It's been another busy month for Federation Council and its communities.

Council has launched its new and improved grant programs, designed to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that contribute to the vibrancy and well-being of the community. Two rounds will be facilitated each year, with a total amount of \$55,000 available to fund initiatives. Round one is now open and Council is encouraging applications. Council would like to thank those residents that attended the Flood Study Reports community meeting recently at the Urana Bowling Club. Council would like to also thank those who provided valuable feedback on the reports during the exhibition period. The Draft Flood Study Reports of Urana, Morundah, Boree Creek, Oaklands and Rand model flooding and maps flood affected lands within each town. The draft reports are the first step in the development of a Floodplain Management Process for each of the towns. Residents will be kept updated throughout the next phase of the project.

Another important date for the Urana and District communities is Remembrance Day, Saturday 11 November. A Memorial Service will be held at the RSL Memorial Honour Roll in Macknight Park, Urana, at 10.30am. School children from Urana Public School and St Francis Xavier's School have also been invited to attend, along with representatives from Federation Council, First Servicemen and Women, together with all member of the community. Morning tea will be available following the service and I am really looking forward to seeing you all there.

It's been fantastic to receive the much needed rains in the last couple of weeks, it has certainly put the crops in a better position to fill and generally freshened up the whole council area.

It was also a great weekend for all which started on Thursday night, with a great crowd at the annual art show, followed by Friday night with Garden Walks and the Urana and District Vintage Machinery Club getting into gear with their annual Tractor Pull. The fun continued through to Saturday and Sunday with the Hospital Fete, hosted by the Hospital Auxiliary and once again it was great to see the Urana Caravan Park packed to capacity with visitors from all over Australia.

Rand Community Playground construction to begin



Excitement is building for the new Rand Community Playground, with the project expected to be complete in the coming weeks.

The Rand Sports Ground Committee and Town Improvement Committee applied for funding for the new playground through round one of the Stronger Communities program.

The application was successful and \$50,000 was allocated to the project, in addition to community-raised funds of \$8,000.

The new playground will support a vibrant and welcoming community space where local families and visitors can come together and enjoy recreational activities. It will compliment other improvements being undertaken at the Recreation Reserve to ensure that residents have access to quality community infrastructure.

The committee has worked closely with Council to finalise the design of the playground, which caters for a range of age groups. The existing equipment at the reserve will be relocated to become part of the new play space, which will be located near the public toilets.

Moduplay have been engaged to construct the new playground alongside Council's parks and garden team. The project is one of five playspace projects expected to be completed across the council area prior to Christmas, with new playgrounds also planned for the Corowa RSL Park and Lowe Square and Memorial Park in Howlong.

The Urana Youth Space is nearing completion and Council will be working with young people in the area to name the site.

Temporary fencing will be installed at the Rand Recreation Reserve and the area will be closed to the public while the playground is being completed.

Australia Day Award nominations open

Federation Mayor Pat Bourke said the awards provide an opportunity to celebrate those residents who dedicate their time to making the region a great place to live.

"We have some fantastic people in the community who contribute so much and we expect to receive some really strong nominations," he said.

Award winners will be presented at the Australia Day Ceremony in Corowa on Friday, 26 January 2018.

Stronger Communities Fund Update

In 2016-2017 almost \$10 million in Stronger Communities Funding (\$9,788,214) was allocated to 31 community based projects (Round 1 and 2) and 15 major projects managed by Council.

Council is pleased to report that 10 of the Round 1 Community Grant Projects are already complete with the remaining 8 projects on track to be completed by mid-December.

Completed projects include:

- Urana Bowling Club New Kitchen.
- Oaklands Recreation Ground Committee Netball/Tennis Fencing.
- Corowa Rugby Club Club Room Improvements.
- Corowa District Landcare Inc. Renewable Energy Forum.
- Corowa District Historical Society Upgrade Security at Corowa Federation Museum.

- Yarrawonga Mulwala Historical Society Improve Heating and Cooling and Lighting at Pioneer Museum Mulwala.
- Howlong Football Club Club Room Upgrade.
- Corowa Rutherglen Football Netball Club Construction of New Netball Court at John Foord Oval.
- Tunzafun Amusement Park Mulwala Solar Panels.
- Corowa Race Club Installation of Water Line.

Round 2 projects are well underway with 4 projects already completed and the remaining 9 projects on track for completion by May 2018.

An exception to this is Daysdale Memorial Hall which has experienced water damage to the floor. This project has been put on hold until this issue is resolved.

