Hello readers, and welcome to the November edition of the Urana District Newsletter.

It has been another extremely busy month across the Council area. Some rains occurring here and there has put some feed about for stock but too late for crops unfortunately but at least not as dusty as it could be going into December.

As shown in the Newsletter, a fantastic weekend was held in

Urana over the 20th and 21st October with the Annual Vintage Machinery Club Rally, and the accompanying Art Sale, held on the Thursday prior, and the Hospital Auxiliary Fete on the Sunday. I attended all days and I think the committees would agree, that all events were very vibrant and well attended. I think the creation of some new aspects to them all this year, made even more come along. I look forward to next year being the 20th year which I am told by Kevin Elphick and his team will be bigger and better.

A great thank you to the Council staff over many areas, including the Presentation Parks and Gardens crews, the Water and Sewer teams, and our road crews. The public areas despite the dry times have never looked better, and the dry times at least have made a major amount of road works be possible. The works out the Rand Bidgeemia Road and Bull Plain Oaklands to Mulwala are all underway and will provide major improvements to safety. The town street sealing programs also make a difference.

The recent Youth Council initiative 'Flicks in the Sticks' drought movie night held in Oaklands was a major success, and provided a great opportunity for our residents to come together and support one another. A further opportunity for this type of engagement is also set to occur in Urana on December 5, with the Riverina Rural Women's Dinner and Workshop. Find out more information on the upcoming event in this month's newsletter. Council is proud to lead and support such initiatives to show our strong support for the drought-affected farmers and farming communities.

The November Council meeting was held earlier this week, and was possibly the largest agenda for the year. Councils auditors were present to report on the 2017/18 financial year, which showed another solid performance by Council.

Council also received a report on the Stronger Community grants program, outlining that the Minor Grants Round One consisted of 18 Projects with a total expenditure of \$611,968. As at end October 2018 all 18 projects have been successfully completed. This has been an enormous effort by Councils Merger Project Management team, along with many volunteers, Contractors, and Council staff. The projects are providing fantastic benefits to the areas where

they have been constructed. Round Two consisted of 13 Projects with a current allocation of \$276,006. As at end October 2018, 8 projects have been successfully completed with 4 nearing completion and 1 project requiring further financial consideration from Council and this has now been approved.

The Stronger Communities Major Projects consisted of 15 Projects with a current allocation of \$8,859,434. Many of these are underway or due to commence, and in planning, and required further funding once final scoping occurred. Council has wisely kept a contingency amount for this purpose and this will ensure the project delivery achieves the best possible outcomes. The staff are placing an enormous effort into the project delivery and whilst we know that there are many projects still to be delivered, I think we also need to reflect on what has been achieved in such a short time of the creation of Federation Council. The creation of a new Council, whilst delivering day to day services that most take for granted, is no easy feat and then additionally, working to deliver over 50 new, one off projects, many of them major. Council like the Community looks forward to seeing plenty more projects hit the ground in 2019.

reserve. Students were shown a number of scar trees and learned how bark was cut off gum trees to make coolamons, shields and canoes. The children were interested to learn that the vanilla scented wildflower called the chocolate lily (that grows locally around the district) was an important food source for aboriginal people. They roasted and ate the tubers of the plant.

To determine which birds and animals inhabit the reserve students looked for clues including scats, feathers and bones. They sighted 2 goannas, a few swamp wallabies and evidence of hares, echidnas. They even found a fox skeleton.

The children were interested to learn that miners lived at the reserve in the 1860's and they saw evidence in the form of old iron remnants, wash tubs and glass. Redlands Hill Reserve was virtually cleared for gold mining but little gold was found. Fortunately the plant life recovered and the 150 acre reserve is now a flourishing Grey Box Grassy Woodland which is an Endangered Ecological Community.



Government Assistance



Transport Subsidy Emergency Drought Relief

1. Objectives

To provide a subsidy on the transport of fodder and/or water to a property, stock to/from agistment and stock to sale or slaughter.

2. Assistance available

A transport subsidy of up to 50% of the total freight cost is available to eligible primary producers to a maximum of \$5 per kilometre (GST exclusive) to a maximum eligible distance of 1,500 kilometres.

\$20,000 is available per eligible farm business per year which equates up to \$30,000 over 18 months from 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2019.

Payments can be made on receipt of eligible tax invoices which demonstrate transport occurring between 1 January 2018 and 30 June 2019.

3. Eligibility

To be eligible for assistance you must declare that:

- They are the owner and operator of a farm business in NSW, and
- They as a sole trader, partnership, trust or private company and trades agricultural products, and
- The business is registered with the Australian Taxation Office as a primary producer, and have an Australian Business Number (ABN), and
- d) The owners and operators of the business earn more than 50% of their gross income from the primary production enterprise under normal seasonal circumstances. Applications from new entrants will be considered on a case by case basis; or
- e) The owners and operators of the business have commenced their farming operation between 1 July 2015 and 30 June 2018 and 50% of their gross income will be derived from the farm business within three years of the date of the application.
- The business is being negatively impacted by drought conditions, and
- g) The owners and operators of the business do not have gross off-farm assets exceeding \$5,000,000 (excluding funds in a registered superannuation fund).

4. Eligible Costs

- a) Transporting of stock to agistment.
- b) Returning stock from agistment.
- c) Transport of stock to sale or slaughter.
- d) Transport of fodder for stock to properties.
- e) Transport of stock drinking water.

