NEW RAP WORKING GROUP MEMBERS UNDERTAKE CULTURAL AWARENESS TRAINING



Federation Council further strengthened its reconciliation journey this week as members of the newly formed Reconciliation Action Plan RAP Working Group undertook Aboriginal Cultural Awareness Training, as part of 2022 National Reconciliation Week.

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Training Coordinator, and Bangerang man, Darren ‘Dozer’ Atkinson and wife Sam proud Bangerang Wiradjuri women, started the morning with a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony, at the Corowa Civic Centre. Staff and Councillors were invited to walk through the smoke and place leaves on the fire for an individual cleansing.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said he was pleased that the RAP Working Group members have had the opportunity to undertake Cultural Awareness Training in the early stages of developing a Reconciliation Action Plan for Council.

“The more knowledge and understanding Council staff have, the better placed they will be to develop a strong and respectful RAP for our Council area,” he said.

“Council looks forward to further developing a model that focuses on respectful behaviour with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander colleagues, residents, and people of all cultural backgrounds in our broader community.”

The workshop held at the Corowa RSL provided a general overview and introduction to the Bangerang people, their history and culture. The group learnt of issues impacting Aboriginal people such as transgenerational trauma affects, racism and indirect racism, language and cultural bias. The training rapped up with a discussion on strategies for engaging our aboriginal community moving forward.

The Working Group will help guide the Federation Council through the development of an ‘Innovative’ RAP in accordance with the Reconciliation Australia process. The Working Group will meet as required and provide feedback and recommendations to Council.

Every year, National Reconciliation Week is held from the 27th of May to the 3rd of June. It is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared

histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The National Reconciliation Week 2022 theme, “Be Brave. Make Change.” is a challenge to individuals, families, communities, organisations and government—to Be Brave and tackle the unfinished business of reconciliation so change can be made for the benefit of all Australians.

For thousands of years, Aboriginal people have employed Smoking Ceremonies to cleanse places and people of bad spirits, acknowledge ancestors, pay respect to the land and water and clean the way for new beginnings.

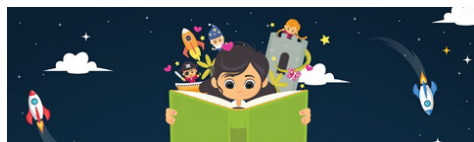

BILLABONG ANABRANCH BRIDGE REPLACEMENT: FEDERATION WAY OAKLANDS



Federation Council has commenced work on a \$1.8 million new 2 metre wider full bridge replacement construction at the Billabong Creek Anabranh near Oaklands.

The first stage of work is to construct a temporary bridge with an access road to the eastern side of the existing bridge. Once this temporary bridge is complete, traffic will be diverted to enable the existing bridge to be demolished and new bridge construction.

This bridge replacement is jointly funded by the Australian Government and NSW State Government under the Bridges Renewal Program.

- Australian Government \$907,500
- N.S.W State Government \$907,500
- Total cost \$1,815,000

Road work signs are in place to maintain a safe working environment for our staff, and for the safety of motorists in the area. When travelling through the construction

site please be aware of the road crews, equipment and potential traffic delays including reductions in the speed limit during the construction.

Works are expected to be complete by the end of August 2022.

Ball Park Reserve New Access Road

Council is seeking tenders from suitably qualified and experienced contractors for the construction of a new access road and parking bays in Ball Park, Corowa, adjacent to Bridge Road.

The project involves the construction of road pavement, drainage structure, concrete kerb, asphalt surface, concrete footpath and other miscellaneous works.

COUNCIL RECEIVES DISASTER DECLARATION FOLLOWING JANUARY STORM EVENT

The Federation Council Local Government Area has now received a Natural Disaster Declaration following the severe weather event that occurred in Corowa on 31 January 2022.

Federation Council is now one of nine Local Government Areas that are eligible for disaster assistance.

The additional nine LGAs are: Blayney, Central Darling, Cootamundra-Gundagai, Federation, Hay, Junee, Lockhart, Snowy Valleys and Upper Lachlan. Assistance is being provided through the jointly funded Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).

Assistance available under the DRFA may include:

- Help for eligible people whose homes or belongings have been damaged (eligibility criteria apply);
- Support for affected local councils to help with the costs of cleaning up and restoring damaged essential public assets;
- Concessional interest rate loans for small businesses, primary producers and nonprofit organisations; and
- Freight subsidies for primary producers.

The Federation Council Local Government Area, like several others, was severely impacted by severe weather events, dating back to December 2021.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Natural Disaster Declarations were lodged by Council to the NSW Government, to assist Council with funding to repair damaged Council assets, for events in November, December and January.

