Community Grants Program



Round one of the Federation Council 2023-2024 Community Grants Program is now open, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

- Category 1 Emerging Grant funding, to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
 - to support the strategic development for small to medium events applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

If you are an eligible group and you have a great idea that can benefit the wider community, don't miss this opportunity to review the guidelines and submit your initiative via our online form before 5pm, Friday 15 September, 2023.

The Bald Archy is back!



Australia's premier satirical art prize, the Bald Archy Prize, is back at the Corowa Art Space from 8 September to 8 October.

The famous and infamous personalities were plentiful among the 22 finalists, but in the end, Albo, Scomo, Dutton, George Pell, Gina Rinehart, Ash Barty, Costa and even King Charles failed to take the crown in this year's hard-fought competition. The winner, instead, went to a portrait by Marty Steel of the founder of the Bald Archy Prize, Peter Batey who passed away in 2019.

Created in 1994 as a spoof of that more serious competition, the Bald Archy Prize provides artists of all styles and standards with a genuine opportunity, ranging from the hilarious to the bizarrely vulgar, to create portrait paintings of humour, dark satire, light comedy, or caricature. After the passing of Peter, the administration of the Bald Archy Prize was handed over to the Museum of the Riverina, Wagga Wagga.

Now known internationally as the only art competition in the world to be judged by a sulfur-crested cockatoo named Maude, the satirical side of this event has its basis in the irreverent, larrikin Australian comic comment, with great appeal to people from all walks of life, the reason why the exhibition of finalists keeps breaking attendance records wherever it is shown.

Entry cost for adults is \$5.00 and children are free. Group bookings are welcome.

Overgrown Vegetation

Spring is now upon us bringing weather conditions that promote abundant growth of grass, shrubs, weeds and other vegetation. As the fire restriction period is fast approaching, Council is encouraging your help to keep our community safe by ensuring properties are regularly maintained now and into the future.

Federation Council wishes to remind all landowners that they are responsible for keeping the vegetation within their property boundaries, fence lines and nature strips in good order.

Council staff will undertake routine inspections over the coming months and will respond to resident concerns about excessive vegetation growth on properties.

To bring an issue to our attention, please lodge an online customer request from Council's website or contact our customer service team by phone.

Land reported to Council as having overgrown vegetation may be issued with an Order 21 in accordance with Section 124 of the Local Government Act 1993 and may be issued with a Penalty Notice.

Water Main Cleaning

Federation Council will commence water main cleaning in the townships of Corowa, Mulwala and Howlong from Monday 28 August 2023.

Customers may experience short periods of dirty or discoloured water during cleaning. Works are expected to be completed by Tuesday, 19 September 2023.

Periodic water main cleaning is part of the ongoing commitment by the Council to maintain a quality water supply for its customers.

Selective Herbicide Applications

Council wishes to advise that herbicide applications will occur from mid August to mid October 2023 to all ovals, parks, cemeteries and recreation areas in the Federation Council area to selectively remove broadleaf weeds.

This annual program removes broadleaf weeds, reducing mowing frequencies and improving turf density.

The selective herbicide that will be used is Javelin (20g/l Clopyralid, 15g/l Diflufenican, 300g/l Mcpa).
