Message from the Mayor

Dear Readers, welcome to the March edition of the Urana District Newsletter.

In exciting news this month, Federation Way will receive \$4.4 million of upgrades as part of funding awarded under the Fixing Country Roads program.

The project will include widening and resealing of pavement north of Buraja, reducing travel time for heavy vehicles, improving safety outcomes and reducing maintenance and repair costs for vehicles and the Council.

Council has Federation Way as a major upgrade priority as it's a significant north south arterial through the Council area linking from the Hume Highway in the south near Wangaratta to the Newell at Morundah. Read more about this funding announcement on page 12 of this month's newsletter.

Anzac Day is one of Australia's most important national commemorative occasions and all Councillors have committed to attending ceremonies from Boree Creek to Mulwala.

Council also resolved at its monthly meeting in March to establish an Arts and Cultural Advisory Committee as part of Council's commitment to celebrating the area's rich culture and heritage. Some of the objectives of the Federation Arts and Cultural Advisory Committee will be:

- Provide strategic advice, advocacy and recommendations to Council on arts and cultural policy, issues and priorities.
- Facilitate formal and informal communication and consultation processes with local arts and cultural interest groups, organisations and residents.
- To listen to other people within the community and bring their views to the group for discussion.
- Provide feedback to the community what happens in the meetings and what they should know about and get involved in.
- Respond to enquiries from the Council regarding specific arts and cultural issues in the



Federation Council Area.

Council will be calling for nominations from the general public in the near future so keep an eye out for this if you would like to be apart of this new advisory committee.

Following a successful expressions of interest process, Council has resolved to enter into an agreement to lease with Amber Aviation Academy to establish a state of the art, leading edge Aviation Training Facility in Corowa.

Amber Aviation Academy is a certified flight training academy that educates and trains Commercial and Airline Pilots and proposes to also facilitate Cabin Crew, Ground Support Crew, Aviation Engineers and Technicians from the Corowa facility. With qualifications nationally accredited and internationally recognised, Amber offers an individualized training experience focusing on personal learning outcomes.

The Corowa Aerodrome expansion and pilot training program is an exciting long-term project which will create employment and training opportunities, as well as provide an economic boost to the entire Federation region.

Community Grants Program— Now Open

Round Two of Federation Council's 2018-2019 Events and Community Grants program is now open, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups to apply for a share in \$55,000 of funding for this year's Events & Community Development Grants Program.

"The Events & Community Development Grants program is a new initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this new initiative as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a critical for empowering community participation in local activities as well as championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for one-off projects through one of the seven categories:

- Arts And Culture.
- Events & Tourism.
- Community Work and Welfare.
- Skill Development and Learning.
- Health Promotion.
- Accessibility and Inclusion.
- Young People.
- Sport & Recreation support.
- Senior Residents.
- Children & Families.



"If you are an eligible group and you have a great idea that can benefit the wider community, pitch your initiative through Community Grants Program by Monday 1 April 2019," Mayor Bourke said.

The Community Grants Program operates in two funding rounds each year – in September and April - and invites applications for grants up to \$3,000. For grants, over \$3,000 contact the Community & Events Project Officer Phone: (02) 6033 8999.

The Community Grants Program is now open and closes Monday 1 April 2019. Applications recommended for approval will be considered at the April 2019 Council meeting.

STABILISING WORK TO SOME CEMETERY MONUMENTS IN FEDERATION COUNCIL

As part of Council's heritage program, stabilisation work to burial monuments at two of council's historic cemeteries (Urana and Corowa Pioneer Cemetery) will be carried out over the April to May period.

An inspection by Council's heritage adviser revealed that monuments at Corowa's Pioneer Cemetery had been vandalised and some recently installed monuments at Urana had collapsed.



This emergency work will only stabilise several monuments that are in immediate threat of collapse or disintegration.

All food businesses have obligations and Federation Council is assisting food businesses to meet their obligations by providing free access to this exciting new tool. There is a high demand for training within the food sector. This training will assist food handlers in developing the required skills and knowledge to ensure food is handled in a safe and hygienic manner.

The program is easy to follow, includes an entertaining presentation as well as interactive quizzes and the ability to view Chinese text and captions. A training acknowledgement form can be printed upon completion and be kept as part of your staff records.

There is no limit on how many times the program can be accessed. It can be used to induct new staff or used as a staff refresher training on an annual basis. It is also a useful tool for parents, students, community volunteers and sporting groups involved in handling food for canteens and fundraisers.

Tinkling the Ivories in Sanger Street

The Federation Youth Council unveiled their CommUNITY Piano on Tuesday evening prior to their monthly meeting. Concerned with the issue of inclusion and acceptance of young people, the Federation Youth Council hope the piano is the catalyst for people to see each other, make conversation and come together without any prejudice.

