSW Government will establish grain treatment facilities at specified locations across rural and regional NSW for farmers to have their grain treated free of charge and we will provide rebates to small businesses and households through Service NSW to help meet the cost of buying bait.

"I am also forming an advisory committee to ensure everyone has access to expert advice, including the latest hot spots,

health and food safety advice, information for vets and guidance for keeping children and animals safe."

Under this package households will be able to apply for rebates of up to \$500 and small businesses will be eligible to claim up to \$1000 through Service NSW.

The advisory committee will include representatives from the Department of Regional NSW, Local Land Services, Department of Primary Industries, NSW Health, Service NSW, NSW Food Authority, Office of Small Business Commissioner, the Office of Local Government and the CSIRO.

Mr Marshall said farmers would be able to have their grain treated free of charge to protect their hard-sown crops from vermin

"The announcement of free baits to treat grain almost completely removes the cost burden on our farmers and croppers and complements our popular workshops to arm farmers with the tools needed to build a mice-free fortress to protect their paddocks," Mr Marshall said.

"I've seen first-hand the impact these rodents are having. They are a scourge on our agricultural production so we are giving landholders a fearsome suite of tools to manage mice.

"We're making this as easy for farmers as we possibly can. No tedious rebate forms to fill out, just bring your grain to have the experts treat it free of charge. "Free bait is better than any rebate for our farmers, who we continue to stand behind post drought, bushfires and floods."

In addition to free grain treatment and expert workshops, the NSW Department of Primary Industries will also launch an unprecendented body of research to identify and potentially develop future tools to combat mice plagues, including biological controls.

Fast facts:

- \$500 rebates for eligible households
- \$1000 rebates for eligible small businesses
- Free mice bait (grain treatment) for farmers
- The NSW Government has sought urgent approval from the Commonwealth's APVMA for the use of bromadiolone in NSW
- Expanded workshops to educate farmers on the best eradication strategies
- A moonshot research project to identify and potentially develop a new mice-killing agent
