# Message from the Administrator

#### 2017/2018 Council Budget

Council will soon be commencing the preparation of the 2017/18 budget and I know many residents will be nervous about getting a fair share.

A number of issues will be considered in framing the next budget including:

- A strong focus on repair and maintenance of existing assets;
  - The best priority to minimise the whole of life cost of owning assets;
  - Ensuring all parts of the council are fairly considered; and
    - Maximising available funds for rural roads both sealed and unsealed.

Council will continue to apply for grants from the State and Federal Government to increase the funding available for roads and will work hard to ensure the priority for spending reduces the whole of life costs of owning assets.

Council will also focus on improving the quality of results through staff training and effective use of contractors where this is required.

Council intends to host a series of briefing sessions about the proposed budget on the following days and times:

The final budget will be adopted at the Ordinary Council Meeting on 20 June 2017.

The community prioritised roads as a focus for Council expenditure in the Customer Survey last year and Council will be allocating most of its budget to this expenditure area.



#### Stronger Communities Fund deliberations about to commence

Federation Council will determine how to best invest the remaining \$9.4 million dollars of the Stronger Communities Fund next month.

Council has received 36 applications for Round Two of the Stronger Community Grants which closed earlier this month. The applications total just over \$1 million in funding requests, towards projects estimated at \$2.1 million.

'We congratulate everyone for the hard work they have put into preparing their applications.' said Federation Council Administrator, Mike Eden.

'The applications are of a high standard and quite diverse, with nine communities represented and projects ranging from wildlife protection and wetland developments to facility and equipment upgrades to historical restoration projects.' he said.

Council has also prepared 16 applications for consideration as part of the Major Projects Fund. These projects are large scale priority infrastructure and services projects that aim to deliver long term economic and social benefits.

The applications total almost \$11.3 million in funding requests towards projects estimated at \$14.6 million. Of these, \$3.8 million has been requested for road improvements. The projects being considered are listed below and a brief summary of each can be found on Council's website <u>www.federationcouncil.nsw.gov.au</u>

- 1. Upgrade and construction of an All Abilities Adventure Playground at Purtle Park in Mulwala
- 2. Renewal of Kyffins Reserve in Mulwala
- 3. Design and Construction of a Skate Park in Howlong
- 4. Upgrade to Tennis Courts in Howlong
- 5. Upgrade and Renewal of Victoria Park in Urana
- 6. Upgrade to Netball Tennis Courts in Urana
- 7. Establishment of an RV Park at Oaklands
- 8. Upgrade to the Sports Club Facilities in Rand
- 9. Upgrade to Netball Tennis Courts in Coreen
- 10. Upgrade to Skate Park in Corowa
- 11. Upgrade to the Swimming Pool in Corowa
- 12. Renewal of the RSL Playground in Corowa
- 13. Renewal of Bangerang Park in Corowa
- 14. Establishment of a Cinema in Corowa
- 15. Establishment of a Cultural Trail across the Council
- 16. Roads throughout the Council

Residents are invited to review the summary document of the major projects being considered and provide comments in writing by 5pm Friday 7 April.

An independent panel will convene to review all the Round Two and Major Project applications early next month. They will be looking for strong projects that will build more vibrant, sustainable and inclusive local communities and deliver social, cultural, economic or environmental benefits.

An outcome on successful projects will be announced at the April Council Meeting on April 18.

The Stronger Community Fund has been provided to Federation Council by the NSW Government.

#### FAIRER FUNDING FOR FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

A fairer system for funding NSW fire and emergency services is one step closer today, with Treasurer Dominic Perrottet to introduce the Fire and Emergency Services Levy Bill.

The legislation gives effect to reforms announced in 2015 to abolish the Emergency Services Levy (ESL) – paid on insurance – and replace it with a land-based Fire and Emergency Services Levy (FESL), bringing NSW into line with all other mainland states.

Mr Perrottet said the reform would transform an archaic, complex system into one that is fair for everyone.

"Everyone in NSW values the work of our fire and emergency services personnel, but the way we currently fund them is complicated, inefficient and unfair," Mr Perrottet said.

"Only people with insurance pay the ESL, even though everyone benefits, and at the same time it makes insurance more expensive."

"This legislation ushers in an important reform – a fairer system where all property owners make a contribution, while also bringing down the cost of insurance."

Under the legislation:

- FESL is calculated on unimproved land value determined by the Valuer General, with different rates for residential, public benefit, commercial, industrial and farm land.
- The levy comprises a different base amount for each land category, plus a variable amount based on land value.
- Councils would collect the FESL on behalf of the NSW Government.
- The old ESL paid on top of insurance premiums is abolished.

