Wangaratta Youth Council - Amber gave an update on some events that the youth council has been involved in previously: GeekCon, SongWriting Workshops, RockPool (live music and movies during summer), North East skate park events, pop up music in parks — accessible events to

Albury Youth Council: youth connect card initiative (in conjunction with Wodonga Youth Council, giving discounts to youth for local businesses), kool schools awards night (songwriting, trips to Melbourne to record), Leadership conferences (festival vibes), Clean up graffiti day, all abilities ball

Lismore Youth Council: Zombie walk, geeky performance art,

Mitchell Youth Council: australia day festival, Christmas toiletry drive, cyber tattoo presentation, Haywire/RAGE grant (Rural Australians for Gender Equality)

Shepparton Youth Council: Grant through Haywire — Magnify Mentoring idea — transitioning from final years of high school with a local mentor

6. Focus for Next few meeting

Amber Harvey advised that Council received a grant of \$25,480 through the NSW Government's Youth Opportunities Program to establish and drive this youth development program.

The suggestion is that is involves at least one youth focused initiative — but possibilities to run several different initiatives — with the possibilities of events, community facilities (ping pong/youth space). Largely autonomous from main council, reporting back to council as required.

Following this discussion, Youth Council did a SWOT analysis on the needs of Federation Council area in relation to Youth:

SWOT ANALYIS ON THE NEEDS OF YOUTH IN THE FEDERATION COUNCIL AREA

Strengths Beautiful surroundings, Sports, Interactive, Small-close knit community, Interconnecting, People currently hang-out at home, McDonalds, youth groups, skate park, river, parks, Time between football and cricket seasons key for potential events, relatively short distances to other towns, space.

Weakness Lack of interaction between social groups, lack of working together, Youth aren't as connected to older people, Lack of socialising (tech), Young people leave, Not much entertainment, cinema - can't go under 18, lack of diversity, Isolation/lack of interests and hobby options

Opportunities Hang out space(s)/cafe type with free WIFI that was "youthful"/cool, Technology / communication, app for connection, social media connections, youth council page, Skate Park -Youth Space, Pool, TAFE (new TAFE to provide new opportunities, Sporting grounds, more funding for schools and sports, new Sport, interests (Soccer/basketball?), Youth Centre -- space for interaction, using spaces already available, engaging resources across community groups

Weakness Lack of opportunity, Unwillingness to be uncomfortable, Fear of never being comfortable, Fear of Judgement from others, Space for safe interaction, Must be marketed right/done well to be effective

Current events with some focus on youth- Skate Park Event, Oaklands Truck Show, Billy Carts, Show, Carols, Easter Egg Hunt, "Flicks In The Sticks", Festival of Fun for Kids,

Main issue - inclusiveness and belonging.

Respected. Space that is available.

Multi purpose field. Multi purpose building.

Other ideas raised:

Uno club in the library, Social space at schools — building connections within schools, building connections with the community, Ping pong table, Outdoor gym equipment. Wodonga junction-type space.

Councilors to mentor one youth council, business cards, each to have business cards. Youth face book page, generic email, Facebook page. Youth council were all keen to have own page as a space for receiving and sharing ideas
