Bourkey's Brief

Hello readers,

In Council news, it has been another busy month, with a high number of events held across the region and other council initiatives and projects progressing well.

This month's Council meeting provided the opportunity for discussion and to action valued community projects such as the Oaklands RV Park and Corowa Swimming Pool development. I would encourage all readers to visit Council's website and view the council minutes each month to keep up to date with council business and services.

Also this month, Councillors met with Senior Staff to provide further input into the final details of Council's highest level plans and budget which will set the direction of the new council over the next ten years.

The documents include the 10-year Community Strategic Plan and Long Term Financial Plan, the draft Delivery Program 2018 – 2022, and annual Operational Plan 2018-2019 that will be placed on public exhibition from Friday 25 May - with the exhibition period for submissions closing on Friday 22 June 2018.

At the June Council meeting, to be held on Tuesday 27 June, Council will consider all submissions and adopt a final budget and set of plans for implementation on July 1, 2018.

Roads and economic development were the two strong standouts from the most recent community consultation, and Council's budget is aimed to deliver on those aspects especially.

The largest single item in the budget is allocated towards the Corowa Swimming Pool project, with around \$4 million in grants and reserves available, and Council committing to up to \$4 million in loan funding, to deliver on this valued community project over the next two years.

\$3.8 million in new capital works on roads, announced in last year's budget, is scheduled for delivery in this coming year's budget, as well as a large portion allocated towards continued improvements to Federation Way, being a key arterial route through the council area. In total, over \$8.2 million is proposed to be allocated across many road projects, including \$1.3 million towards further improvements to the freight network around Boree Creek, which is largely grant funded. Other big-ticket items in the roads area include \$650,000 for road widening and sealing and rehabilitation to continue the work to bring Bull Plain Road to a suitable standard. There are many other projects across the towns and villages, including improvements to stormwater drainage, roads, and the footpath network.

Council is encouraging residents to have their say on these draft documents and will be hosting community meetings across the local government area this week. If you are unable to attend the meetings, you are still encouraged to make a submission to be put to Council for consideration before final adoption. Further details and information on how you can make a submission in relation to Council's high level plans and draft budget is on pages 7 and 8. of this month's newsletter.

In keeping with the events storybook theme, children from across the region arrived at the Corowa Race Course dressed as their favourite storybook characters. The costume parade provided an opportunity for children to come together and proudly show off their great costumes to festival goers.

PJ Masks were a huge hit and hundreds of excited children patiently waited to meet and have their photo taken with the popular characters.

The Vegetable Plot band entertained the audience throughout the day, bringing lots of energy and humour to the main stage. The event also showcased a variety of local emerging artists, whose talents were on display throughout the day on the main stage and buskers circuits.

DRAFT AGEING WELL STRATEGY ON DISPLAY

Federation Council has worked in partnership with the community to develop its draft Ageing Well Strategy, which was endorsed by Council for public exhibition at the May Ordinary Council Meeting. The strategy will support positive ageing in the Federation Council area by ensuring suitable services and facilities are in place to meet the changing needs of an ageing population.

With the population of the Federation Council area being older and ageing faster than the regional, state and national average, preparing the Ageing Well Strategy was identified by Council as a key step in proactively supporting communities to continue to thrive.

The strategy will assist Council to;

- Understand the changing needs of the various communities within Federation Council.
- Direct its investment in infrastructure, service provision, programs and resources to support healthy ageing and meet community needs.
- Advocate for, and develop integrated responses to, issues outside of Council's control where Council may lead or partner with other organisations.

Council has worked closely with a number of local senior residents who were engaged as Ageing Well Ambassadors and played an integral role in the development of the strategy. The ambassadors included Stan Bromley, Ida Mensforth, Wendy Eyers, Judith Barber, Jenny Enever, Mike Gardiner, Liz Seeliger, Jan Doyle, Jeanette Smith, Yvonne Perrin and Jenny Hearn.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke has praised the efforts of the ambassadors, who have provided a great level of support to the project.