5. General guidelines

- Expenses incurred over an 18 month period from the 01 January 2018 will be eligible under this subsidy.
- b) Subsidy will be paid for transport at a rate of 50% of the total amount paid to the carrier or costs for an owner carrier. If the transport rates are considered excessive the subsidy paid is 50% of the approved ruling rate schedule.
- Subsidy applies to the loaded portion of the journey only.
- Invoices submitted with the application have not been used to secure funding under any other Government Scheme.
- Subsidy applies on the cartage of fodder/water from the closest practical available source.
- The amount to be paid is the GST exclusive amount.
- g) Subsidy is not to be used for the transport of stock that are not fit to travel. Stock owners must always comply with the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979.
- There are also restrictions on the amount that owner carriers can claim per kilometre per transportation as per the following ruling rate schedule:

11. To apply

Applications for assistance under the program must be made on RAA's application form and be accompanied by the documentation stated in the application form.

Complete applications will be assessed in order of receipt. Incomplete applications will not enter the assessment queue until all required information is provided.



Our committee and members thank everybody for their support over the weekend.



HIV TESTING KEY TO EARLY DIAGNOSIS

With almost half of all people diagnosed with HIV in the late stage of infection, Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) is marking HIV Awareness Week by urging those at risk to be regularly tested.

During HIV Awareness Week (23-30 November) and in the lead up to World AIDS Day on 1 December, MLHD is reminding people to test for HIV with various high quality HIV testing options now available.

In 2018-19, NSW Health is investing \$21.9 million in services to strengthen HIV testing, treatment and prevention.

MLHD's HIV & Related Programs Unit (HARP) Manager Alison Nikitas said NSW is on track to achieving its goal of virtually eliminating HIV transmission by 2020, with a 21 per cent drop in the number of new diagnoses in NSW.

"We want to see this downward trend continue and urge anyone at risk of HIV to ensure they are regularly tested," Alison said.

"Once a person is diagnosed, they can start treatment early, improve their health and prevent the virus from being passed on to others."

From January to June 2018, 131 NSW residents presented with a newly diagnosed HIV infection compared with 167 during the same period in 2013-2017, according to the NSW HIV Data Report.

"This reduction is due to more people seeking early testing and treatment, as well as the introduction of pre-exposure prophylaxis for HIV (PrEP)," Alison said.

PrEP, the use of medications to prevent HIV in those at risk, is also used traditionally to treat the infection. It is available on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme.

"The highly successful NSW Health EPIC-NSW trial made PrEP available to 9,414 people at risk of HIV from 1 March 2016 to 30 April 2018."

The data also shows that in the first half of 2018 there were 49 per cent fewer Australian-born men having sex with men diagnosed with early stage HIV infection, compared to the same period over the past five years.

"HIV in overseas-born men who have sex with men as well as heterosexual men, is often diagnosed late, which can lead to avoidable HIV-related illness," Alison said.

COMMUNITY INVITED TO MLHD ANNUAL PUBLIC MEETING

Every 24 hours in Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD), six babies are born, three people die, 13 people are hospitalised due to an injury, 407 people present to emergency departments and 41 elective surgery procedures are performed.

MLHD will highlight its achievements of 2017-18 at its Annual Public Meeting in Corowa on **Tuesday 27 November**, with all community members invited to attend.

Keynote speaker will be NSW Cross-Border Commissioner James McTavish on the topic Service Delivery in Cross-Border Communities – Challenges and Opportunities.

Chief Executive Jill Ludford said this year she was particularly proud of the achievements of MLHD staff and services recognised on the statewide stage.

"For an unprecedented three years in a row, a Wagga Wagga Base Hospital (WWBH) Junior Medical Officer was awarded the NSW State Junior Doctor of the Year," Ms Ludford said.

Dr Thomas Melhuish was recognised at the NSW Health and Australian Medical Association's 2017 Doctor-In-Training Awards for his leadership, clinical excellence and passionate dedication to rural health.

The WWBH Stroke Unit was ranked the best in NSW for access to care, early rehabilitation and patient education in the 2017 Stroke Foundation audit of 44 NSW hospital services.

"We are also leading the way in the introduction of new services for our communities," Ms Ludford said.

MLHD launched the first public hospital service in regional NSW to provide access to surgical weight loss management and also a new midwifery led maternity service in Leeton to provide coordinated care for normal risk women to birth in their local hospital.

Health services were supported with significant infrastructure works, including early works for the third and final Stage of the \$431 million Wagga Wagga Base Hospital redevelopment and master planning for Stage 1 works on the \$35 million Griffith Base Hospital redevelopment.

"We continue our focus on community engagement and our Local Health Advisory Committees are actively engaged in health promotion and community education," Ms Ludford said.

Two forums helped members develop skills to actively advocate for their communities and educate local people about how to access local services.

Ms Ludford thanked all health staff who have worked extremely hard over the year providing high quality services to patients and clients.

"I am passionate about ensuring every patient who comes in contact with us has a positive experience that contributes toward their comfort, recovery and wellbeing," she said.

Ms Ludford also thanked members of the Local Health Service Advisory Committees, MPS Committees, Hospital Auxiliaries and Hospital Volunteers who play a crucial role in local health care.

"These volunteers work behind the scenes to help make our health services the wonderful asset they are, and I can't thank them enough," she said.
