### COUNCIL AWARDS COMMUNITY GRANTS



Council awarded \$30,000 to local community organisations via its Community Grants Program at its October meeting of Council.

The Community Grants Program supports initiatives that deliver a range of social and economic benefits to communities across the Federation Council area. The program provides a more streamlined approach to supporting local community groups, organisations and clubs with delivering community projects and events.

Two rounds are facilitated each year, with a total amount of \$60,000 available to fund one-off projects through one of the nine focus categories:

- Arts And Culture;
- Events & Tourism;
- Community Work and Welfare;
- Skill Development and Learning;
- Health Promotion;
- Accessibility and Inclusion;
- Young People;
- Senior Residence; and
- Children and Families.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke congratulated grant recipients.

"I would like to take this opportunity to formally thank all community organisations that submitted an application, and congratulate those who were successful," he said.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council. We see this program as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height."

Mayor Bourke said the grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact.

"I look forward to seeing projects developed by the community, for the community delivered in the near future," he said.

Round One of the 2022/2023 Community Grants Program opened on Monday, 8 August 2022 and closed on Friday, 16 September 2022. Community Grant Funding was awarded to the following community organisations for the purposes outlined:

• \$1,000 cash contribution for the Corowa Festival of Dance to support the cost of a band at the Tuesday 8th November Afternoon Dance.

- \$1,850 cash contribution for the Oaklands and District Lions to assist with the cost of traffic management and catering at the Santa in the Park event.
- \$1,000 cash contribution for the Khaki Vehicle Enthusiasts to fund merchandise at the 43rd Annual Corowa Swim-In and Military Vehicle Gathering.
- \$2,000 cash contribution for the Rivereens to assist with the set-up cost to enable them to run community music programs.
- \$2,500 cash contribution to the Upper Murray Quirky Events Inc to assist with the establishment of the Art, Craft, and Model Railway Exhibition.
- \$1,000 cash contribution for the Morundah Bush Entertainment Committee Incorporated to host the Melbourne Grammar School Symphony Orchestra Tour at the Paradise Palladium Theatre.
- \$2,700 cash contribution for the Savernake School of Arts Committee to host the Small Halls Festival in 2023.
- \$2,000 cash contribution to Corowa High School P&C to enable the Breakfast Club to supply other foods (e.g. Fresh fruit) to meet students' nutritional needs and support healthy food and lifestyle choices.
- \$2,100 cash contribution to the Corowa Vintage Machinery Club to assist with the cost of the Wood-grub Block power connection at their clubhouse.

- \$2,200 cash contribution for the Corowa Business Chamber - Corowa Events to assist with the cost of hosting the Corowa Christmas Festival including music, markets, and activities.
- \$2,200 cash contribution for the Howlong Golf Club to assist with the cost of hosting Carols by Candlelight for the community over the Christmas period.
- \$1,442 refund of Development Application Fees to the Urana Progress Association Inc. Under Council's Financial Assistance and Donations Policy approved DA reimbursements can go through the Community Grants Process.
- \$2,500 cash contribution to the Country Women's Association of New South Wales Oaklands Branch to assist with the establishment of a Rural Woman's Dinner in Oaklands.
- \$3,000 cash contribution for the Mulwala Progress Association to support the cost of the installation of updated signage at the front of Tunzafun.
- \$2,500 cash contribution for the Howlong Little Athletics to support the cost of the installation of a sunshade at Lowe Square.

### COUNCIL HOSTS SENIOR LEADERS TOUR



Federation Council recently welcomed many senior leaders to the Federation region as part of the Department of Regional NSW's Riverina Murray Tour.

The Senior Leaders Tour commenced in Corowa, where guests attended a Welcome Reception Dinner at the Corowa RSL Club.

The Senior Leaders Tour involved NSW Government senior executives representing all cross-agencies except Transport who were a late unavoidable apology, to gain a deeper understanding and have the value of place-based responses to improve outcomes for industry, businesses, and communities to enable a deeper understanding of liveability issues facing the Riverina Murray region during the four day tour.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said a major focus of the tour and of specific importance to the Federation Council community and neighbouring Councils including our Victorian Councils, was around cross border impacts. "This tour allowed the attendees to gain a deeper understanding and have the value of place-based responses to improve outcomes for industry, businesses, and communities to enable a deeper understanding of liveability issues facing the Riverina Murray region," he said.