Residents are being reminded to dispose of rubbish lawfully. Council Officers have issued two infringement notices recently, following the unlawful disposing of rubbish.

Under the Act, Council Officers can issue a \$2,000 fine to an individual, or \$4,000 fine to a corporation who 'transport etc waste to unlawful waste facility'.

Council launches new funding opportunities to community groups



Federation Council has launched its new and improved grant programs, designed to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that contribute to the vibrancy and well-being of the community.

The Community Grants Program will support initiatives that deliver a range of social and economic benefits to communities across the Federation Council area.

The program provides a more streamlined approach to supporting local community groups, organisations and clubs with delivering community projects and events.

Two rounds will be facilitated each year, with a total amount of \$55,000 available to fund initiatives that:

- Promote a sense of community identity and pride.
- Stimulate economic growth within the community.
- Encourage wide participation in events and community projects.
- Promote Federation Council as a vibrant and diverse place to live and visit.
- Encourage and stimulate the growth of effective community development and cultural programs within Federation Council.

Foster community partnerships.

Round one is now open with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Council is encouraging applications of up to \$3,000 before Friday 3 November 2017. Successful applicants will be notified on the 22 November.

Federation Council Events and Project Officer Jenny Bevis said this program is a way for the community to bring forward new ideas and develop existing projects to a new height.

"It's also a way of encouraging community participation in local activities and championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact," she said.

The introduction of a new Event Sponsorship Program is expected to attract larger events to the region that provide a significant return on investment for the community, as well as support current events to grow.

The Event Sponsorship Program will operate year round and support events that market Federation Council as a tourist destination and demonstrate a positive economic impact.

"This program will focus on events that drive visitation and overnight stays in the region, in addition to providing another great attraction for local residents," said Ms Bevis.

Proposals seeking sponsorship can be submitted at any time and will be assessed against a set criterion to determine the level of benefit generated from the event for the community.



SPRING THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA WARNING

You could be at risk during this thunderstorm asthma season, even if you don't think you have asthma.

Last year in Melbourne an additional 3,643 people presented to hospital and nine died from asthma attacks after a severe thunderstorm.

The next four weeks or so may be a period of greater risk for asthma sufferers and people who wheeze and sneeze during spring time, according to the Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD).

Director Public Health Unit Tracey Oakman reminds all people who wheeze and sneeze during spring that they could be at risk of an asthma event during a thunderstorm.

"Thunderstorms cause pollen grains to explode and release fine particles which can be inhaled more deeply into the lungs making even more people wheeze and sneeze," Mrs Oakman said.

"People should be prepared, not alarmed, and anyone with diagnosed asthma should carry their asthma medication with them at all times during this high risk period," she said.

The Public Health Unit will be monitoring thunderstorm activity and pollen count levels and issuing alerts at these high risk times.

Charles Sturt University has set up a SMS alert system when the pollen counts are high and thunderstorms are predicted. To register for this alert go to; www.csu.edu.au/asthma Alerts will also be sent from the Public Health smartphone App which can be downloaded free.

If anyone experiences breathing difficulties it is essential to seek medical help immediately.

Breathing difficulties can be life threatening. In the event of an asthma emergency dial triple zero (000) immediately.

AFL MORNING







Miki City Cultural Exchange



The Federation Council region has welcomed home seven students from Corowa High School and Oaklands Central School, as well as their chaperones, who have recently returned from a ten-day cultural exchange to Miki City, Japan as guests of our Sister City.

The students stayed with local families and enjoyed an exciting itinerary which included visiting local schools and experiencing Japanese cultural activities including tea ceremony and wearing Kimono.

During the visit to Miki City Federation Council Cr Gail Law signed the new Sister City agreement, between Miki City and Federation Council, on behalf of Mayor Cr Pat Bourke.

The visit included a 20th Anniversary celebration of the original Sister City agreement in 1997. This affiliation was based on mutual exchanges in education, culture, sport, economy and friendly relations.

Since first signing the agreement, 20 years ago, there have been fourteen cultural exchanges involving 100 students and 46 adult attendants. All have home stayed with families in each country and attended the respective schools.

During her speech Cr Law said "On behalf of the Mayor of Federation Council, I thank you for inviting us to share in these important celebrations and look forward to many more years of exchanges and making lifetime friends."

Students will be invited to address Council's November meeting to share their experiences and what they have learned during the exchange.
