I hope everyone is well, and enjoying the fantastic Spring weather on offer. With a lot of our normal activities including sporting activities and events on hold, I

hope you are taking the chance to get out and about and visit areas even within our own Council area and elsewhere across NSW that you may not normally do.

With the latest recent rains, the entire Federation Council area continues to look amazing, to set up what will surely be a record harvest across the district.

It was so pleasing for us all to finally see the recent changes to the Victorian border COVID-19 restrictions, including more reasons being introduced to allow travel across the border, and a widening of the 'border region' area. This is finally starting to provide some relief to our most impacted businesses and also the allowances for ag workers and farmers generally, and allowing relocations, were a much needed common sense decision.

Our entire Local Government Area is included in the new 'border region' which allows more freedom to go about our daily lives again and also greatly assists our workforce and contractors completing projects. Council has heavily advocated for this, with the assistance of Albury MP Justin Clancy and Cross Border Commissioner James McTavish and we thank them for their efforts. We also thank the community for your efforts in relating these issues to bring this to the attention of the Government. We will also continue to lobby for greater support to businesses and groups most impacted by issues to do with COVID-19, and place our Council in the best position to take advantage of any stimulus funding for our projects.

Council encourages local businesses that have been impacted by the border restrictions to apply for the Southern Border Small Business Grant. Federation Council business affected may be eligible for \$5,000 to 10,000 from this program. Read more about this opportunity on page 15 of this newsletter.

2021 Australia Day nominations are currently open for submissions and Council is calling on residents to nominate and recognise the wonderful contributions that people in our community make to our region. I encourage you to consider who helps and supports you in your day to day life and consider nominating them for an award.

CHANGES MADE TO BORDER RESTRICTIONS WELCOMED

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said recent changes to border restrictions have been warmly welcomed by many residents throughout the Federation region community.

Mayor Bourke said the outcome far exceeds what was first expected, with the entire Federation LGA being included in the expanded border region map.

“These are really welcomed changes and to extend the border bubble to include our entire Local Government Area is more than we could have hoped and expected,” he said.

“People can now get on with business and start to live their lives with some sort of normality again. There is no doubt the mental health side of border restrictions has been massive and given the news that we are now formally in a recession, the need for our communities to be able to function cohesively is more important than ever before.”

Mayor Bourke said he had heard from many residents in the Federation community who said they were relieved that common sense had prevailed at last.

“People are still taking the health risks very seriously but they want to be able to run their businesses and support local businesses across our border communities. These changes now will go a long



way to ensuring this can happen again and soften what has been a really hard blow for many.”

In closing Mayor Bourke thanked the tireless work that has been led by MP Justin Clancy and Cross Border Commissioner James McTavish.

“I take my hat off to the work Justin Clancy and James McTavish have done, they have been amazing and a constant support for us local leaders throughout this. They have stood beside us and advocated on behalf of us. This has very much been a team effort.”

The new Public Health Order will come into effect at 12.01am on Friday 4 September.

The Public Health (COVID-19 Border Control) Map (No 2) which defines the “border region” has also been made by the Minister.

FEDERATION BUSINESSES INVITED TO SIGN UP TO COUNCIL'S FREE MARKET-PLACE PLATFORM

In an effort to increase the amount of opportunities and spend driven to the local economy, Federation Council have launched a platform that makes it easier for buyers to identify local suppliers and invite them to submit quotes and proposals for their projects and works.

VendorPanel Marketplace is free for suppliers to use. Once registered, they can receive invitations to quote on work across dozens of categories, from advertising to waste management.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said the platform manages all communication between buyers and suppliers, reducing admin, saving time and ensuring procurement good practice is followed.

"The economic benefits in other regional areas using Marketplace have been remarkable," he said.

"An audited case study of 26 Councils using the platform found that in 84.4% of cases jobs were awarded to local suppliers. The study also found that local suppliers were competitive, delivering on average 9.74% savings to the buyer."

James Leathem, CEO of VendorPanel, said Local Government and large businesses want to work with local suppliers where they can and VendorPanel provides the opportunity to do so.



"In fact, locals are often better placed to meet buyers' needs than larger, distant competitors," he said.

"VendorPanel Marketplace makes it easy for large organisations to find local suppliers and get better procurement outcomes, and it helps SMEs in the region to get access to these opportunities."

The fees have been structured in a manner to encourage separation and recycling which in turn minimises the volume of rubbish being disposed of at landfill sites located in the Federation Council area.

Applications towards the Riverina Water Community Grants Program open on Monday 21 September 2020.

The program aims to support a wide range of community projects and activities that enhance life for the wider community.

Local not-for-profit community groups, schools and educational institutions based in the Riverina Water supply area are invited to apply which include the northern located communities of Federation Council (Rand, Oaklands, Urana, Boree Creek and Morundah).

The Federation Council local government area has been allocated a total of \$153,360.00 and there are a range of Grant Categories and funding ranges from \$2500 to \$10,000.

