Youth Mental Health a priority in Federation Council



"Wear it Blue" for Youth Mental Health is a campaign organised by Federation Youth Council encouraging everyone to wear blue for mental health on Friday 3rd October. The campaign will mark the beginning of Mental Health Month in NSW.

"We want everyone to get involved from schools, work places to community groups," says Youth Mayor, Max Sampson. "Some of us are just painting our nails blue. If you were feeling brave you could rock the blue eyeshadow, or dye your whole hair blue! It doesn't matter if you just don blue socks. Wear blue any way that works for you."

The Youth Councillors decided to do this initiative in hope of raising awareness and to reduce stigma surrounding mental health issues faced by people in the Federation Council area including young people.

"We really want to promote how important it is for all people to have open and meaningful conversations about well-being with their friends, family or networks," says the Youth Mayor.

"In particular it is imperative that young people feel confident to have meaningful conversation with someone they trust about life's ups and downs." The Federation Youth Council will be hosting a street stall in Memorial Plaza in Corowa on Friday 3rd October, with information on local and online resources for people to take. The information will apply to all people, not just young people. "Pop over and say hi," says Max. "We've got heaps of giveaways, and you don't even have to wear blue. We just want to spread some kindness, share information and make others feel special."

What can you do?

- On Friday 3 October wear blue as a symbol of support and solidarity for people experiencing mental health issues.
- Post a picture on social media and tag #lamfederation.
- Visit the Youth Council at their pop up in the Memorial Plaza in Sanger Street in Corowa.
- Start a conversation with a young person or someone in your life about mental health.

The Federation Youth Council is made up of a group of passionate young people aged between 12 and 25 years old who act as the voice for young people within the Federation Council Local Government Area, advocating for the needs, wants and concerns of young people living, studying and working in our area. Help us improve Howlong's water pressure and flow by performing a simple Bucket Test at your home!

Federation Council is committed to upgrading Howlong's water infrastructure. As part of our detailed hydraulic modelling, we need your help to pinpoint areas of low water pressure across town. Your participation in the Bucket Test provides data that will directly assist our engineers in designing the most effective solutions.

What is the Howlong Bucket Test?

It's a quick, easy test you can do at home to measure your current water flow rate. All you need is a standard 10-litre bucket and a stopwatch (or your phone's timer).

Why Should You Participate?

- Direct Impact: Your results provide essential data for our engineers, helping us understand specific pressure issues in your area.
- Better Solutions: The more data we collect, the more accurately we can design upgrades to improve water pressure and flow for everyone.
- Community Contribution: Be a part of the solution for Howlong's water future!

How to do the Bucket Test (5 simple steps!)

- 1. Find a standard 10-litre bucket.
- 2. Open your garden tap (or other outdoor tap) closest to your water meter fully.
- 3. Time how long it takes to fill the 10-litre bucket.
- 4. Note down the time in seconds. Also note the time and day you recorded this information.
 - 5. Complete the online form on Council's website and send your test results to Council.

That's it! It only takes a minute or two.
