SELECTIVE HERBICIDE APPLICATIONS

Selective Broadleaf weed spraying will occur in September 2025 and October 2025. The application will occur in turf situations that include ovals, parks, cemeteries and open spaces to selectively remove weeds across the Federation Council. The selective herbicide that will be used is Javelin (20 a/l Clopyralid, 15 a/l Diflufenican, 300 a/l MCPA)

This process is to improve the turf quality and reduce mowing frequencies.