Owners of residential and public benefit land will pay lower rates, and vacant land will have a discount applied. There will also be discounts available for pensioners and veterans, and a hardship policy for those who need it.

Eliminating the old ESL is expected to reduce insurance costs on residential property by an average of \$233, leaving fully-insured residential property owners better off by \$47 per year on average.

To ensure insurance companies pass on any benefit to consumers, last year the Government appointed Professors Allan Fels AO and David Cousins AM as Insurance Monitors with power to fine insurers up to \$10 million for failing to pass on savings.

The legislation will be considered by Parliament in the coming weeks and if passed, will take effect on July 1. For more information visit <u>www.fesl.nsw.gov.au</u>.

## \$125,000 AVAILABLE FOR LOCAL WAR MEMORIALS

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin and Minister for Veterans Affairs David Elliott today announced the first round of 2017 funding for the Community War Memorials Fund (CWMF) is now open.

The CWMF is designed to protect and repair local war memorials, which preserves the Anzac legacy.

Mr Aplin encourages Councils to apply for the fund, which provides the opportunity for all NSW communities to access up to \$10,000.

"Ensuring local war memorials remain in great condition is an essential part of honouring Australian service men and women who sacrificed so much for our nation," Mr Aplin said.

"The CWMF ensures communities have the opportunity to protect and conserve war memorials, which is why I believe this is such an important initiative," he said.

"Funding applications can be made by veterans groups, community organisations and councils until Anzac Day and I sincerely encourage all communities who require funds for restoration to apply," Minister for Veterans Affairs David Elliott said.

Applications will be assessed by the State War Memorial Committee, which is made up of NSW RSL, Public Works Advisory, NSW Office of Environment and Heritage and Veterans' Affairs.

## NEW FUND TO BOOST REGIONAL GROWTH THROUGH ENVIRONMENT AND TOURISM INFRASTRUCTURE

Local community and government organisations are being encouraged to seek funding for environment and tourism projects under the NSW Government's new \$300 million *Regional Growth* – *Environment and Tourism Fund.* 

Member for Albury, Greg Aplin said the fund aims to increase tourist visitation by supporting regional environment and tourism infrastructure projects which, in turn, help grow and diversify the regional economy.

"This is a great opportunity for our region and I strongly encourage local organisations to pitch for the funding," said Mr Aplin.

"Expressions of interest are now open for the initial round of the Fund – at least \$100 million is available for regional environment and tourism projects for local and state government agencies, Aboriginal Land Councils, community groups registered as incorporated associations and non-government organisations.

"We are looking for visionary projects that will transform regional economies – they could include new or upgraded visitor infrastructure for national parks, new or upgraded camping facilities, repurposing of Crown Lands or heritage buildings for tourism and the infrastructure to support new visitor activities and eco-tourism.

"The expressions of interest, which close on 6 April 2017, will be independently assessed and shortlisted by Infrastructure NSW with assistance from other NSW agencies."

Deputy Premier and Minister for Regional New South Wales, John Barilaro, said the Regional Growth – Environment and Tourism Fund was an exciting new initiative that would help to increase tourist visitation, drive jobs creation and build on other NSW Government regional investment programs.

"The Fund is part of the \$20 billion Rebuilding NSW initiative, from which the Government has committed \$6 billion for regional NSW.

"Already, \$110 million has been provided for investments into regional tourism infrastructure including for regional airports, regional cruise facilities and rail trails."

...personalized, innovative education in a safe and supportive environment

Welcome back to the 2017 school year, it is Week 7 already, time has flown by! We have settled into a great routine and have been excited by so many new things.

Our Mondays have been very physical-we have had a Cricket NSW coach in our school delivering cricket sessions. The students have developed their skills in batting, bowling and fielding with some drills and games. These were fast paced sessions which the students really enjoyed. This program was made available with the Australian Sports Commission Sporting Schools funding.



Our Bluearth coach, Drew, visits on a fortnightly basis. These too are very physical sessions designed to not only address the students' physical health but also improve self awareness, focus, self esteem and resilience.

We want the students' to have active lives with improved physical, social and emotional health.



Our big project for the year is in the new and emerging area of Robotics. Our students are involved in an innovative learning community project on a weekly basis.

Each fortnight we travel to Berrigan Public School where students from Berrigan, Blighty, Jerilderie and Urana come together to learn about coding in order to program their robots to perform set tasks. Lego WeDo and EV3 Mindstorms kits are used together with devices such as iPads or laptops.

In the alternate fortnight the students have virtual sessions using an Adobe Connect meeting room. They also utilise Google Classroom to answer questions, reflect on their learning and upload evidence of their weekly 'build'.

The response has been emphatic—" I wish there were

more Thursdays!"
