## **Magpies Swooping**



Spring often signals the beginning of the breeding season for our native birds, mainly Magpies and Plovers, which subsequently means swooping.

During the nesting season, a Magpie may swoop on people, clacking its beak. While alarming, it is usually an attempt to defend its family, so it is just a warning.

The good news is that a single magpie will swoop for only six weeks until their chicks leave the nest.A list of known swooping locations is available from Council's website to

help protect you and your family.

## **Snake Sightings**

Council has received reports of snake sightings throughout the Federation Council area.

During the warmer weather, snakes like to move onto greener pastures to find food or a nice warm place to rest, often placing them in close contact with humans.

If you see a snake, don't panic, back away to a safe distance. All snakes are protected in NSW and killing one is an offence. Only licensed people are allowed to catch or keep snakes. A licensed local herpetologist is able to catch and relocate a snake for a fee.

## Pre-lodgement meetings for development requiring connection to the water supply network - Howlong

The contract for water main upgrade works in Howlong to increase water supply and reliability was awarded earlier this year, with an anticipated completion date of December 2023.

Given the timeframes for construction of developments and the likely timing for connections to the water supply network, Council wishes to advise that we can now schedule pre-lodgement meetings to discuss proposed development with a water demand greater than a 3 bedroom dwelling, or greater than1 allotment. This includes residential, commercial and industrial developments.

A reminder to applicants that the information provided with applications for development with a water demand of greater than a standard 3 bedroom dwelling or greater than a single residential allotment (known as an Equivalent Tenement, or ET) needs to provide appropriate commentary in response to the requirements of Clause 7.9 Essential Services of Corowa LEP 2012 in their supporting Statement of Environmental Effects. It will not be acceptable to state only that urban services are available and can be connected. A more detailed calculation of the water demand from the development (calculated using the NSW Water Directorate Guidelines) must be provided. This will enable Council to avoid the over-allocation of the additional supply generated by the current water main works.

## **Broadleaf Weed Spraying program**

Council wishes to advise that herbicide applications will occur until mid October 2023 to all ovals, parks, cemeteries and recreation areas in the Federation Council area to selectively remove broadleaf weeds.

This annual program removes broadleaf weeds, reducing mowing frequencies and improving turf density. The selective herbicide that will be used is Javelin (20g/l Clopyralid, 15g/l Diflufenican, 300g/l Mcpa). Please get in touch with the Council for further information or with any questions.

## **Biosecurity Weed Control**

With the commencement of Spring and the weather warming up, Biosecurity weeds are likely to become more prominent over the coming months.

Federation Council undertakes a Biosecurity weed inspection and control program throughout the year on Council land and roadsides to reduce the threat to primary production and biodiversity.

Council is currently prioritising the reduction and elimination of Biosecurity weeds, with a focus on problem weeds such as Chilean Needle Grass, St John's Wort, Spiny Burr Grass, Horehound, African Boxthorn, Blackberry, Silver leaf nightshade and Coolatai Grass to name a few.

A spot spraying program will be undertaken from September through to May with the following herbicides being used;

- Glyphosate 360 Bi Active
- Glyphosate 450,540
- Starane Advanced
- BS 1000 Wetter
- Metsulfuron-methy- Brush-off
- Spray Marker Dye- For High volume spot spray areas

Council is encouraging landowners to take effective measures to remove weeds from their property including spot spraying, biological control and chip and burn. To assist landowners, a range of information and resources regarding weeds can be found at any Council office, which includes printed materials to help with the identification of weeds. ## New requirements for NSW food businesses



Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW.

From 8 December 2023, businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene. Higherrisk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices.

While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits, correctional centres, delis and supermarkets, and some coffee vendors. Find out more from Council's website.

- A referee (including contact details)