"We are really pleased to have had passionate and capable residents involved in preparing a document that provides some strong and very clear direction for council," he said.

"In preparing the strategy, there was also extensive engagement with key stakeholders and the wider community and we thank all those who took the time to offer valuable input."

An extensive review and stakeholder engagement process was undertaken to inform the development of the strategy, including literature reviews, focus groups, service provider interviews, a community survey, development of a background paper and consultation with key council staff. The draft Ageing Well Strategy is currently available for the community to view and Council is seeking feedback until 5pm Wednesday 13 June.

COUNCIL EXHIBITION OF DRAFT 2018/19 OPERATIONAL PLAN, DELIVERY PROGRAM 2018 – 2022 AND COMMUNITY STRATEGIC PLAN

Federation Councillors met with Senior Staff on Monday night to provide further input into the final details of Council's highest level plans and budget which will set the direction of the new council over the next ten years.

The documents include the 10-year Community Strategic Plan and Long Term Financial Plan, the draft Delivery Program 2018 – 2022, and annual Operational Plan 2018-2019 that will be placed on public exhibition from Friday 25 May - with the exhibition period for submissions closing on Friday 22 June 2018.

At the June Council meeting, to be held on Tuesday 27 June, Council will consider all submissions and adopt a final budget and set of plans for implementation on July 1, 2018.

Mayor Pat Bourke said Council's key draft documents are directly informed by the community and contain the priorities and actions that Council considers are the key deliverables for the communities across the entire Federation Local Government Area.

The Community Strategic Plan contains the vision 'Federation will be home to a community rich in spirit, thriving through the opportunities of our unique history, rural landscapes and waterways.' and also the many objectives and actions, are based on the themes of:

- 1. **Built Federation:** Maintained and improved infrastructure that meets the needs of residents and industry.
- 2. **Economic Federation:** Growing, progressive and prosperous communities that build on sustainable manufacturing, agriculture and tourism, close proximity to other centres on both sides of the Murray and affordability.
- 3. **Natural Federation:** Sustainable rural landscapes and waterways offering tranquillity and attractive recreational spaces.
- 4. **Social Federation:** Close-knit and welcoming communities where people come together and support each other.
- 5. **Well-Governed Federation:** Strong civic leadership and governance supporting equity across communities and effective communication with residents.

Roads and economic development were the two strong standouts from the most recent community consultation, and Council's budget is aimed to deliver on those aspects especially.

The largest single item in the budget is allocated towards the Corowa Swimming Pool project, with around \$4 million in grants and reserves available, and Council committing to up to \$4 million in loan funding, to deliver on this valued community project over the next two years.

\$3.8 million in new capital works on roads, announced in last year's budget, is scheduled for delivery in this coming year's budget, as well as a large portion allocated towards continued improvements to Federation Way, being a key arterial route through the council area. In total, over \$8.2 million is proposed to be allocated across many road projects, including \$1.3 million towards further improvements to the freight network around Boree Creek, which is largely grant funded. Other big-ticket items in the roads area include \$650,000 for road widening and sealing and rehabilitation to continue the work to bring Bull Plain Road to a suitable standard. In addition to this, there are various bitumen re-seals and patching programs to continue the work on maintaining the sealed road network, along with funds for gravel re-sheeting and unsealed roads maintenance. Major renewal works are also funded in Betterment Parade/Wanstead and John Street in Corowa to continue that work. There are many other projects across the towns and villages, including improvements to stormwater drainage, roads, and the footpath network.



This current year is the last year that residents in the former Corowa Shire area are subjected to the special rate increase applied over the last four years. The State Government has advised the rate pegging limit for 2018/19 is 2.3%, being the maximum increase allowed on general rates. Council has budgeted in the draft budget of applying the 2.3% on a flat rate across all rate categories. Council has committed to undertaking a full rate review across the entire Council area to commence in 2018/19. However, the NSW Governments commitment to communities in merged councils means that councils cannot increase general rates, by any more than the rate pegging amount for the first four years of a merger. This means that any increases over and above the rate peg would not be effective until 2020/21.

