Council unveils playground designs



Federation Council has unveiled the final design of four new playgrounds, with installation set to be complete by the end of November.

RSL Park in Corowa, Lowe Square and Memorial Park in Howlong and the Rand Recreation Reserve are just some of the sites included as part of Council's Play Space Upgrade Program.

Residents in Howlong and Corowa were given the opportunity to participate in a survey in April to help council understand the communities ideas about play provision

In Howlong, the consultation process resulted in an additional smaller playground being planned at Memorial Park. A grant application has also been submitted to redevelop the existing rotunda at Memorial Park and incorporate this into the play space. It is proposed to transform the structure into an Enchanted Hut that will be an engaging and inclusive feature of the playground.

The Rand Recreation Reserve will also receive a new playground, after the community were successful in an application for funding through round one of the Stronger Communities Program. The Rand Sports Ground and Town Improvement Committees have been working closely with council to finalise the new playground.

3D drawings of the playgrounds are now available and signage will soon be installed at each site to communicate information about park closures throughout the construction phase.

Council has also been working closely with the

community to progress the redevelopment of Bangerang Park, which includes a new playground, toilet block with disabled access and baby change facilities, landscaping and connecting paths.

The Bangerang Park project is now expected to commence early next year and has required further design work to ensure that feedback from the community on this project is carefully considered.

Other projects progressing as part of the Play Space Upgrade Program include the Urana Youth Space, Mulwala All Abilities Playground, Corowa Skate Park and Howlong Skate Park.

Expressions of Interest – Ageing Well Ambassadors

Federation Council has commenced the development of an Ageing Well Strategy 2018-2022 to plan for the needs of our ageing population.



The strategy will document the vision for an agefriendly community where the physical, social, and mental well-being of older people is promoted and strengthened.

Council is committed to ensuring that senior residents are well supported and actively engaged in their communities. This project addresses a number of key areas that will ensure the Federation Council area is a liveable community for senior residents.

A collaborative approach is proposed, where Council and the community work together to develop a plan that consists of clear strategies and actions.

The Ageing Well project plans to utilise existing networks and people within the community to undertake the initial planning aspects of the project.

This approach is more likely to achieve the desired outcome by developing strong partnerships and ensuring the needs and priorities are accurately reflected within the plan.

Local senior residents are being encouraged to drive the development of the plan and conduct the the community engagement component by becoming an Aging Well Ambassador.

Expressions of interest are now open and Council is seeking 8-10 residents to become Ageing Well Ambassadors.

Ambassadors will be provided with the necessary training to equip them with the tools needed to facilitate focus groups and community engagement. They will be supported by Council staff and reimbursed for their travel and time.

Council launches new funding opportunities to community groups

Federation Council has launched its new and improved grant programs, designed to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that contribute to the vibrancy and well-being of the community.

The Community Grants Program will support initiatives that deliver a range of social and economic benefits to communities across the Federation Council area.

The program provides a more streamlined approach to supporting local community groups, organisations and clubs with delivering community projects and events.

Two rounds will be facilitated each year, with a total amount of \$55,000 available to fund initiatives that:

- Promote a sense of community identity and pride.
- Stimulate economic growth within the community.
- Encourage wide participation in events and community projects.
- Promote Federation Council as a vibrant and diverse place to live and visit.
- Encourage and stimulate the growth of effective community development and cultural programs within Federation Council.
- Foster community partnerships.

Round one is now open with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Council is encouraging applications of up to \$3,000 before Friday 3 November 2017. Successful applicants will be notified on the 22 November.



Federation Council Events and Project Officer Jenny Bevis said this program is a way for the community to bring forward new ideas and develop existing projects to a new height.

"It's also a way of encouraging community participation in local activities and championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact," she said.

The introduction of a new Event Sponsorship Program is expected to attract larger events to the region that provide a significant return on investment for the community, as well as support current events to grow.

The Event Sponsorship Program will operate year round and support events that market Federation Council as a tourist destination and demonstrate a positive economic impact.