"Council's Director of Development and Environmental Services, Ms Susan Appleyard, was able to deliver an excellent presentation on the challenges facing Federation Council in the areas of infrastructure development, inhibiting growth, and provide Council's developing Growth Strategy as the way forward, albeit recognising the significant infrastructure spending required over the next 10 to 20 years especially. Public Works NSW and Crown Lands were key interested agencies in this presentation and offered their assistance going forward."

Mayor Bourke said attendees also appreciated the opportunity to see the Federation region first hand, noting our amazing cropping country and tourism assets.

"Council was also able to note the many challenges facing Council's road network, and calling in to see first hand what Government funding and public money can do when combined," he said.

"I would like to take this opportunity to thank all senior leaders who attended and travelled throughout the Federation Council area, as well as Council staff and my fellow Councillors who provided a wealth of knowledge and details about the opportunities and challenges our region faces."

### COUNCIL WELCOMES FUNDING OPPORTUNITY TO FIX POTHOLES ON REGIONAL ROADS

Federation Council has confirmed it will apply for a share of \$50 million in funding to help regional and rural councils fix the increasing number of potholes brought on by this year's extreme wet weather.

The NSW Liberal and Nationals Government announced funding will be made available under the Fixing Local Roads Pothole Repair Round for 95 regional councils and authorities to help repair potholes on regional and local roads.

Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Sam Farraway said NSW has had more than its fair share of natural disasters and extreme weather and that more than 135,000 potholes have been repaired on State roads in regional NSW since February. "We certainly have plenty more potholes that still require attention, particularly on council-managed roads, which is why our Government is putting more money on the table for councils to repair potholes on the roads regional communities use every day," Mr Farraway said.

"This funding is available to help every regional council across the state to carry out emergency repairs and would fix roughly more than 420,000 potholes on their roads."

Federation Council Mayor, Pat Bourke

said the funding announcement was welcoming news and confirmed Federation Council would be lodging an application.

"Council appreciates the funding that has been offered to assist us in our flood recovery efforts," Mayor Bourke said.

"We need to start somewhere, and this fund will enable us to do that. We still have a long way to go, with the damage bill within our LGA expected to be in the millions. Throughout my time in Local Government, I have never seen our roads in such a state following widespread flooding and years of consistent wet weather conditions. We will continue to inspect road damage and advocate to our State and Federal members for more funding opportunities for our regions."

The new funding builds on the \$500 million invested by the NSW Government through the Fixing Local Roads program to help regional councils repair, maintain and seal local roads across the state.

Applications for funding are now open with funding expected to be announced in November so councils can begin work as soon as possible.

### **JAPANESE ENCEPHALITIS**

NSW Health has advised our community to take steps to protect ourselves and each other from Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV) and other mosquito-borne diseases. JEV spreads to people from infected mosquitoes. In rare cases, it can cause severe illness and long-term health problems. Federation Council has been identified as an area of higher risk for JEV.

The wet weather, together with warmer temperatures, means the risk of mosquito-borne diseases is expected to increase in the weeks and months ahead. It is important to act now to protect ourselves and reduce the risk of mosquitoes and JEV in our community by:

- Getting vaccinated
- Keep your property safe from mosquitoes
- Prevent mosquito bites

If we all take these small steps, we can help make sure that all of us and our community stay safe. The latest information can be found at health.nsw.gov.au.

Federation Council wishes to remind all landowners that they are responsible for maintaining the vegetation within their property boundaries, fencelines and nature strips in good order.

Council is receiving a large number of customer requests relating to overgrown vegetation and staff are responding as quickly as possible. Spring weather along with generous rainfall is providing ideal conditions for grass, shrubs, weeds and vegetation to grow rapidly. Due to the ground being wet and proving difficult to access in some areas, maintenance by landowners is taking longer than expected. Please help keep our community safe by slashing, mowing or clearing overgrown vegetation.

Council will provide a free domestic household hard waste collection service on the following dates:

Town	Dates
Rand	Monday 5 December 2022
Oaklands	Tuesday 6 December 2022
Boree Creek	Wednesday 7 Decem- ber 2022
Morundah	Wednesday 7 December 2022
Urana	Thursday 8 December 2022

The maximum amount to be collected from each residence will be limited to one 6'x4' box trailer load.