The CommUNITY Piano was designed and painted by the Stage 5 Studio to Street Art class at Corowa High School who collaborated with the Federation Youth Council. The students worked with local Aboriginal artists, Iris Hill and Sophia Brear to design, paint and stencil the sanded back piano. Students involved in the project included Kaylie Martin, Sarah Knight, Victoria Borg, Ella Harvie, Chloe Hayes, Laura Duncan, Taelah Willett, and Skye Sephton-Howard.



Federation Council Youth Mayor Dylan Forge said over the past 12 months, the Youth Council have actively tried to find ways of inclusion and interaction for youth throughout our Council region.

“Projects like Oakland’s Flicks in the Sticks movie night, Howlong’s upcoming outdoor Ping Pong table and Corowa’s newly formed social soccer club are some of the major projects I am proud to help lead here at Federation Youth Council,” he said.

“The CommUNITY piano should be seen as a catalyst for youth and citizens to meet and interact in a fun and exciting way down Corowa’s iconic Sanger Street. The development and logistics of obtaining and providing a CommUNITY piano to the people of Corowa has been one of Federation Youth Councils major focuses throughout our first term in office and great help has come from many people behind the scenes both at Council and within the town.”

Local piano specialist, Ian Hayes from Albury prepared and delivered the piano and the stool was sold to the Youth Council by local piano player, John “Banjo” Patterson.

The piano positioned in front of Origin Clothing and is on a three-month trial to gauge the community’s response. Craig Spencer, and the team at Origin Clothing agreed to be the ‘piano partner’, late last year, by pushing the piano onto the street in the morning and tucking it away from the elements at night.

Beginner, novice and expert piano players are welcome to use the piano, which will be available to play Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m and Saturday morning till midday.

The CommUNITY piano is great not just for the music it brings, but is a powerful economic force, and acts as a magnet for tourists.

The long term plan for the piano to remain in Sanger Street and shop owners and cafes who are eager to feature the piano and become a “partner” should contact Council and express their interest.

Designed to start conversations, activate the area and encourage passers-by to play, pianists of all-abilities are welcome to play the piano. Musicians are encouraged to record their performances and post them to their Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter accounts using the hashtag #visitcorowaregion. The CommUNITY Piano Project is funded through the Youth Opportunities Program 2018.

\$4.4 million for Federation Way Upgrade

Federation Way will receive \$4.4 million of upgrades as part of funding awarded under the Fixing Country Roads program.

Liberal for Albury Justin Clancy welcomed the funding, one of 21 new projects to receive investment from the NSW Liberals and Nationals Government to improve freight movements across rural and regional NSW.

“The Fixing Country Roads program is one of the largest undertakings ever seen across regional NSW and these new projects will mean we have 302 individual upgrades either completed or being delivered” Mr Clancy said.

“Restart NSW Fixing Country Roads is helping regional communities by upgrading worn out bridges, sealing often unpassable roads, building and upgrading truck washes and offering alternatives for people needing to travel between freight facilities. Regional communities and main state roads.”

“It’s feat to see Federation Way being added to the success story,” Mr Clancy said. The project will include widening and resealing of pavement north of the Riverina Highway at Buruja, reducing travel time for heavy vehicles, improving safety outcomes and reducing maintenance and repair costs for vehicles and the Council. As costs come down consumers benefit at the till of their local supermarket and exporters become more competitive. These are important benefits for all the community, from the producers to tourists, or the local school bus who will share these roads.”

Federation Council General Manager Adrian Butler said it’s very pleasing for Council to receive this significant funding. “Council has Federation Way as a major upgrade priority as it’s a significant north south arterial through the Council area linking from the Hume Highway in the south near Wangaratta to the Newell at Morundah,” Mr Butler said. “Around 50% of the vehicles are heavy vehicles and this funding will go towards continuing to improve pavement quality and road width, greatly enhancing ride and safety, whilst bringing efficiency and productivity gains also.”

The NSW Restart Fixing Country Roads is a \$543 million program targeted to improve regional interconnectivity and productivity.

BUSHFIRE SMOKE PROMPTS HEALTH WARNING

Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) is urging people, especially those with respiratory conditions such as asthma, to limit their time spent outside as poor air quality continues in parts of the District.

Air quality readings in Albury and Wagga indicate poor quality air, likely due to bushfire smoke drifting into the area.

Director Public Health Tracey Oakman said people with asthma and other lung conditions should not engage in vigorous exercise and, if possible, stay in air-conditioned premises where filtration systems can help to reduce smoke particles in the air.

“Smoke may aggravate existing heart and lung conditions and cause irritated eyes, coughing and wheezing,” Mrs Oakman said.

“Symptoms can occur for several days after smoke is inhaled, so people with chronic respiratory conditions need to be vigilant with their treatment programs.”

“People with asthma or a lung condition who develop symptoms such as shortness of breath, coughing or wheezing, should follow their Asthma or Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) action plan.

