# MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR - PAT BOURKE

Dear Readers,

Welcome to the May edition of the Urana District Newsletter. Isn't it great to see the sensational start we are having to the growing season, with showers of rain continuing.

This month we are travelling from Mulwala to Morundah to engage with the community on a number of key strategic documents, as well as on our rates harmonization project, economic strategy development, and our 2021-2022 annual budget.

Under next year's proposed budget, Council will complete \$16M in capital projects. We will deliver \$6.5M in road works, and \$5.8M on our sewerage and water network.

In addition, Council will deliver:

- \$2.7M Cullivel Road Urana Upgrade.
- \$2.6M Corowa Foreshore Upgrade.
- \$10.6M Corowa Saleyards Project.
- \$3.3M Corowa to Mulwala Cycleway.

I encourage you to view the draft budget, and draft delivery program so you can review what Council plans to deliver for the 2021-2022 year.

Council invites feedback on the draft documents from all interested stakeholders and members of the community before 5pm Tuesday, 1 June. Feedback is encouraged to be provided via the online form on Council's website www.federationcouncil.nsw.gov.au

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all members of the public for coming together to honor the fallen on Anzac Day. It was certainly a special occasion being able to be together again in person following the Covid restrictions last year. Thank you to the local school students and community groups who helped ensure the various ceremonies held across the region were the success that they were.

## COUNCIL ADOPTS DRAFT BUDGET AND STRATEGIC PLANS

Combined, these documents provide a guide to Council's operations and help the organisation meet community demands for services and infrastructure by maximising what it can achieve with its available resources.

In endorsing the plans, Federation Council Mayor Patrick Bourke said the overall plans primary focus was to ensure Council services are sustainable into the future, while delivering on the many major projects outlined in the Community Strategic Plan.

"Council is pleased to adopt, and in turn present for community feedback its draft 2021/2022 Operational Plan, 2018-2022 Delivery Program and Financial Plans," Mayor Bourke said.

"Under the proposed budget Council will complete \$16M in capital projects. We will continue to deliver \$6.5M in road works, and \$5.8M on our sewerage and water network."

Mayor Bourke said Council's budget is delivering on the improvement to roads and the community facilities that the community expressed their requests for in the development of the Community Strategic Plan – Our Community Our Opportunity, developed under extensive community consultation in 2017. "Since the formation of Federation Council in 2016, Council has worked extensively to deliver a range of new community infrastructure projects, as well as complete a monumental number of internal system upgrades and projects to provide a strong foundation for the new Council moving forward," he said.

"Council as a result of the \$10 million dollar Stronger Communities Fund (merger funds) as well as many other grants since then including from the Stronger County Communities Grant Program, COVID Stimulus, Drought Funding and other grants, has invested in many new. and or upgraded community assets right across the Council region. These include Skate Parks, Tennis and Netball Courts, Boat Ramps, extensive playgrounds, a new \$10.5 million dollar year round pool in Corowa, additions to and the list goes This is also enhancing the areas on. reputation for liveability greatly. Council has also undertaken significant investment into its roads and related infrastructure network, however there remains a significant challenge in managing these assets with current revenue levels."

Mayor Bourke said Council as a business has experienced rapid changes and growth since its creation, with both former Councils having historically low rate bases and disproportionate asset bases to population levels.

"These challenges include a road network of 2322 km of roads broken into 964 km of sealed roads and 1,358 km of gravel roads," he said.

"Council also due to having 14 towns and villages, have a large amount of relatively low usage but high priority to the community, facilities, such as Halls, Courts and Ovals. These are spread across the towns and villages of Corowa, Howlong, Mulwala, Urana, Balldale, Boree Creek, Buraja-Lowesdale, Coreen, Daysdale, Morundah, Oaklands, Rand, Rennie and Savernake. Council also has varying service levels across each of these facilities.

"Council is continually working on initiatives and strategies focused on improving the long-term sustainability of the Council. Key to this is the delivery of the recommendations and action plans developed through the merger-funded Asset Management and Long Term Financial Planning Services Model - completed in the 2019/20 financial year. The objective of this project was to integrate Council's asset management planning and whole-of-life costings into service costings to enable more robust long term financial planning to be undertaken. This work is continuina."

Mayor Bourke said Council understands very clearly where their financial risks are, and have a plan for the next 10 years to ensure the Council continues to provide a high level of services to the community.

"While the Merger Funding has delivered some excellent facilities for our community, we need to ensure we can afford to maintain and operate them and we can't afford to keep buying new facilities without a revenue source to operate them. Over the next 12 months Council is committed to engaging with the community to discuss an array of options on how Council increases its revenue to meet community expectations."

In closing, Mayor Bourke said that Council had some challenges to reach a point of sustainability into the future, and planning well for maintenance and operations of assets was critical.

"This budget presents a vision for the long-term and a strong starting point for us to have conversations with our community about service expectations and subsequent costs associated with them," he said.

"Community feedback has been consistently positive in respect to the investment made by the NSW Government and Federation Council since the merger. displaying to Council our communities desires to continue to further invest in the area to improve the liveability and provide economic stimulus to the region through the creation and ongoing maintenance of such assets. Council is committed to working with the community to sustain this type of growth for the betterment of Council's communities into the future. with a strong focus on how to continue funding the creation and ongoing asset life cost of our growing asset base and services."

The NSW Government is making the planning system easier to use with the introduction of the online NSW Planning Portal.

