

Bourkey's Brief

Hello readers, and welcome to the October edition of the Urana District Newsletter.

It has been another eventful month on all fronts, with Federation Council welcoming another generous funding announcement from the NSW Government.

A total of \$3,608,776 will be spent on sixteen projects in the Federation Council area covering sport, recreational and community facilities. This additional funding will not only further support the health and wellbeing of residents, but also the long term sustainability of our local communities.

Council is thrilled to be given this exciting opportunity to deliver projects that will provide significant benefit to our communities and we are very grateful to the NSW Government for their continued commitment to invest in regional areas. We're looking forward to working with community groups and sporting clubs to deliver these projects over the next two years. Council worked hard to ensure a spread of projects occurred across many of our communities, with many targeting long term priorities that the community had been working towards for years.

Bitumen road reseals are also currently underway throughout the Council area and Urana residents may have noticed works occurring around town over the past few weeks. Once the local roads in Urana are completed the crews will be heading to Boree Creek to continue this great work. This work has been made possible from the Stronger Communities Fund and Council would like to thank the NSW Government once again for their financial commitment into maintaining country roads.

Council would also like to thank our residents from across the Northern Council area who attended a number of flood plain risk management workshops in Urana, Oaklands, Rand, Boree Creek and Morundah.

This engagement and consultation work helps Council to identify flood risk, investigate potential flood risk mitigation options, and where appropriate, make recommendations for options to be implemented.

Federation Council, with the support of the NSW Government Office of Environment and Heritage and the firm leading this work, WMA water, engaged with local residents earlier this month to promote awareness of the project, identify key flood risks in each village and gather ideas for, and discuss, potential flood risk mitigation options to address identified issues.

Council remains to be proactive about flooding in each village and from completing the first part of the study, Council has a solid data set of flood models, and a greater understanding of the main flood risk areas, and has now been able to confirm and refine this understanding with our residents. Council staff, with the assistance of WMA consultants will now work to collate findings to progress the next stage of the project next year.

Council hosts Drought Support Day

Federation Council has thanked service providers who took part in the recent Drought Support Day held in Urana and Oaklands on Wednesday 3 October.

Mayor, Pat Bourke said the initiative provided an opportunity for council representatives and service providers to talk to local farmers and gain a better understanding of the impact the drought and recent frost events are having.

"These are really important conversations to have because it means we are then better placed to support and advocate on behalf of the community when and where it's needed," he said.

A number of residents accessed the range of drought related

information available on the day, and also came together to enjoy a bbq and downpour of rain.

"It's not often we welcome rain during an event, but on this occasion we were very pleased to be washed out," the Mayor said.

Council has thanked the Urana Inc and Oaklands Men's Bowls Club for providing the bbq and the Oaklands CWA for assisting with use of the hall.

Service providers who attended on the day included the Australian Government Mobile Centre, Rural Financial Counsellor, Amaranth Foundation, TAFE NSW, Intereach (Corowa Community Hub), Murray Local Lands Service, Albury Community Mental Health Service, and the Urana Hospital and Community Health.

Federation Council's Noxious Weeds Officer was also on hand to provide important information and the Mobile Preschool team provided activities for children throughout the day.

Council also recently facilitated a drought forum which brought together a number of local farmers, agronomists, service providers and other key stakeholders to discuss the challenges being faced by local farming communities.

"Council is committed to working with stakeholders to identify ways it can support the community during difficult times such as a drought. We have gained some good insights over recent weeks and we'll be considering a number of actions moving forward," Mayor Bourke said.



Federation Youth Council CommUNITY Piano Project

The Federation Youth Council's the CommUNITY Piano Project is set to achieve an outstanding result for Federation Council communities.

A CommUNITY Piano is a piano placed in the street which people passing by are encouraged to play. The concept originated quite by accident in Sheffield, England and is a world-wide phenomenon that the Federation Youth Council feel the area should be a part of. Street pianos are great not just for the music they bring, but are a powerful economic force, and act as a magnet for tourism. Even more important, they help educate and inspire, create a sense of shared ownership and responsibility, and stimulate creativity.

Concerned with the issue of inclusion and acceptance of young people, the Federation Youth Council hope this is the catalyst for people to see each other, make conversation and come together without any prejudice.



The CommUNITY Piano Project involves the Federation Youth Council working with a local artist, school and community groups to turn them into public art pieces.

The Youth Council currently have one upright piano on castors and once completed, it will be tuned and then secured to its chosen location as a public art project aimed at creating a place for exchange and an opportunity for people to connect.

Federation Council will transport the finished piano to its permanent location and the piano will remain the property of the Federation Council. Federation Youth Council will be working closely with Council to ensure the piano is compliant to footpath regulations and the piano is covered under Council's public liability insurance.

The piano will be ready for public display in December /January and will be on a four month trial to gauge the impact it has on each community.

The long term aim is to have pianos installed in public places across the Council area, located on streets, in public parks, outside cafes and local community meeting areas encouraging passers-by to come together and play or listen to the pianos.

