# COUNCIL CONFIRMS DOUBLE VACCINATION STATUS FOR ENTRY INTO FACILITIES

This month NSW has taken its first steps towards reopening as the State has passed the 70 per cent double vaccination target.

In line with NSW Public Health Orders, proof of COVID-19 vaccination will be required upon entry to certain Council owned and managed facilities.

The changes have been introduced as part of the Reopening NSW roadmap.

To minimise the risk of Covid spreading, entry to the following facilities will only be permitted for members of the community who are fully vaccinated, until further notice:

- Corowa Library;
- Howlong Council Office and Library;
- Mulwala Council Office and Library;
- Corowa Aquatic Centre; and
- Corowa Visitor Information Centre.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said this was both an exciting and challenging time for the Federation community, local businesses and residents prepare for the reopening roadmap to commence on Monday.

"I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many residents and local businesses that are working diligently to ensure we are prepared to implement the reopening roadmap across the Federation Local Government Area." he said.

"While Lunderstand there will be some residents who have concerns about the entry restrictions coming into place. I assure everyone that these rules are aligned with government regulations and designed to keep our communities safe throughout the staged reopening period. I have full faith that our residents will continue to work with Council and all businesses as we strive to reach a new Covid normal. Throughout the course of this pandemic, our residents and local businesses have proven themselves time and time again to be resilient and adaptable in changing times and I know we will do it again."

In closing, Mayor Bourke commended the Federation Local Government Area and its residents on what he described is an outstanding achievement in respect to vaccination rates.

"Currently we are sitting at 94.2% single dose, and 62.5% double dose," he said. "These stats are another fine example that show the commitment of our residents to reopen our community safely. Well done to everyone and keep up the great work."

With the first vaccination milestone being reached, the NSW Government is also easing a number of restrictions as part of the Reopening NSW roadmap, which will allow fully vaccinated adults to enjoy more freedoms from next Monday, October 11. See Council's Website for details.

# COUNCIL RE-APPOINTS ADRIAN BUTLER AS FEDERATION COUNCIL GM



Federation Councillors unanimously voted to re-appoint current General Manager Adrian Butler on a five-year contract at September's ordinary meeting of Council.

Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke announced the successful re-appointment following a closed session of Council, and stated the reappointment was made in accordance with the requirements of his current contract, that was due to expire in June 2022. The new contract will commence on 1 October 2021.

Council at the July meeting endorsed the General Manager's Performance Review Committee's annual appraisal recommendation, with the performance again being recorded as more than satisfactory. Mr Butler through this process notified Council of his intent to seek renewal of his contract, and noted the requirement under the Local Mayor Bourke said Council was thankful for the assistance received from NSW Local Government Management Solutions to assist them in the process and congratulated Mr Butler on his reappointment.

"Under Adrian's leadership, there has been an unprecedented level of infrastructure projects delivered, and key strategic planning work completed and some continuing, including a strong focus on stability, delivery, financial sustainability, and building the Federation Council organization post-merger," Mayor Bourke said.

"The merger brought a huge workload onto the new Council, on top of our routine roads, rates and rubbish, as well as our other 41 service provisions. The way that the organisation has been led is a true credit to Adrian, and a testament to the support he and the Council consistently receive by the staff of our organization and the community more broadly."

Mayor Bourke said both Council and the General Manager expected that it would be the new Council that would have made the decision on Mr Butler's reappointment, had the original date of the September Council elections occurred, but now that the Local Government Election has been postponed to December 2021 due to the Coronavirus pandemic, a decision was required to be made by the current Council.

"Council took into consideration past

contract terms for both the Corowa Shire and Urana Shires respectively, where elected Councillors appointed General Managers on five year terms," he said.

"Council's unanimous vote speaks volumes to the stability and strategic outlook that Mr Butler brings to this organization and the respect he is held in. Council looks forward to working with Mr Butler to continue to positively progress Federation Council and its communities."

General Manager Adrian Butler said he considers it a great honor to again be entrusted with the position of General Manager and thanked Council for their support since he began in the interim role in 2017 and then in commencing the four year contract in June 2018.

"Council and staff are working together diligently with the community to deliver our vast range of services and of course delivering many projects in addition to this," he said. For me to be able to continue to lead the staff of this hardworking and dedicated entity is excitina. Μv lona-term vision for Federation Council remains the same and that is to ensure the community continues to trust and respect the work of the Council, to work with many to deliver on commitments, and to continue to develop and implement strategies that ensure a strong, responsive and sustainable Council business. I believe this will be delivered professionally, efficiently and passionately and the General Manager role is one I am incredibly honored to be entrusted with."

Mr Butler, who is 47, resides in Urana with his wife and four young children. They have lived in the area since early 2013, where Mr Butler held the position of General Manager at Urana Shire Council until the merger of the former Urana and Corowa Shires in May 2016. Mr Butler is originally from the Balranald area, and has an extensive career in Local Government spanning over 24 years.