BOREE CREEK SIGNS PROGRESS

Some Boree Creek shop signs left traces that are being restored by retracing with chalk and hand-painting.

But on two gables, the signs have totally worn off. So new signs are being hand painted for these gables. The shed next to the hotel used to be Kelly's Garage.

The far end of the shops used to supply fuel and Sunshine farm machinery. Various brands of fuel were sold at different times and vintage BP petrol and Esso oil drop man (called "Happy") have been painted. The distinctive Sunshine logo was displayed on its harvesters and tractors and has been carefully hand painted as a large sign to be fitted to the gable.

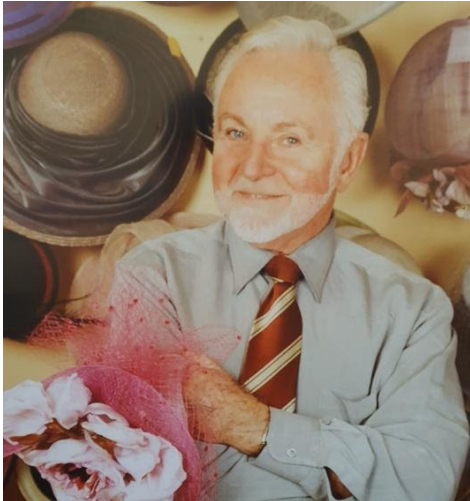

Urana PS students have been kept extremely busy this term! The “Blue Earth” fitness program recommenced, in person once again (rather than via Zoom) with the wonderful instructor Kesley. Students just love all the varied and challenging activities which keep their minds active and their heart rates racing!

In the classroom, students have plunged into rich and engaging learning tasks. The themes for this term are Deserts (Science) , the combined histories of European and Aboriginal Australians and Australian Federation. During English sessions, Years 4-6 students are studying the novel *Crow Country* by Kate Constable, a time-slip narrative set in the small Victorian country town of Boort. The themes of the book cover racial discrimination, heritage and culture, and justice and restitution. The students are enjoying the story and the ethics and morals portrayed within; their writing tasks stem from the themes in the book and include the composition of persuasive, informative and creative texts.

Year 2 students are enjoying the novel *Bungawitta*, by Emily Rodda. The setting is a fictional town in outback Australia that has nearly been deserted due to a “big” drought. It is a humorous and engaging story about how the remaining townsfolk make plans to keep the town alive by holding a mud sculpting festival. Students are engaged

in many comprehension activities and writing tasks.

During numeracy lessons, students weaknesses have been targeted through extensive testing and observation and supported by directly teaching the specific skills needed. Having Mrs Graham here in the school 3 days per week has made it possible for us to split the class during maths lessons, with two teachers (Mrs Graham and myself) then having ample time to spend with individual students. This has been working extremely well and we are already seeing improved outcomes for most students!

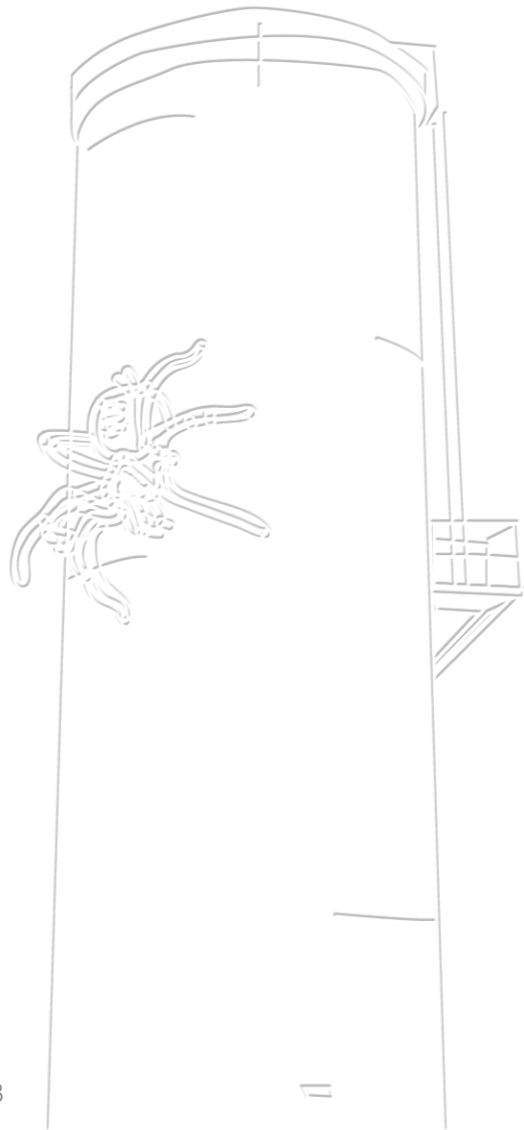

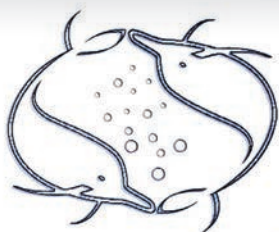

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