The Federation Youth Council would like to invite business owner/s to become 'Piano Partners' and support the project by adopting the piano, covering it at the end of the day or wheeling it inside their premises from the outside elements.

The CommUNITY Piano Project is funded through the Youth Opportunities Program 2018.

The Federation Youth Council is hosting a drought relief movie night for teenagers and families on Saturday 17 November at the Oaklands Recreation Ground.

Flicks in the Sticks is a free event and will include the screening of two movies, the family friendly "Nut Job 2- Nutty by Nature" followed by "Tomb Raider" for teenagers aged over fifteen.

Federation Youth Council Mayor, Dylan Forge said the Federation Youth Council are proud to show support for the drought-affected farmers and farming communities and is encouraging families from across the Federation Council region to attend the event.

"This is a current problem facing Australian farmers and is very important to our youth council as we are living in a rural community," he said.

Youth Councillor Liam Summons from Oaklands said he is looking forward to hosting the event alongside other fellow youth councillors. "As a Youth Councillor, it is really wonderful to be able to host an event in Oaklands that aims to boost the youth

community and provide entertainment," he said. "I hope that the Youth Council can continue to achieve further positive projects for youth all around the Federation area."

The first screening at sunset is the family friendly movie, "Nut Job 2 – Nutty by Nature". An animated comedy about Surly the squirrel and his friends who must stop Oakton City's Mayor from destroying their home to make way for a dysfunctional amusement park.

A second movie "Tomb Raider", aimed at teenagers will commence screening at approximately 8:30pm. The 2018 action-adventure movie follows Lara Croft, the fiercely independent daughter of a missing adventurer, who must push herself beyond her limits when she discovers the island where her father disappeared.

Mayor Pat Bourke praised the great efforts of the Federation Youth Council.

"This is a great initiative by the Youth Council and I would like to take this opportunity to formally thank them for supporting our drought relief effort by coming up with such a great community project," Mayor Bourke said.

"Events like this allow people to come in off the land, spend some time with their families, catch up with their neighbours and have a break from the tough reality of their situation. Social events in these hard times are important for mental health and community morale."



Federation Council has welcomed an exciting funding announcement from the NSW Government, with over \$3.6 million being provided towards important community infrastructure projects.

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin was in Corowa yesterday to make the announcement.

"This is another great outcome for the Federation Council community and their sporting grounds," Mr Aplin said.

"The NSW Coalition Government continues to invest in our communities and I congratulate all the successful organisations and communities that will benefit from these improvements" Mr Aplin said.

A total of \$3,608,776 will be spent on sixteen projects in the Federation Council area covering sport, recreational and community facilities:

\$224,690 for upgrades to the John Foord Oval Sporting Facilities,

\$91,817 for upgrades to the Colombo Creek Ski Club Toilet Block,

\$449,820 for upgrades to the Oaklands Recreational Reserve Change Room and Toilet Block,

\$104,853 for the resurfacing of Urana Tennis Courts,

\$80,954 for the Lonsdale Recreation Reserve Playground,

\$85,532 for the Rejuvenation of Corowa High School Oval for community use,

\$68,970 for the Rand Sports Ground improvements,

\$272,965 for the lighting upgrade for Rennie Recreational Reserve,

\$180,000 for the refurbishment of clubrooms at Howlong Tennis Club,

\$280,393 for the reconstruction of the netball and tennis court at Coreen Recreation Reserve,

\$180,000 for a pedestrian bridge at Urana Aquatic Centre,

\$199,353 for the Ball Park Multisport Pavilion,

\$95,898 for the refurbishment of the Corowa Rowing Club,

\$750,000 for the Corowa Swimming Pool Splash Park,

\$300,000 for the upgrade of Max Kirwan Water Ski Club to world class standard, and

\$243,531 towards the Urana Aquatic Leisure Centre building.

Federation Council Mayor, Pat Bourke has said the funding will not only support the health and wellbeing of residents, but also the long term sustainability of local communities.

"This is an exciting opportunity to deliver projects that will provide significant benefit to our communities and we are very grateful to the NSW Government for their commitment to invest in regional areas." he said.

"We're looking forward to working with community groups and sporting clubs to deliver these projects over the next two years." Mayor Bourke said.



Responsibilities to our companion animals

Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Council works hard to communicate with local pet owners regarding these responsibilities, keeping both our furry friends and our community safe.

Responsibilities of pet owners

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area. Fines may apply if your dog is found to be not adequately leashed in a public place.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under the effective control
 of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Greyhounds must be muzzled at all times when in a public place.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

Microchipping and pet registration

Microchipping and registration is a two part process that requires dog and cat owners to:

- 1. Have their dog or cat implanted with a microchip from the time they are 12 weeks of age, at point of sale or change of ownership (whichever occurs first)
- 2. Register their animals with their NSW local council by 6 months of age.

Both the microchipping and registration of your dog or cat include a one-off fee and are for the life of the animal.


CRAFT