All items are to be placed on the nature strip in a clear space and should not impede pedestrians.

Council will collect white goods and up to 4 car tyres from each residence. Council will not remove these items if a booking has not been made by contacting Urana's Council Office prior to the nominated dates.

Fibro Sheeting, Greenwaste, Hazardous Materials, Liquids or Asbestos will not be collected.

Residents are requested to place a hard waste material neatly on the nature strip before 8.00am each day.

### CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds, and roads across the Federation Council Region. The following activities were undertaken in September 2022 by Federation Council's Works teams.

• John-Street Drainage: The next stage of this project is the street pavement reconstruction, which consists of further subgrade and pavement works. This is a major part of the project and requires fine weather to undertake the works. Due to the current and future forecasted weather conditions, Council has postponed the next stage of the works until late October, 2022. The final stage of the project is bitumen sealing which is scheduled to occur shortly after completion of the street reconstruction works. Notices have been letter dropped to residents of the postponement.

• Corowa – Mulwala Cycleway: Works recommenced mid-September but are still restricted by access due to wet weather, and lack of staff. Gravel pavement sections of the Boardwalk at Drain Lane have been completed. Works have also recommenced on Cotton and River Street involving subgrade works for kerb and gutter and storm water drainage works (weather permitting).

• Maintenance Grading Program: Roads graded in September - Warmatta Road, Roseneath Road, Waverley Road, Sandy Ridges Road, Waverley Road, Erindale Road, Carols In, Lilydale Road, Woolshed Road, Glencore Road. No tabledrain work done as drains are too wet for plant to work in.

• Gravel Re-sheeting Program: Commenced with Warmatta Road completed. Waverley Road in progress.

• Table drain Maintenance: Table drain Maintenance in response to customers requesting urban and rural drains, only in zones where no impact can be made on the Sloanes Froglet (between April and October breeding season).

• Sealed Roads: Pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jetmaster patching truck.

• Customer Requests: Numerous Customer Requests responded to for drainage, potholes, signs and footpaths, however some were unable to be acted on due to lack of staff numbers or wet weather.

• Heavy Trucks: Cart and spread gravel for Gravel Re-sheeting Program. Cart excess spoils to Corowa & Howlong Landfills for cover & capping. Carting of aggregate for patching trucks.

• Future Works Corowa – Mulwala Cycleway, Maintenance Grading Tom Roberts Road prior to gravel resheeting Maintenance Grading program areas North West of Corowa. Maintenance Grading program Balldale area Maintenance Grading program Savernake area Recommencement of Work Cullivel Road and Balldale Road (weather permitting).

### SUMMER INTENSIVE SWIM PROGRAM



Young swimmers will have a chance to further grow their skills and confidence in the water with the Learn to Swim Summer Intensive Program set to commence at the Corowa Aquatic Centre during January 2023.

Federation Council has announced the launch of its Learn to Swim Summer Intensive Program which will see classes offered across one week, Monday 9 - Friday 13 January, 2023.

Students will participate in daily lessons each day for five days - Monday to Friday.

The program is designed to support young swimmers in the following enrolment categories:

- Crayfish: Our Crayfish class commences the journey of learning strokes for your child.
- Platypus: Our Platypus class sees the introduction of bilateral breathing while swimming freestyle.
- Turtle: Our Turtle class is suitable for children 4+ years of age.
- Silver Perch: Our Silver Perch class is the first level that sees children swim

the full length of the pool.

Federation Council's Duty Officer of Public Pools, Jo Laws said, we cannot wait to start the summer intensive program to provide students with the opportunity to further grow their skills and confidence in the water.

"Teaching your child or yourself to swim is one of the most important decisions you will make in life and our Corowa Aquatic Centre team is committed to promoting fun and enjoyment of all things water for swimmers of all abilities. We are really looking forward to hosting the program."

The program will be \$105 for members of the Corowa Aquatic Centre and \$125.00 for non-members.

Enrolments for the Learn to Swim Summer Intensive Program are now open, and parents are encouraged to complete the online enrolment form from the Corowa Aquatic Centre website, or alternatively, attend the Corowa Aquatic Centre to complete a paper based form.

Following the enrolment lodgment, a team member of the Corowa Aquatic Centre will be in contact with individual families to arrange class allocation.





### **URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE**

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
