Welcome to the October edition of the Urana District Newsletter for 2022.

In this edition, we advise that our 2023 Australia Day Award Nominations opened on Monday 3 October, highlight National Mental Health Month and invite all residents to our upcoming Federation Community Expo, which is a free community event to showcase the organisations, clubs, groups, and service providers in the Federation Council area. A range of studies will contribute to the Growth Management Strategy that include: Water Servicing, Sewer Servicing, Transport Strategy, Storm Water Servicing, Green Space Servicing, Community Facilities Servicing, Social Services Review, Economic Development Strategy, Housing Strategy, Development Pressure, Lot Size Review, Flood Studies, Biodiversity, Climate Change, Bushfire and Heritage. I encourage residents to stay engaged on this project, and complete the survey available on Council's website from Tuesday, October 18, or collect a paper copy in any one of our Council offices in Corowa, Howlong, Mulwala or Urana.

The overall aim of the growth management strategy is to identify the scale, location, and timing of future residential and employment growth within the Federation region based on community feedback and needs. This will look at extensive analysis of growth assumptions, emerging trends, constraints, and opportunities.

COUNCIL CONGRATULATES AWARD WINNING OAKLANDS BUSINESS -PENTARCH



Victorian and NSW Small to Medium Enterprise (SME) Pentarch has won the two major Industry Land Forces 2022 Innovation Awards for their project that safely, and remotely, handles and 'de-fuzes' 105mm artillery rounds.

Pentarch won the National Innovation Award and the SME Innovation Award categories.

Their novel multi-system process, known as Project Damocles, developed at their Oaklands site removes and interrogates fuzes fitted to artillery projectiles using automated robotics and vision systems, and delivers them via un-manned conveyors for reuse or disposal.

Pentarch Executive Director Chris Deighton said he and his team were delighted with the acknowledgment, describing it as testimony to the power of bringing technical specialists together to solve a longstanding problem for their client, the Australian Department of Defence.

"The cost of R&D and achieving compliance with Defence requirements, especially where human safety is the overriding priority, can be demanding and often financially challenging for SMEs," he said.

"As an SME ourselves, we've worked closely with a very wide range of small businesses to develop our solution from a concept around the challenge faced then designed and integrated multiple sub systems in a fully automated process that can be transported and assembled at the required locations."

The bespoke robotic system is operated remotely and moves pallets of ammunition within storehouses, conveys them to a process area that extracts ammunition boxes from the pallets, ammunition tubes containing the rounds from the boxes, removes the projectile from the inner packaging (tubes), then de-fuzes the round. The fuze is positioned for X-ray where it is determined to be in an 'armed' or 'unarmed' state, then repacked for re-use or sent to disposal. At each site the whole process is contained by a modular HES-CO barrier system.

Mr Deighton said their clients at Defence LEOSPO, EMB, JLC, DOS, CMB, and EO Licensing have been truly supportive.

"Our commercial partners Scott's Automation, REACT Automation RedTeam, NTSS, SG Consulting and AVS Elli are located across New South Wales and Victoria, and have combined in many creative, clever and practical ways," he said.

"The combined technical expertise in robotics, automation, conveying systems, X-Ray and vision technology, and workplace safety has come together in a truly innovative project that shows how a world class solution can be designed and implemented in regional Australia. Importantly, the whole project has shown that SMEs, with proactive support from within Defence, can develop solutions to complex problems."

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said he'd like to extend a huge congratulations to Chris and the team at Pentarch following this incredible achievement.

"Pentarch is a terrific business and one we are very fortunate to have in our Federation Council region," Mayor Bourke said.

"Pentarch is a fantastic example of an innovative and cutting-edge business that supports our local economy with jobs, grants and other kind donations made. The service this company is able to offer to defence and many other industries in safely and environmentally responsibly managing the disposal or decommissioning of so many different products is so significant. The entire team is very worthy of these awards and I have no doubt this business will continue to go from strength to strength."

