Our communities are changing – we are ageing and living longer than ever before. In fact, Federation Council already has a population that is older than the NSW state average (27% compared with 16% over 65 years) and this is predicted to increase to 38% by 2036 (compared with NSW 21%).

Our changing communities bring both challenges and opportunities. In response, Federation Council is preparing an **Ageing Well Strategy** that will identify long term directions and priority services, infrastructure and projects for the next 4 years. **To do this, and get it right, we invite your help.**

The results from this survey will be added to literature and data reviews, service provider interviews, and focus group information and will be used to inform the Ageing Well Strategy 2018-2021.