He commenced his Local Government career as an outdoor staff member at Balranald Shire Council, in 1997, progressing through senior roles at Balranald, Bourke, Lachlan, Urana and Federation Councils over this time. Mr Butler has tertiary qualifications in Environmental Health, Building Surveying, Planning, and has recently completed a Master of Business Administration (MBA).

Council staff respond to concerns about excessive vegetation on properties and have the ability to serve notices and issue penalties where a property owner is non-compliant.

## **COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2021**





The NSW Government has announced a new date for the Local Government Elections to occur. This has been set for Saturday, 4 December 2021.

Local Government Minister Shelley Hancock said the decision has been made after extensive consultation with and on advice from the NSW Electoral Commission and NSW Health due to the COVID-19 situation.

Councillors are elected for a four year term, held on the second Saturday in September every four years. The postponement of 2020 Local Government elections to 4 December 2021, will not effect the schedule of subsequent council elections. After December 2021 elections, the next Local Government election will take place in September 2024. All residents are encouraged to check their enrolment details prior to the election date by calling the NSW Electoral Commission on 1300 135 736 or by visiting their website www.elections.nsw.gov.au

## **RATES 2021-2022**



Rates notices for the 2021-2022 financial year have now been issued.

Federation Council has adopted a new common rating structure for all properties across the Federation Council area. The new structure will apply from 1 July 2021.

Each property will be levied general rates using the following formula: Base rate of \$348 + ad valorem based on the value of the land and whether the property is farmland, residential or business. This change follows an extensive period of analysis and engagement in relation to available options for harmonising general rates across the Federation Council area.

Council levies general rates on all properties across the Federation Council area. These funds contribute to the costs of delivering numerous services to the community. Under the new rating structure residential ratepayers will continue to contribute 49% of the total \$8.9m in general rates collected, with farmland ratepayers contributing 42% and business ratepayers contributing 9%.

# MAYOR AND DEPUTY MAYOR RE-ELECTED

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke and Deputy Mayor, Cr Shaun Whitechurch will continue in their respective roles until the December 4 Local Government Election.

Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke was re-elected to the position of Mayor, unopposed at Tuesday's monthly meeting of Council. Councillor Whitechurch defeated Councillor Gail Law for the deputy mayor's position via a secret ballot.

NSW Local Government elections were to be held this month, on September 4 but due to the coronavirus pandemic were postponed to December 4.

Mayoral elections were to be held in September for mayors elected in September 2018 when their two-year terms had expired.

Councillors are elected for a four year term, held on the second Saturday in September every four years. The postponement of 2020 Local Government elections to 4 December 2021, will not affect the schedule of subsequent council elections. After the December 2021 elections, the next Local Government election will take place in September 2024.

# **WORKS PROGRAM**

Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region.

The following activities were undertaken within the month of August 2021 by Federation Council's Works teams:

- Fixing Local Roads Program Traffic Facilities - Continue audit of signs and guideposts for upgrade/ replacement in urban streets and rural roads throughout Federation Council. Continue replacement program of signs & guideposts.
- Daysdale S Bends In winter lockdown.
- Corowa Mulwala Cycleway Works on hold due to wet weather.
- Spring Drive MR314 Culvert Replacement Program - In conjunction with Transport for NSW, two culvert crossings replaced (segments 60 & 250).
- FCR Program Cullivel Road -Clearing and grubbing work has commenced on this project with earthworks due to follow.
- Tabledrain Maintenance Tabledrain Maintenance on sealed and unsealed roads in urban and rural areas.
- Roadside Shoulder Slashing has commenced on sealed rural roads
   Redlands Road, Buraja-Ringwood Road, Humedon Road, Drain Lane, Bull Plain Road, Savernake Road, McCurdies Road, Sloane's Siding Road, Wandong Road, Oak Lodge Road.

- Maintenance Grading Program -Maintenance Grading Program has commenced where possible. Many roads are unable to be graded due to the amount of rainfall resulting in water laving in potholes and tabledrains: Coreen Vale Road, Kentucky Lane, Daysdale-Walbundrie Road, Sharps Road, Strachans Road, Howard Road, Ford Road, Old Balldale Road, Mossdale Road, Drums Lane, Ardrossan Road. Tom Roberts Road. Warmatta Road, Pine Grove Road, Roseview Road, Telephone Lane. Kerr's Road, Saffron Road, East Saffron Road, Bells Road, Elliot's Road, Beale's Road, Coonong Road, West Gums Road, Spraydon Road, Barragunda Road, Athole Road.
- Sealed Roads Pothole repairs due to the high rainfall during winter, many potholes/defects are appearing on the sealed road network. Two extra patching trucks (1 Urana 1 Corowa) have been made up in house to get on top of the numerous defects. The replacement jet patcher is due to arrive in late October early November.
- Roadside Shoulder Spraying Has commenced on rural sealed roads lzons Road, Balldale-Coreen Road, Mahonga Lane, Oil Tree Lagoon Road, Hopefield Road, Balldale-Howlong Road, Balldale-Walbundrie Road, Balldale-Brocklesby Road, Merton Road, Bull Plain Road, Buraja-Ringwood Road, Humeden Road, Rennie Road, Redlands Road, Drain Lane, Whitehead Street, Cemetery Road, Bullecourt Road.