The Damocles solution has been in operation since July 2021 under a commercial arrangement with Explosive Materiel Branch, Land Systems Division, Capability Acquisition and Sustainment Group, Department of Defence and will be completed by early 2023.

NOMINATIONS FOR 2023 FEDERATION COUNCIL AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS



It's that time of year again – time to start thinking about nominating inspiring individuals for a Federation Council Australia Day Award.

Each year, Federation Council invites nominations for the Australia Day Awards which are presented to local individuals or groups who have made an outstanding contribution to our community at the Official Australia Day Awards Ceremony.

Federation Council Mayor, Councillor Patrick Bourke is encouraging people to start considering that someone who makes a fantastic contribution to the community. "There are many deserving people and community groups in our community who do wonderful things that often go unnoticed," he said.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PET OWNERS



Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals.

Residents are reminded of the responsibilities of pet owners to ensure the safety of companion animals and the community.

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Just like all breeds of dogs in NSW, greyhounds will still be required to be on a leash while in public at all times.

- A greyhound will still require a muzzle in an off-leash area if it has not undergone an approved retraining program. Greyhounds that have completed this program will continue to wear identifying green collars, or, alternatively the person in charge of the animal can carry a completion card.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

SWOOPING SEASON

Spring often signals the beginning of the breeding season for our native birds, mainly Magpies and Plovers, which subsequently means swooping.

During the nesting season, a Magpie may swoop on people, clacking its beak. While alarming, it is usually an attempt to defend its family so just a warning. The good news is that a single magpie will swoop for only six weeks until their chicks leave the nest.

Last year, a list of known swooping locations was prepared to help protect you and your family. If you know of a hot spot swooping location in the Federation Council local government area, share the location with us by completing the online form available from Council's website.

National Mental Health Month is held throughout October across Australia to raise awareness and promote better mental health for all.

This year's theme is 'Building Resilience: Communities and Connections'

Throughout October, Federation Council will promote key wellness messages, aiming to raise awareness and promote better mental health for all.

Mayor Patrick Bourke said Mental Health Month provides us with a great opportunity for the Federation community to think about our mental health and wellbeing, regardless of whether we may have a lived experience of mental illness or not, and support each other within our community.

"Our everyday lives are often so busy that we sometimes need reminding of how important it is to stop, be in the moment and to reflect on our health, as before we realise it our daily lives can catch up and have an impact on our wellbeing," he said.

"Council has and will continue to play a crucial role in supporting community wellbeing and providing connections to services.

Federation Council and the Federation Primary Prevention Team partnered earlier this year on the 'Our Council Cares Card(PDF, 297KB)' initiative. The 'Our Council Cares Card' includes a list of some of the State, National and local services that people can get in touch to talk about how they are feeling or determine what assistance is available. These services are also there as a sounding board for people to talk through how you may be supporting someone else who is under mental distress. Every household across the Federation LGA received a card in the mail.

COMMUNITY MORNING TEAS

Community Morning Teas are held at the Courthouse Museum on the first Tuesday of the month (except November which will be a Melbourne Cup afternoon tea at 12.30 pm at the Urana Bowling and Community Club).

These morning teas have evolved from the Stepping On Friendship Group. Stepping On is a weekly exercise program open to everyone which has been successfully running for 9 years and is led by Harry and Eunice Couzin. Participant numbers have grown to approximately 16 each week with visible differences in strength, balance and coordination being evident from specific and regular exercise. After each hour long session, morning tea and socialization happens.



Participants pay a nominal attendance fee which is pooled and used to provide a monthly morning tea which gives additional laughter and socialization.

There is much evidence to prove that exercise and socialization not only improve fitness and happiness but also mental health.

Progress Association have therefore expanded our Morning Teas to include any people who would like a morning of chat (both serious and not-so-serious), laughter and good food for a minimal cost.

The Stepping On Group, Urana Progress Association and Federation Council Ageing Well Committee all support and are working together to provide all aspects of maintaining and improving mental and physical health for all residents of Urana and district. We are proud to be able to provide social outings for our community.

URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.