Other increases to fees and charges remain steady with increases consistent with the rate peg increase, excepting for a proposed increase of around 8%, or \$25 per year per bin, in collection charges, for residents with recycling. In non-recycling areas, the same bin charge of \$300 per bin per annum applies. No increases are proposed to the residents that only receive an ordinary waste pick up, and the waste levy of currently \$45 per assessment, is proposed to remain at \$45.

No changes are proposed to headwork's charges for development in areas such as Water and Sewer charges. An Economic Incentives program is being developed to encourage further development and to somewhat offset the DSP charges. Council also has increased staffing in this area and has adopted a new plan and strategy to allow more effective delivery of economic development outcomes.

Following the workshop on Monday night Mayor Pat Bourke thanked fellow Councillors and staff for their work in preparing the draft budget and set of plans.

"To compile the draft budget and set of council plans requires a huge amount of work and I would like to highlight the efforts of all involved," he said.

"Considering the other works underway currently made possible from merger funding and additional recent grant funding Council staff have done extremely well to deliver these draft documents to the Council and the community for their consideration.

"I think the budget has a good spread of projects across the entire local government area and Council will continue to lobby the State Government for an increased share of the taxes and contributions made from the Federation Council area, to continue to try and ease the burden on the ratepayers and deliver our many services."

HOUSEHOLD WASTE COLLECTION 2018

Council will be collecting domestic inert household waste on the following dates.

The maximum amount to be collected from each residence will be limited to one 6' X 4' box trailer load. All items are to be placed on the nature strip in a clear space and should not impede pedestrians.

Council will collect white goods and up to 4 car tyres from each residence. Council will only remove these items if a booking has been made by contacting council prior to the nominated date.

Residents have the option to take their hard waste to the Oaklands landfill site on Tuesday 26th June, during normal tip operating hours and Urana on Friday 29th June. The maximum amount to be collected from each residence will be limited to one 6' X 4' box trailer load. Please note this is also free of charge.

NO Fibro Sheeting , Greenwaste, Hazardous Materials, liquids or Asbestos to be collected.

Hard waste material to be placed neatly on nature strip by 8.00 am each day.



NSW CONSERVATION GRANTS FOR LANDHOLDERS

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin announced that applications are open for \$2 million in grants to support conservation by private landholders in NSW.

Mr Aplin said the Conservation Partner Grants, offered through the Biodiversity Conservation Trust (BCT) are intended to help private landholders maintain the ecological values of their property.

"Funding is available for things like fencing, weed control, introduced pest animal control, supplementary planting and habitat restoration," Mr Aplin said.

"This program is part of the NSW Government's commitment through the BCT to support and encourage landholders to conserve and manage biodiversity on private land."

Minister for the Environment, Gabrielle Upton said the opening of this program for applications followed the NSW Government's unprecedented investment of \$240 million over five years, and \$70 million per year ongoing, in private land conservation as part of the land management and biodiversity conservation reforms.

"The not-for-profit Biodiversity Conservation Trust will offer \$37 million for programs in 2018," Ms Upton said.

"This will deliver major benefits to the environment and support landholders to carry out important conservation management on their properties."

Landholders with a conservation agreement or wildlife refuge agreement with the BCT that do not receive annual conservation management payments are eligible to apply for grants. Landholders participating in the Community Environment Network's Land for Wildlife program or Humane Society International's Wildlife Land Trust program are also eligible to apply.



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

SEVEN NEW SCHOOL ZONE TRAFFIC OFFENCES



To help schools keep the school zone safer for all pedestrians and drivers there are seven new traffic infringements with new fines.

None of the seven offences attract demerit points when committed elsewhere on the road but in a school zone they each come with two points.

The changes are:

- Stopping in intersection Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- Stop within 20m of intersection (traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demeritpoints.
- Stop within 10m of intersection (no traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demeritpoints.
- Stop near bicycle crossing lights Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$330 and 2 demerit points.
- Not parallel park in the direction of travel Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
- Parallel park close to dividing line Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.