- COVID 19 Work Crews continue with high productivity output with some changes to work methods.
- Sundry Gang FLR Program Traffic Facilities in conjunction with Construction teams, various Customer Requests, footpath repairs, traffic control for construction crews and contractors where required.
- Heavy Trucks Support Grader Gangs and Construction Gangs on maintenance - hauling spoil, gravel, and sand.
- Slasher- Oaklands Township, Berrigan Road and Back Berrigan Road.

## BIOSECURITY WEED CONTROL



With the commencement of Spring and the weather warming up, Biosecurity weeds around the Federation Council area are likely to become more prominent over the coming months. This is particularly so given the significant rainfall that has been experienced, creating perfect conditions for weeds to grow.

Council is currently prioritising the reduction and elimination of weeds, with a particular focus on problem weeds

such as Chilean Needle Grass, Horehound, St John's Wort, African Boxthorn, Silver leaf Nightshade, Spiny Burrs Grass. The seasonal conditions experienced at the moment in the region can make management of weeds challenging at this time.

Council is encouraging landowners to take effective measures to remove weeds from their property including spot spraying, biological control and chip and burn.

Do you know that you are legally required to register your dog or cat? The registration fee is a once-only payment, which covers the cat or dog for its lifetime in NSW, regardless of any changes in ownership.

Registration in another state or territory cannot be transferred to NSW.

# ARE YOU KEEPING YOUR BEST MATE SAFE? MICROCHIP YOUR PET TODAY

Microchipping is a quick and harmless procedure where a small microchip is inserted between your pet's shoulder blades either by a local vet or animal welfare organisation. It provides identification only for your animal.

If your microchipped pet goes astray and is taken to a vet, pound or shelter, we use the microchip's data to contact you and quickly reunite you with your pet.

Microchipping your animal does not include registration. You must register your dog by 6 months and cats by 4 months of age.

Our fury friends are so important in our lives, so make sure your pet is microchipped so if it does go astray we can return it safely to you.

# COROWA SUBDIVISION -COUNCIL UPDATE -DA 2020/162



Council wishes to provide the community with the following update in respect to Development Application 2020/162 – Residential Subdivision Corowa. This matter is currently before the NSW Land and Environment Court.

At September's meeting of Council, Councillors rejected an offer 8-1 to enter into a voluntary planning agreement with the applicant.

Council rejected the offer on the basis of potential exposure to much greater costs beyond the \$2.8 million put forward for works, which includes upgrades to the Corowa Sewerage Treatment Plant.

Prior to the Council meeting, Council representatives and expert witnesses presented to Court to participate in the Class One Proceedings relating to Development Application 2020/162.

On Wednesday, September 22 the Commissioner requested consideration by Council of the Voluntary Planning Agreement Offer, with the Council report and minutes of the Council meeting where this is heard, to be provided to the Court by Friday 1 October 2021. The commissioner also requested the applicant review the draft conditions of consent that Council would recommend the court place on any approval, if the court were to issue one, before 1 October 2021.

The proposed development for 306 residential lots to be delivered in 13 stages, involves removal of native vegetation, demolition of existing buildings, creation of three public reserves for the purposes of drainage and public open space and associated civil works at 169-199 Redlands Road and 42-80 Cemetery Road, Corowa.

This application, in its previous form of a 355 lot subdivision, was lodged with Council in August 2020, and the subsequent assessment and requests for additional information to support an assessment continued until the 22 December 2020, when a class 1 application was lodged with the NSW Land and Environment Court due to deemed refusal by the consent authority.

Between January 2021 and June 15, 2021 Council and the applicants have been meeting in agreed Section 34 conciliation sessions under the Land and Environment Court provisions, in an attempt to see if both parties could reach an amicable decision on the development proposal.

Unfortunately these sessions were not

successful and on Tuesday, 15 June 2021 both parties involved in the proceedings agreed that the Section 34 conciliation should be terminated and the matter be referred back to the court for a directions hearing. A further update will be provided to the community after the Court determination, which is expected to be delivered following the receipt of the information requested by Friday 1 October 2021.

Council would like to thank the community for their support and interest in the development.

Alcohol and drug use not only affects people using the alcohol or drugs, but it also has an adverse impact on their family, friends, and their community.

Family and peer support networks are critical to a persons' recovery from alcohol/drug use. but too often. relationships become strained and users become isolated from their families, friends and social networks due to the problems arising from their alcohol or drug use.

Families and friends can play a critical role in the recovery of people using alcohol and other drugs. However, there is little support for families in this situation.

The Family and Friend Support Program is an online intervention and support package for families/friends supporting loved ones using alcohol/drugs. It includes information on how families and friends can best help their loved ones and protect them from adverse impacts of their lifestyle of drinking alcohol or using drugs. The Family and Friend Support Program recognises that supporting someone who is drinking or using can be extremely stressful, and aims to assist families and friends to best manage the demands of this role. ## **URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE**

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.