“Previously, Council received notification that the events of November and December have been approved and of major concern to Council was the extreme weather event that impacted many parts of the Corowa Township on 31 January 2022, had not been announced as a natural disaster,” he said.

“The area was subjected to 192mm of rain in around 4 hours, and this is an event that is greater than a 1 in 2000 year event. Council continued to advocate for our community to receive this declaration that will go a long way in to providing assistance to residents affected and is also anticipated to assist Council financially in recovering costs associated with the restoration of public assets and repair road damage.

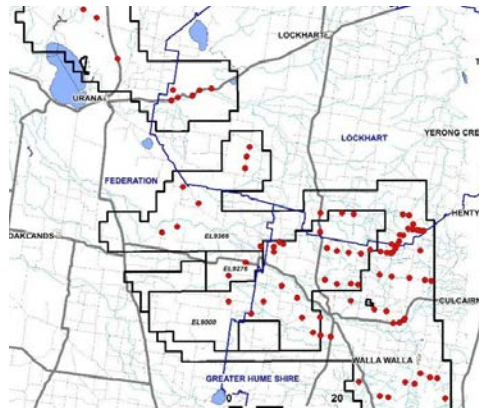

At our recent meeting of the Urana LHAC (Local Health & Community Advisory Committee) members discussed the staff shortages at our centre, Urana MPS, and how it has impacted our own Doctor Giri, Facility Manager, Karen Flack, trained staff and all of those employed at the Urana MPS.

Members of the LHAC expressed their appreciation to all these dedicated staff. Dr Giri who visits patients at the MPS 5 days per week, attends call outs, accident and emergency cases and performs procedures all the while keeping his surgery at the Urana Medical Centre open and offering additional services. The trained nurses who are working additional hours during the current crisis to ensure we have full time quality health care.

It is reassuring for all of us living in the district to know we have such first class medical & health services available. Maybe we enjoy good health and have not availed ourselves of these services to date however, it would be a nice gesture if we took time out to let those involved know we appreciate the care, friendship shown and dedication they apply to their chosen career and profession.

We have had staff shortages before, at one stage when closure was threatened due to lack of staff, volunteers came out of retirement and undertook refresher courses so they could offer their services to allow the overworked staff take some much-needed respite.

Our LHA Committee would like it known that we would dearly welcome additional members. It is rewarding work, more satisfying than being on the receiving end. We hold meetings every second month, lasting approximately an hour and a half. We suggest interested parties come along to a few meetings, without any commitment, and then decide if they would like to be part of the team.

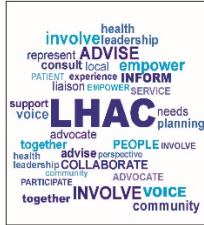

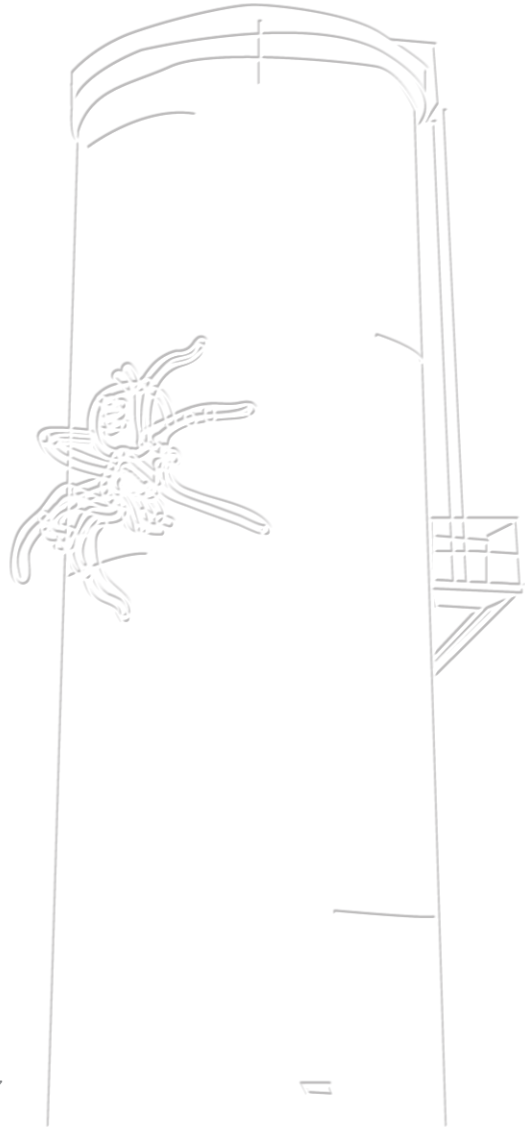