“If symptoms do not settle, seek medical advice. If you are on home oxygen treatment, continue as prescribed and if breathlessness worsens, contact your doctor.”

“Healthy adults may also feel the effects of fine particles that can irritate the lungs, so it’s wise to reschedule or cut back on prolonged or strenuous outdoor activities when smoke levels are high.”

Fine smoke particles are known to affect the human breathing system. The smaller or finer the particles, the deeper they go into the lungs.

These particles can cause a variety of health problems, such as itchy or burning eyes, throat irritation, runny nose and illnesses such as bronchitis. Smoke particles can also aggravate existing lung conditions, such as chronic bronchitis, emphysema and asthma.

HOW TO SEEK MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT

People often don't know where to start to get the mental health services they need. Your local GP or other health professionals can help connect you with the right mental health service, says Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD).

"Seeking help is often the first step towards getting and staying well, but it can be hard to know how to start or where to turn," said District Community Mental Health and Drug & Alcohol Manager Alison Thorne.

"It's common to feel unsure and to wonder whether you should try to handle things on your own. It is always ok to ask for help – even if you're not sure you are experiencing a specific mental health problem.

You might want to seek help if you're:

- Worrying more than usual
- Finding it hard to enjoy your life
- Having thoughts and feelings that are difficult to cope with, which have an impact on your day-to-day life
- Interested to find more support or treatment
- Worried about someone that you live with or care for

Anyone in distress who presents at a hospital Emergency Department (ED) in MLHD has access to timely mental health assessment via the Mental Health Emergency Consultation Service (MHECS). MHECS operates out of Wagga Wagga and skilled mental health clinicians provide mental health assessments to people in all EDs across MLHD via videoconference.

Once assessed, the clinician consults with the on-call psychiatrist about the person's ongoing needs. According to their level of risk, the person might need admission to an Acute Mental Health Inpatient Unit (usually Wagga Wagga), admission to the local hospital for a short stay for support and stabilisation, referral to the relevant Community Mental Health team or referral to the person's GP.

MLHD Community Mental Health Drug and Alcohol teams operate an outreach service to all smaller towns across the District. There are six Community Mental Health Drug and Alcohol teams across MLHD – Wagga Wagga, Griffith, Deniliquin, Temora, Young and Tumut - who operate outreach services to all communities.

These teams provide regular visits and includes services across the lifespan, including Specialist Child and Adolescent, Adult and Older Persons clinicians. Referrals to Community Mental Health services can be made via Accessline 1800 800 944.

Accessline provides 24 hour/7 day per week support, advice and referral to mental health and drug

and alcohol services for people anywhere within MLHD.

“Anyone with a mental health issue can use Accessline to speak with a mental health professional and be directed to the right care for them,” Alison said.

Carers, other health professionals and emergency workers can also use Accessline for advice about a person's clinical symptoms, the urgency of the need for care and local treatment options.

If you or someone you care about has a mental health or drug or alcohol problem and you would like to talk to someone, call Accessline on freecall 1800 800 944.

Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network (MPHN) CEO Melissa Neal said that with funding from the Australian Government MPHN commission a variety of mental health services throughout the Murrumbidgee region, which address community needs and the level of care and support individuals may require. All services commissioned by MPHN are free to access.

“We are committed to ensuring people receive the right services at the right time and in the right place, therefore we commission services within a stepped care approach.

“In a stepped care approach, a person seeking support is connected to the services that meet their needs and as their needs change, the services change with them,” Ms Neal said.

Ms Neal said services available include the low intensity program, NewAccess, and moderate to high intensity programs, such as Strong Minds and Well Connected.

In addition, there are telehealth funded services – Connect and Connect for Kids – and local GPs have access to the GP Psychiatry Support Line, which provides support in psychiatric presentations in general practice.

“Suicide prevention is vital. We fund both the Wagga Wagga and Griffith headspace centres, The Way Back Support service, and suicide prevention training – particularly QPR (Question Refer Persuade) online training.

“There are some great online resources including the websites Head to Health and Healthdirect.

“More information about services available across the region and a factsheet is available on our website (mphn.org.au),” Ms Neal said.

Early intervention plays a key role in mental health care which is why the NSW Government is working with its agencies, Commonwealth and local governments, and community organisations to deliver suicide prevention initiatives.

Recently the NSW Government announced \$90 million over the next three years will be invested in a first of its kind Strategic Framework for Suicide Prevention in NSW. The framework will bring a greater focus on building community wellbeing to avoid entering suicidal crises and provide the fundamental principles of suicide prevention to help communities develop essential strategies that meet their own local health care needs.

It's expected initiatives from the Framework will have the biggest impact on suicide in NSW the State has ever seen and will ensure we reduce the number of lives lost to suicide in NSW. These initiatives will be delivered across NSW, including in MLHD. In this year's State Budget people living with mental illness, their families and carers will benefit from a record investment of \$2.1 billion in mental health services and infrastructure.
