New requirements for NSW food businesses



Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW.

From 8 December 2023, businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene.

Higher-risk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices.

While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits,

Land reported to Council as having overgrown vegetation may be issued with an Order 21 in accordance with Section 124 of the Local Government Act 1993 and may be issued with a Penalty Notice.

Federation Council will receive \$5,893,920 for road repairs

as part of the \$15 million in new funding announced for the Albury electorate from the Regional Emergency Road Repair Fund (RERRF) announced in the 2023-24 NSW Budget.

Council to receive \$5.8m for road repairs

During a visit to Albury last week, Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Jenny Aitchison said the Minns Labor Government's new cash injection would enable local councils to press ahead with urgent road and pothole repairs.

"Whether it's fixing potholes, sealing roads, resurfacing or rehabilitating sections of road — this new fund will help councils undertake much needed work to repair their road networks,' Minister Aitchison said.

"I am also pleased to see councils will be able to prioritise what roads to spend this new money and allocate it to where they believe the community need is greatest."

Budget figures shown below reveal councils in the Albury electorate will receive more than \$15 million from RERRF.

- Albury City Council \$1,469,646
- Federation Council \$5,893,920
- Greater Hume Shire Council \$5,329,065
- Snowy Valleys Council \$3,045,308

Minister Aitchison said the funding amount allocated to each council was based on the total kilometres of regional and local roads each council was responsible for managing.

"The Minns Labor Government's RERRF will deliver \$390 million to 95 eligible councils across NSW, including Albury City, Federation, Greater Hume and Snowy Valleys Councils. to upgrade their roads," Minister Aitchison said.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council welcomed the funding announcement.

"This is fantastic news for our region and Council warmly welcomes this generous funding allocation through the Regional Emergency Road Repair Fund," Mayor Bourke said.

"We have a large road network, and funding such as this goes a long way in helping Council address our critical infrastructure priorities. Council looks forward to commencing works under this program as soon as possible."

Mayor and Deputy Mayor re-elected

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke and Deputy Mayor, Cr Shaun Whitechurch will continue in their respective leadership roles following an extraordinary meeting on Friday, September 22.

Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke was re-elected to the position of Mayor, unopposed.

Deputy Mayor, Cr Shaun Whitechurch was re-elected to the position of Deputy Mayor, defeating Councillor Rowena Black, who was also nominated for the position 5-3. Mayor Bourke and Deputy Mayor Whitechurch will hold their positions for a 12-month period, until September 2024.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke thanked the Councillors for putting their trust in him for the next 12 months.

"Thank you to my fellow Councillors for their continued support and I look forward to serving Federation Council for the remainder of my term," Mayor Bourke said.

Federation Council Deputy Mayor, Cr Shaun Whitechurch said he was honoured to be re-elected to the position of Deputy Mayor.

"I look forward to working alongside Mayor Bourke and fellow councillors over the next 12 months to make positive contributions and address the challenges that lie ahead for our region," Deputy Mayor Whitechurch said.

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Capital Works Program Update - August 2023



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region. The following activities were undertaken during August 2023 by Federation Council's Operations Works teams.

- Balldale Road 8km reconstruction LRCI Grant Works recommenced in August. Section 4km to 6km of bulk earthworks and widening in preparation of new gravel pavement in September.
- North Street, Mulwala Kerb & Channel and footpath New footpath, kerb and gutter and drainage have been installed on Corowa Road at North Street Mulwala and Lang Street Mulwala. Asphalting of the road surface in front of new kerb & gutter to be completed when contractors become available.
- SRV Gravel Resheeting Narrow Plains Road 1.35km west from Wangamong Road rail crossing. Sandy Ridges Road 2.3km south from Buraja Road.
- Maintenance Grading Council secured funds from the NSW Government under the Regional Local Rural Road Repair Program to undertake road repairs on sealed and unsealed roads after the floods in late 2022. Council is using this grant to fund the maintenance grading of unsealed roads leading up to another large harvest season. See tables below of graded roads.
- Table drain maintenance Table drain maintenance focussed on customer requests during winter. Please Note: Works were carried out only in zones where no impact can be made on the Sloanes Froglet (between April and October breeding season).
- Sealed Roads Numerous customer requests for pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads have been received and actioned with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jet Master patching truck. Work is continuous on all roads such as:

Federation Way south/north, Jerilderie Road, Boree Road, Urana/Boree/Morundah/Oakland and Rand township and rural roads. The impacts of the flooding and recent prolonged period of wet weather are still a significant issues that the operations staff are working hard to get on top of.

- Maintenance Crew/Sundry Crew Culvert installations/ Repairs Patching with cold mix, Sign replacements, Guild posts, General maintenance in townships, Working on both construction jobs when needed.
 Flood damage repairs, Fulfilling customer requests, Floating plant throughout the shire, Operating loader in pits and stock piles, Table drain maintenance, Roadside tree sucker removal/spraying.
- Heavy Trucks Carting waste/gravel for earthworks, culvert replacement on Cullivel Rd, Gravel carting for Balldale Road, Carting stone for patching trucks and Jetpatcher Carting excess spoil from Mulwala to Corowa Landfill for cover & capping.
- TfNSW / RMCC Maintenance works under the RMCC agreement.
- Quarries Planning is well under way for the blasting of 100,000 tons of blast and crushing at the Balldale and Daysdale quarries. The gravels will be used for upcoming RRRP and capital works programs. Awaiting contractor.
- Slasher Corowa Landfill Bynedale Rd Rand township and surrounds.
- Corowa Aerodrome Twice weekly inspections carried out to ensure compliance with the MOS 139. Repairs to lights as required. Herbicide spraying on runway shoulders.
- Construction 1 & 2 Pothole repairs in unsealed urban roads. Corowa Road Mulwala North Street footpath, kerb & channel and drainage. Table drain maintenance, drainage and culvert works, urban and rural roads. Gravel patching urban unsealed roads.

Pre-lodgement meetings for development requiring connection to the water supply network - Howlong

The contract for water main upgrade works in Howlong to increase water supply and reliability was awarded earlier this year, with an anticipated completion date of December 2023. Given the timeframes for construction of developments and the likely timing for connections to the water supply network, Council wishes to advise that we can now schedule pre-lodgement meetings to discuss proposed development with a water demand greater than a 3 bedroom dwelling, or greater than1 allotment. This includes residential, commercial and industrial developments.

A reminder to applicants that the information provided with applications for development with a water demand of greater than a standard 3 bedroom dwelling or greater than a single residential allotment (known as an Equivalent Tenement, or ET) needs to provide appropriate commentary in response to the requirements of Clause 7.9 Essential Services of Corowa LEP 2012 in their supporting Statement of Environmental Effects. It will not be acceptable to state only that urban services are available and can be connected. A more detailed calculation of the water demand from the development (calculated using the NSW Water Directorate Guidelines) must be provided. This will enable Council to avoid the over-allocation of the additional supply generated by the current water main works.