"This program will focus on events that drive visitation and overnight stays in the region, in addition to providing another great attraction for local residents," said Ms Bevis.

Proposals seeking sponsorship can be submitted at any time and will be assessed against a set criterion to determine the level of benefit generated from the event for the community.

Council Compliance Notifications for Companion Animals

Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Council works hard to communicate with local pet owners regarding these responsibilities, keeping both our fury friends and our community safe.

Responsibilities of Pet Owners

 If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.

- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off -leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Greyhounds must be muzzled at all times when in a public place.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, childcare centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

Microchipping and Registration

Microchipping and registration is a two-part process that requires dog and cat owners to:

- Have their dog or cat implanted with a microchip from the time they are 12 weeks of age, at point of sale or change of ownership (whichever occurs first).
- Register their animals with their NSW local council by 6 months of age.

Both the microchipping and registration of your dog or cat include a one-off fee and are for the life of the animal.

In 2014, a Flood Study was commenced for the towns of Urana, Oaklands, Morundah, Boree Creek and Rand.

This study is now nearing completion and the reports are available for public review at Federation Council offices.

Impacted residents from the towns are invited to join representatives from contractors, the Jacobs Group, Office of Environment and Heritage and Federation Council for a presentation on the flood study. In addition to the presentation, there will be time for questions and discussion on proposals.



TIME TO REEL IN RECREATIONAL FISHING FUNDS

Recreational fishing across NSW is set to receive a boost with the next round of funding applications opening today.

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin today encouraged applications under the next round of the NSW Government's Recreational Fishing Trust Grants.

"Every year we see some terrific and unique projects - I hope this year we see even more so that we can continue to provide fantastic fishing across the State," Mr Aplin said.

"Fishing is one of our State's most popular recreational activities, with more than one million anglers dropping a line in each year.

"This year alone we have already allocated \$15million into a range of projects across the State and anglers reel in the benefits every day."

Since 2001, hundreds of projects have already been completed and we currently have since have over 200 projects on the go.

One of the most popular projects is the fish education programs for young people, with over 300 Fishcare volunteers and our Get Hooked program, which is now running in over 100 primary schools across the State.

The Trusts also fund smaller projects each year including fishing platforms, fish cleaning tables, fishing workshops, the DPI FishSmart app, fishing guides and research on recreational fishing.

The NSW Government is proud to support its recreational fishing sector, which generates \$3.4 billion to the State's economy each year and accounts for more than 14,000 full-time jobs.

Fishing licence fees are reinvested each year to continue to improve NSW recreational fishing opportunities and accessibility.

NEW FUNDING FOR ANZAC COMMUNITY PROJECTS

New funding of \$175,000 is now available to help communities protect and repair local war memorials and to support projects which commemorate the service of current and former NSW service men and women.

Minister for Veterans Affairs David Elliott today called for applications in the latest round of the Community War Memorials Fund (CWMF) and the Anzac Community Grants Program (ACGP).

The CWMF provides grants of up to \$10,000 for local war memorial projects, including conservation works and protection. There are two rounds a year each offering \$125,000, closing on Anzac Day and Remembrance Day.

In the latest round, funding supported work at the Bodangora War Memorial in central western NSW, the Scone Pool Memorial in the Hunter, and the Cooma Cenotaph in southern NSW.

Meanwhile, the \$50,000 ACGP provides grants of up to \$2,000 to schools, community and veterans groups to educate the community on the service and sacrifice of military personnel, support activities benefiting veterans, and engage with the community.

The majority of projects proposed for the latest ACGP round were applications to support Anzac Day commemorative activities.

Minister for Veterans Affairs David Elliott said he was proud of the NSW Government's investment in local and state war memorials, which helps to ensure that the service and sacrifice they represent can be understood.

"This funding is part of an impressive program of work happening right through the Centenary of the Anzac, including refurbishing the Anzac Memorial in Hyde Park, rolling out the Veterans Employment Program, and also supporting the Invictus Games in 2018."






