ENGAGE WITH US THIS MAY ON FUTURE FEDERATION 2023-2024



Federation Council is asking the community to help shape Future Federation 2023-2024 by providing further input into its combined Delivery Program and Operational Plan, and other supporting strategic documents.

Council's combined Delivery Program and Operational Plan is an important document that sets out Council's action plan for achieving the community priorities outlined in the Community Strategic Plan (CSP). It identifies the specific projects, programs and activities that Council will conduct to progress community priorities, as well as initiatives required to fulfil Council's legislative responsibilities.

This is supported by the Annual Budget which outlines how Council will fund the delivery of services and projects to its community. It funds services like managing waste, maintaining infrastructure, community facilities and parks, operating libraries, events and services to people at all stages of life. This is 'Future Federation 2023-2024'.

Council will be presented with the draft Delivery Program, Operational Plan and Annual Budget, along with the updated Long Term Financial Plan, at its April meeting of Council. These documents provide a guide to Council's operations and help the organisation meet community demands for services and infrastructure by maximising what it can achieve with its available resources, whilst planning for a sustainable future.

Council's key strategic documents will be on public exhibition from Wednesday, April 26 through to 5pm on Wednesday, May 31. During this time, we will be seeking further feedback from the community on these draft key strategic documents. This includes our:

- Draft Delivery Program and Operational Plan (including Annual Budget);
- Draft Fees and Charges 2023-2024;
 and
- 10 Year Long Term Financial Plan.

CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE - FEBRUARY 2023



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region. The following activities were undertaken during February 2023 by Federation Council's Works teams.

Staff have continued to undertake heavy patching repairs throughout the network with assistance from contractors, as ground conditions allow. This situation is being closely monitored and as conditions improve, further remediation works can be prioritised.

John Street Drainage

Road Construction completed, including stabilising pavement and new seal.

Corowa - Mulwala Cycleway

Seal booked for remaining unsealed sections early March, weather permitting.

Settlers Road Upgrade

Final trim grading and new seal.

Balldale Road 8km reconstruction LRCI Grant

Works commenced on the first 1km section, approx. 2km north of Riverina Hwy. Works include: survey set out, rip up existing narrow pavement, construct

new 9m wide formation, batters and 200mm gravel pavement.

Federation Way Upgrade – HVSPP Grant

Continuation of works on Federation Way south of Daysdale township. Works include: earthworks, formation, batters, gravel pavement, new seal, guideposts and signage.

Maintenance Grading/Flood Repairs

Settlers Road, Larcombes Road, Fergusons Road, Skehans Lane, Caringa Lane, Wells Lane.

Gravel Re-sheeting Program

Waverley Road, Tom Roberts Road completed.

Road Side Rural Slashing

Hopefield Road, Izons Road, Hopefield Siding Road, Mahonga Lane, Coreen Balldale Road. Corowa Aerodrome grass runway strip.

• Table drain Maintenance

Hopefield Road, Izons Road, Hopefield Siding Road, Mahonga Lane, Coreen Balldale Road. Corowa Aerodrome grass runway strip.

Sealed Roads

Pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jet Master patching truck.

LOCAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM ROLLING OUT IN JINDERA AND COROWA



The Fischer Community Leadership Program, aptly named in honor of the late Tim Fischer AC, is coming to Jindera and Corowa. On the back of the successful pilot program delivered last year in Henty and Holbrook, funding has been secured for the 2023 program from the New South Wales Government Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 5.

The program is an initiative of Fischer Community Leadership in partnership with Federation and Greater Hume Councils, auspice by the Border Trust and delivered by Alpine Valleys Community Leadership. The program's focus is to develop community leadership skills and create a group of community leaders equipped to take action and make a difference.

This year, one program will run in Jindera, and the other in Corowa. Commencing in May and running through to September, eight sessions will be delivered to both locations on Monday evenings in addition to a full-day combined workshop during June. Participants will receive leadership training from facilitators and guest speakers, with a focus on building and strengthening core leadership skills.

A key component of the program will involve project management, with participants undertaking the scoping and planning of small community-led projects.

Applications are open for the program, with individuals from across all facets of the community encouraged to consider applying, including young adults, people living with a disability, first nations and members of migrant communities.

Applicants will be requested to demonstrate a connection (either as a resident, employee or business owner) to the Federation Council area for the Corowa program or the Greater Hume Council area for the Jindera program.

Council Federation Mayor, Patrick Bourke encouraged aspiring leaders to express their interest in being a part of the program. "I am so pleased to see this program is being offered in Corowa this year," he said. "This program is designed to empower aspiring leaders and develop their skills to become the best community leaders they can be. Community leaders are the backbone of our communities, and I am positive we have many individuals in our Council region who will really benefit from participating in this program."

Federation Council is excited to announce that students from Miki City, Japan, will be visiting the Federation Council as part of the Sister City Cultural Exchange Program.

The Miki City Federation Council Sister City cultural exchange program is in its 26th year. The program involves students visiting Japan every second year and Japanese students coming to Federation Council on the alternate year.

With the impacts of Covid-19, this year will be the first travel exchange to take place since 2019, with the Federation Council hosting visitors from Miki City during late August 2023. Students and chaperones, as well as dignitaries from Miki City Council will likely attend.

Guests will stay with local host families, to enable them to experience everyday life in an Australian household for up to a week. Federation Council Mayor Cr Patrick Bourke said, it is a great opportunity for the Federation community to get involved in the sister program by hosting students, chaperones and dignitaries.


position today.





Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.