The NSW Planning Portal is a digital space where community, industry and government can work together to better understand and meet their obligations under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

The portal is a single place to go for planning processes and transactions online, it is simpler, faster and more transparent for everyone.

It can be used to lodge and process Development Applications (DA's) including modifications, Complying Development Certificate Applications (CDC's) and for certificates under Part 6 of the EP&A Act).

From Thursday 1 July 2021, it will be mandatory to lodge your Development Applications (DA), Construction Certificates (CC) and Complying Development Applications (CDC) via the online NSW Planning Portal.

# FIREWOOD COLLECTION



Residents in the Federation Council area can apply to obtain a permit to collect firewood from road reserves for home heating during winter. Firewood collection is limited to 1 April – 30 September each year.

To apply for a permit, residents must complete the application form and show proof that they reside in the Federation Council area (i.e. drivers licence). Applicants must certify on the application that they will abide by the permit conditions and acknowledge that Council is not liable for any injuries to person, or any loss or damage to property arising from the firewood collection activities. Applications received from outside the Federation Council area will not be considered.

Residents will need to apply for a permit each firewood season (each year).

The permit application fee is \$31.00.

# FREE ONLINE FOOD SAFETY TRAINING




Federation Council take food hygiene within our region very seriously. All food businesses have obligations and Council is assisting food businesses to meet their obligations by providing free access to online food safety training.

# RATES HARMONISATION PROJECT UPDATE



Federation Council is required to create one general rate structure for the previous Corowa Shire Council and Urana Shire Council.

This rates harmonisation process is:

- A requirement of the NSW Office Local Government under the Local Government Act 1993;
- Harmonisation must be effective from 1 July 2021 for the 2021-22 Rate year;
- Corowa Shire Council's and Urana Shire Council's rating structures

varied greatly and the harmonisation project has at tempted to realign to a common rate structure, that is fairer to all Federation Council ratepayers.

The harmonisation process takes the current total general rate and apportions it differently across revised subcategories designed to reflect the diversity of the merged councils. The result is that the total rates revenue for Federation Council remains the same.

Council will be providing ratepayers with the opportunity to 'Have Your Say' following a number of community sessions in May. Council welcomes and values feedback on the proposed new rating structure and we will be updating you regularly via our website, on social media, through the local media and our monthly newsletters on how you can provide feedback on the proposed options for Council consideration.

## URANA LOCAL HEALTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Well here we are again for another year. Things have been fairly quiet, however, lets hope that things begin to get back to normal for 2021.

As an LHAC we have still been working quietly behind the scenes. Our COAG 19/2 fund and committee, of which, as LHAC Chair, I am a member, is helping to provide the Urana MPS and the community with much needed items for the welfare of the community and the patients and residents of the MPS and Colombo Lodge. For those who don't know a COAG fund is a Federal Government initiative, that allows a limited number of elligiable facilities to make use of medicare benefits that would normally go back to the government. In simple terms, when a doctor is called to emergency he is bulk billed, instead of the benefit going back to the government after the doctor is paid, it is paid into a specific account, the COAG 19/2 account, for the use of the local hospital and the community. At present we have made a request to purchase a publically accessable Defibulator machine for the community. But the fund has also helped pay for , a blanket warmer, new wheel chairs, certain medical trollies and a mobile proceedure light just name a few. These funds are a huge benefit to the facilities that have them. Urana is very lucky to be incuded. Along with organisations like the Hospital Auxiliary it helps fill gaps in funding and provide a higher standard of care for the community.

As some mav remember from December. last we had been told that we would aettina a draft copy for comment of the new service plan



for the Urana MPS. Well, that has not eventuated.

In typical beurocratic fashion there have been delays and excuses as to why it has still not been released for comment. While I will not go into the specific excuses for the delay in not just our LHAC ,but the community in general, have not been able to see the plan, they are not what I personally would consider valid. In as much as they are fine details which to our mind has no bearing on what the new facility may look like or the services it may or may not provide. It is disapointing to say the least and patience is running very thin. With the Urana MPS being one of the original in the pilot for MPS's it is in serious need of upgrade. This does not only put residents and patients at risk, but also does not provide staff with a decent working environment. On that note, our facility manager and all her staff along with our GP Dr Giri do an amazing job and are extreemly dedicated . They make do often under the most trying circumstances. So hats off to all the Urana MPS and Community Health workers who just keep on keeing on. Dr Giri derserves our thanks and support for his dedication, especially over the last year and a half, which I am sure have been very trying from a professional and

personal perspective. We as an LHAC owe it to them to do our best to see the prospect of a new facilty come to fruition. It is now quite some time since our community survey higlighted the needs of the community . As an LHAC we are continually working to see that the needs of this community are met. We have had some success. Some things we are still fighting for.

Some who have been to the MPS of late may have noticed some building going on. Our facility manager was successful in gaining a grant to build a special Palliative Care room at the MPS. One that will allow families etc to stay with loved ones in their last days. Well done to her for doing the hard yards to get it done as our staff do a fantastic iob in the area of Palliative Care and the rooms are much needed. Lets just hope however, that such large capitol expenditure does not delay the plans for the rest of the MPS. It would not be the first time I personally have seen this happen. But in general, its time to stop putting"patches on patches". The Urana and surrounding districts deserve better, as do the staff who work in the MPS.





## **URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE**

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
